Mayor Bob Novak spoke about a letter received from Irondale Township dated Feb. 13 about an excessive fire contract rate increase from City of Crosby Fire Department. Irondale Township was proposing an alternate number in the letter. They also notified the City of Crosby they would be seeking other bids starting in 2019. The letter gave a six month notice of termination of the contract.

Novak then spoke about the

lengthy meeting they had with Irondale Township leadership to discuss the formula they used to calculate the increase. It was currently only a portion of what the rate would be and Crosby was still paying the majority.

Novak said, "They are asking us to reduce the cost for one year by about \$1,600 that's all they're really saying. It's a very short, terse note. [It] doesn't say, why they believe it's excessive. That's something we're going to have to revisit. We are either going to have to lower costs or increase revenue."

Council member Paul Heglund said, "I guess I'd like to be involved somewhat too. because I think this is a real important issue. Like Ron says, we don't want to lose 'em by no means. We all agree on that. But we got to sit down and figure something out here."

Council member and Crosby Fire Department Captain Ron Prushek said, "They're dropping like flies."

He continued, "They go out for bids, I guarantee they're going to find somebody else and then who are they going to call? You know we got the equipment. We got everything and yeah that's expensive to get this equipment, very ex-

pensive."

Novak then asked Clerk/ Treasurer/Administrator Lisa Sova to get a hold of the Irondale Township Chairperson to once again discuss the situation.

The council decide to hold a workshop on the issue before the next council meeting on Monday, March 12.

Two arrested for selling meth

A man and woman have been arrested in connection with the sale of large amounts of methamphetamines in Crow Wing County.

Drug agents from the Lakes Area Drug Investigation Division made the arrest just before noon on Feb. 21.

Zachari Allen Kozar, 37, of Roseville, and Melissa Dawn Arola, 32, of St. Paul, were arrested north of Crosby on Hwy. 6.

The arrest stemmed from an ongoing drug investigation into the sale of methamphetamine. Prior undercover purchases of methamphetamine had been conducted by agents over the past several weeks. Arrangements were

again made today to purchase an additional amount of methamphetamine from Kozar. Upon completion of the sale, agents converged on Kozar and Arola and arrested both without incident. Agents had purchased approx. quarter pound of meth from Kozar and located another half ounce of meth which Kozar had thrown from his vehicle just prior to being

stopped by LADID agents. LADID is very familiar with Zachari Kozar as they had done a prior drug investigation in 2012, which resulted in Kozar being prosecuted and convicted federally. Kozar is currently on Federal Parole for that offense. Agents are going to present this current case to federal prosecutors for consideration of additional federal drug charges.

"Once again, I can't say enough about our drug agents and their relentless pursuit of drug dealers in Crow Wing County.", says Crow Wing County Sheriff Todd Dahl. "The amount of work and cooperation between law enforcement agencies that go into these large scale operations is demanding on the agents involved. I'm very proud".

LADID agents were assisted in this operation by the MN BCA and the Boundary Waters Drug Task Force out of Hibbing, MN.



have somebody else as the Union Steward. I think it just goes better [when] the boss [is] not the Union Steward. I worked out there for 40 years and it never was that way."

Police Lieutenant Kevin Randolph interjected, "If I can chime in here. [I have] 15 years of union experience less six at the U of M, as the Union President. Generally, the group picks their own steward. You do not have to have a steward. But for example a bargaining unit of one generally that one is going to work with the business agent if he has an issue. He essentially is the steward."

Pay increase for all employees, but not firemen

The council approved the same increase of (2.5% according to Novak) as the union employees for the non-union employees.

Prushek then introduced the topic of allowing the same annual increase for the firemen since they just got their first increase this year in 11 or 12 years.

Heglund said that firemen are volunteers.

Novak spoke to the fact the firemen get long term benefits package other departments do not.

No annual increase was approved for the firemen. **Raffle approval**

Council approved the Cuyuna Regional Medical Center holding a raffle at the Crosby Bar and Grill on July 28. Planning and zoning

Justin Burslie, Planning and Zoning Consultant, asked and the council approved an Ordinance Amendment regarding recreational equipment businesses and touring businesses in the recreational zone.

Burslie spoke about devel-

oping a plan for how buildings are designed.

Novak had concerns about stopping positive things that have been happening by over controlling it.

Prushek talked about the steel buildings and vinyl siding not fitting the standards.

Wolfe made the motion to look into creating a architectural design zone in the City of Crosby. Prushek seconded it. When the vote was taken Wolfe and Prushek voted for it and Heglund, Traylor and Novak against it. The motion failed.

Planning commission was asking for council guidance to find out if they would like to regulate short term rentals like VRBO. It was pointed out there were already controls in place and other cities have not adopted similar proposed ordinances. The council decided not to adopt the ordinance for short term rentals.

Police Department

The council accepted Lieutenant Randolph's request to accept resignation of part-time police officer Jake Heffron. The council approved posting for two replacement part-time police officers in anticipation of one more requested upcoming resignation.

Purchasing park poles proposal for security cameras

Randolph talked about the camera project progress. The poles in the park are owned by Minnesota Power and they would not give permission to install the cameras on them. The council approved purchasing the eight poles, installing new LED lights and installing cameras at a cost of \$6,250. Purchasing the poles vs. rental cost nets savings \$2,400 per year. Sova was asked if there was any funds that could be

used for this. She recommended they temporarily put it to the general account. To be moved to a more appropriate account later. Council approved the purchase of the poles from Minnesota Power, add LED lights from Moore's Electric not to exceed \$6,250.

Police proposal for Ironton?

Randolph said, "Back around the end of last year, beginning of this year. The police department talked about submitting a proposal for service to the City of Ironton. We talked to the individual council members that we needed to speak with on this. We were in agreement in principle and we met with the finance committee and it was decided to delay the bid until later on in the year. For several different reasons and we didn't attach a price to our bid. Mayor Novak and I met with Mayor Hamdorf of Ironton and we provided him with some background information and some talking points. We were offering to provide Ironton with 24/7 service which they do not have now. They only have 40 hour service. This in turn effects Crosby in some negative ways much like the fire department contracts and that sort of thing. We get quite a few phone calls for service from Ironton residents. They call here directly and ask us for service so. We put some of those things into basically a draft proposal that was provided as talking points for the Mayor of Ironton. We consciously decided to delay this, but for some reason the City of Ironton discussed this at their council meeting and took a vote on it. American Engineering and Testing (AET) was hired in late December for \$2,850 to do an initial deep boring in Hwy. 6 to get information needed to establish what they needed to do for the tunnel. The result of the boring came back with a water table that was six feet higher than anticipated based on the nearby Portsmouth Mine Pit water level. This would mean the plan for level for the tunnel would be about one foot under water.

Minnesota Department of Transportation MN DOT was informed of this since they are the major funding partner on this project. They recommended more substantial borings be done. The supplemental agreement with AET to do additional borings and we are still waiting on the formal report. They did eight additional borings including a 24 hour water level piezometer to see if the water level was high then went down. The preliminary results came in more like what they had expected. Martin was still not sure why they had a higher level in the first boring. The recent tests are good news to continue with the project. The budget amount of \$7,500 is now going to be \$8,650 because of the additional tests. Martin told the council AET is invoicing the city directly for these tests to save the city money from the engineers 10 percent markup. The first invoice for \$2,850 from AET for the first boring was approved by the council for payment.

When asked by Novak if the DNR would help pay for the project, Martin said they couldn't find any money they could give toward this. But they are going to submit an application for funding to try and get dollars for this project. The project start time plan is for October and they would not know if the DNR funds will be available until possibly after the start of the project. Martin also suggested there could be other funding sources for the project.

Televising

The Sanitary Sewer televising was being done by Ritter and Ritter, doing 17,500 feet per year or doing 25 percent of the city each year.

According to Martin, Ritter and Ritter are no longer doing business locally. So now the League of Minnesota Cities insurance may not provide coverage, if the sewer lines are no longer being regularly maintained and televised. Novak asked Martin to get back to them about options for continue with the sewer lines televising and maintenance.

\$3,200 for sound system

Sova talked about the sound system for the council chambers. The mixer they currently have isn't large enough to add the requested microphones. The larger mixer is \$1,365 so the cost of the project would be \$3,183.24 for adding two hand held microphones, one additional stand mic, the mixer and the wiring. The council approved the sound system purchase not to exceed \$3,200.

Prushek added an idea of having two big screen TVs for programs, one for the council to watch and one for the audience. Sova made a comment she had looked into it at the end of 2017 and it was extremely expensive the bid was around \$16,000 for the TV's.

Sova also mentioned the ongoing project with rural water was looking at the water pumped metering vs. water sold evaluation.

Hall of Fame

Novak talked about Andrew Hook requesting the city be involved in choosing people like Miles Lord to include for the Hall of Fame Event in May through the Heritage Society. 
