Now in its fourth year, the annual Perry Hall Apple Festival, held at Chapel Hills Farm and Nursery in Perry Hall, is quickly becoming a community institution for northeastern Baltimore County.

And while many of the offerings and activities during the festival have had a constant presence from year to year, each event has had something new to offer as well

Staples of the festival have always been the activities and attractions for kids, such as the sack races, pony rides, tractordrawn hay rides, wagon train rides, the hay maze and the petting zoo.

Speaking of those rides, patrons will no longer have to cram into the business' small shop to purchase their ride tickets thanks to the new ticket booth, which will be located outside near the entrance.

Of course, no festival would be complete without an abundance of food. On ĥand, as usual, will be Chapel Hills' own pitmaster, cooking up delicious pit beef and turkey, along with hamburgers and pulled pork.

But that's not all. Baked goods - especially those made with apples - are always a hot commodity during the festival, and this year's event is sure to offer something to satisfy your sweet tooth.

From pies, cakes, muffins and whoopie

pies to raisin bread and cheese bread, Chapel Hills has "pretty much the whole assortment," owner Russell Berk explained.

In addition, new this year will be the increasingly popular apple cider donuts, which will be sold with the rest of the baked goods. "Apple cider donuts are in," Berk noted.

And what would an apple festival be without apples? Many will be on display in baskets and bins for decoration, but all will be for sale to enjoy and take home. The festival will have five or six varieties all around the property, Berk said.

A fudge maker will also be in attendance selling fudge, which is new this year.

Back for their fourth appearance at the festival will be the ever-popular Masters of the Chainsaw, stunning crowds with their intricate carvings of bears, eagles and other wildlife scenes. This year's artist will be Marty Long.

Ace Hardware will also have a display set up with demonstrations of Stihl products like chainsaws and weed eaters.

Back again will also be the blacksmith, forging his iron sculptures and trinkets, and the kettle corn maker.

As for the rest of the entertainment, expect to see two great local bands playing. The first will be the Carroll County Ramblers, playing from noon to 4 p.m. on Saturday, Sept. 19, followed by Rattlesnake Hill playing that same time slot on Sunday, Sept. 20. And the bands are being sponsored this year by Baltimore County Councilman David Marks, who represents the area, and County Executive Kevin Kamenetz.

"Each one sponsors by paying for a band for a day and that really helps out," Berk explained.

Marks, who has always supported the apple festival, said that Chapel Hills is one of Perry Hall's best-known landmarks, "and the festival has become one of its endearing traditions," he added.

Being a fall festival as well as an apple festival, Chapel Hills has everything you need for fall decorating and gardening too, including pumpkins, gourds, straw, corn stalks and more. And Berk pointed out that the farm grew more than 5,000 of their own mums this year which will be on sale.

It should also be noted that with the ticket booth now outside, space inside the store has been freed up for customers to browse their selection of other delicious goodies sold year round.

There is also a new parking area at the nearby Soukup Arena this year for added convenience to visitors.

Chapel Hills Farm and Nursery is located at 4350 Chapel Road in Perry Hall. The Perry Hall Apple Festival will take place from 10 a.m. - 5 p.m. Sept. 19 & 20.

Future of NPPC uncertain without increased community participation

After the Sept. 3 meeting of the North Point Peninsula Council had concluded the remainder of their business, NPPC President Harry Wujek raised the topic that has been weighing on him and the rest of the organization for quite some time - that the council cannot continue to function as it does without more membership and community participation.

The council, which serves the communities of Edgemere, Fort Howard, Millers Island and Sparrows Point, also performs certain duties for the good of the community. In order to raise some awareness of what the organization does, they stopped performing some of those duties - namely cutting the grass around and supplying lighting for the North Point Peninsula Monument and sending out the community newsletter - for a period of three months so that people would take notice of what they take for granted.

However, to Wujek's dismay, this action resulted in only one phone call regarding the unkempt grass around the monument. The organization also did not appear in the North Point/Edgemere Volunteer Fire Department parade as usual, but he said no one seemed to notice.

Now, Wujek explained, the community has a decision to make. If enough people do not step up to fill the necessary roles in the NPPC by Nov. 30, they will begin the process to shut the organization down.

Shutting it down would mean liquidating the NPPC's assets, returning its corporate status to the state and shutting down its 501(c)3 non-profit status. Wujek told the *East County Times* that he was not sure how long it would take because he has never done it before, but it could possibly be done by the end of December.

To avoid the shut-down, the organization would need to fill the roles of president, vice president, treasurer, corresponding secretary, recording secretary and, ideally, five members of their board of directors, Wujek explained.

"I would like to distribute those roles to different people to keep the organization afloat," he said, noting that the people filling those roles now are each taking on more than one to get the job done.

The NPPC touts that it has had a hand in many good things that have come to the peninsula, such as the Food Lion grocery store, beginning the peninsula's revitalization project, completion of the area's cellular tower, performing the annual community cleanup and awarding scholarships to Sparrows Point High School seniors.

But they also have a laundry list of projects that still need to be completed, including overseeing the Fort Howard redevelopment, completing the downtown Edgemere streetscape, advocating for a North Point regional community center, shoreline restoration on the Todd's Inheritance property and much more.

No one in the organization wants to see it cease to exist, according to Wujek. "We have a legacy," he said. But with expenses of about \$1,100 per year and income of only \$600, it cannot continue. "We just can't sustain that," he lamented.

County Councilman Todd Crandell, who also attended the Sept. 3 meeting, noted that when government makes decisions, the question is always asked, "what does the community think?" He added that, while government does not always do what a community wants, it is very important to them to get community feedback.

NPPC treasurer John Young built on that, saying that the organization is what gives the community a unified voice.

If the NPPC does shut down, Wujek said he would continue to advocate for the community in other ways. "I'm not going to sit at home and become a couch potato," he asserted.

East side patriotism shines with Sept. 11 tributes

At 6:30 p.m. on Friday, Sept. 11, Middleborough Volunteer Fire Company in Essex held a special dedication ceremony for their new 9/11 Memorial, which was designed by Boy Scout Ricky Warnick of Troop 355 as his Eagle Scout project.


"We want to dedicate this memorial to celebrate the lives of the firefighters, law enforcement and EMS personnel who lost their lives on Sept. 11, 2001," said John Henderson, president of MVFC.

The memorial is located in a grassy area on fire company property and features benches where people can sit and reflect. There are also three plaques explaining the events of that tragic day and Warnick's reactions to it, as well as one honoring the first responders who lost their lives. But the centerpiece of the memorial are the two seven-foot steel beams that were once part of the World Trade Center itself. Three-and-a-half feet are buried underground in concrete to keep them secure for generations to come.

"I want to thank Ricky. This is an unbelievable job. And I want to thank John for all the work it took to get this steel here," commented Baltimore County Fire Chief John Hohman.

Other guests of honor included State Delegate Bob Long, U.S. Congressman Dutch Ruppersberger and Charles Young representing County Executive Kevin Kamenetz.

'Our lives have changed because of it for a lot of different reasons," Ruppersberger - who was Baltimore County executive at the time of the attacks - remarked.

"One positive to come out of it is that after 9/11 our country came together. We're all Americans. And we have learned to appreciate the first responders who all have families and who care about the community, especially on the volunteer side."

Middleborough Volunteer Fire Company was chosen by the Port Authority of the U.S. and of New York and New Jersey to receive some of the steel in 2011, and until 2013 it had been sitting inside the fire house waiting for a decision to be made about displaying it. Then came Ricky Warnick and his Eagle Scout idea.


"He came to me with it, and I said, 'This is a great idea but I don't think you realize how hard it will be," recalled Scoutmaster Tony DeRuggeiro.

Warnick persevered, however, going through draft after draft of designs and then soliciting donations and holding fundraisers to get the project off the ground.

"This young man put a lot of blood, sweat and energy into a very large project," Henderson praised. "It was truly a good thing to see how he maintained his vision to make sure he got it right. And we're pretty confident that he got it right."

State Delegate Bob Long echoed those sentiments, saying, "This young man and what he's accomplished speaks for himself. For him to undertake something with this much importance shows the character that this young man has. It truly is my honor and privilege



Warnick was honored with citations from the county executive's office and Congressman Ruppersberger, as well as a U.S. flag that has flown over the U.S. Capitol building.

Warnick, an Eagle Scout candidate, used his time in the spotlight to thank his family for supporting him and the many individuals and businesses who donated to the project, including Holly Hills Cemetery and Deckleman Marina.

He said the entire project cost between \$8,000 and \$9,000, including \$2,000 he personally raised. But, "I didn't even need all of it because of all the donations."

"When all is said and done, it's exactly what was in my mind," he said of the

finished project. "From the beginning my vision was, I need to remind people, especially for my generation who aren't able to remember it clearly. They now have something tangible."

The ceremony concluded with a performance by Joe DiCara of the Essex Rennaissance Corporation and the fire service's traditional four-five bell signal "in remembrance of all the fire personnel who gave their lives," Henderson said.

The memorial will remain open to the public to come and go as they please to reflect on the events of September 11, 2001.

As Pastor Charles Marshall of next-door Hope Lutheran Church said in his invocation, "This will be a symbol of remembrance and a sign of hope for a peaceful future."

Up at the Mountain Road overpass

above Interstate 95, Delegate Pat Mc-Donough (R-7) took part in a tribute to the 343 firefighters who lost their lives in the Sept. 11 attacks in New York, D.C. and Pennsylvania. For the last 13 years, rain or shine, dozens have attended the tribute with American flags, art and an overwhelming sense of patriotism, and it seems to keep growing in size.

From 4 - 6 p.m., two fire engines held an enormous American flag high as first responders, military personnel and regular citizens banded together to honor the brave men and women who sacrificed their lives for the safety of others.

As cars passed beneath the overpass, a cacophony of horns resonated as drivers showed their support for those up above. Some even pulled off the highway to join in the tribute.

"It's wonderful to see this type of support and it goes to show just how patriotic this community is," said McDonough. "One year the brother of the pilot from the Pentagon flight happened to be driving by and saw this. He parked his car on the side of 95, climbed up the hill and thanked us for what we were doing."

While nothing quite as surreal took place this year, it's a firm reminder of the importance of remembering and honoring those who bravely gave their lives on that fateful day. As McDonough noted a few weeks back at the first annual First Responders Day, when we're running away from the danger, they're running into it.

BRRC hosts 8th annual rockfish tournament on Back River

On Saturday, Sept. 12, the Back River Restoration Committee commenced its eighth annual rockfish tournament to raise both funds and awareness for the cleanup of Back River.

BRRC President Sam Weaver said that 38 boats had registered for the tournament and approximately 150 fishermen participated, averaging about four per boat. Their entry fees of \$120 per boat helped to raise \$4,560 for the organization and its efforts to restore Back River.

Although, the \$11,000 more raised from the event's sponsors didn't hurt either.

By the day's 3 p.m. weigh-in, it was Bob Edwards who had checked in with the largest rockfish and who would take home top honors. His fish measured 27 and one-half inches, beating the second place finisher by two inches.

Edwards revealed that he snagged the winning fish at Tolchester, straight across the Chesapeake Bay from the mouth of Back River. He noted that he has participated in the BRRC tournament four times now, but this was the first time he won first place in it. However, he said he has placed second and third in previous years.

Edwards, the former owner of Edwards Marina in Bowleys Quarters, said he enjoyed the tournament because he got to go fishing with his friends, Wayne Zimmerman and George Popp - on whose boat

the three men fished. "Although we like it more when we win," Edwards joked.

David Paugh and Al Wolfe took home second and third place prizes, respectively. Although they both checked in with the size of rockfish - 25 and one-half inches the rules stated that Paugh would place second since he checked in first.

"The tournament went very well," Weaver explained. And he added that the after-party back at Weaver's Marina in Essex was good despite the rainy weather. "It was still a successful day," he said.

"It was a fun day of fishing, and it made a lot of people aware of what we do and how we do it," Weaver continued, stressing that the awareness is even more important than the fundraising. They even had boaters helping to pull in trash and debris from the river that morning, he said.

Weaver also pointed out that the amount of boaters and fishermen who use Back River would not be able to do so without the efforts of the BRRC, because what they do not only cleans Back River, but also helps to clean the Bay.

"I'm looking forward to a great event again next year with better weather," Weaver joked.

Councilman Marks updates residents on North Fullerton issues

On Aug. 25, Baltimore County Councilman David Marks briefed residents and community leaders on issues along Belair Road near Rossville Boulevard. This is a new part of the Fifth District that was added after the 2014 election.

The K-Mart store at Fullerton Plaza will be closing in November. Representatives for Kimco Realty informed attendees that they are

looking at several other retail stores to take K-Mart's place.

Marks also mentioned that the Ridge Lumber Company site at 8121 Belair Road is proposed for a self-storage facility, with landscaping along Belair Road and White Marsh Boulevard. The site has been derelict since the 1990s.

Finally, Marks said he would oppose a planned Lidl grocery store in the vicinity of ABC Pools, near Dunfield and Belair Roads.

"While this development is still in its initial stage, I cannot support such an intense operation in this congested part of the Belair Road corridor," Councilman Marks commented. "Fortunately, the rezoning process begins in September, and I expect we will have discussions about the level of development along this part of Belair Road."

The meeting was also attended by Delegate Christian Miele and staff for Senator Kathy Klausmeier.

'The Visit' is worth the trip to the theater

With most movies, when the lights go down, our last thought before the film takes over is, "Oooh, I sure hope it's good!" With M. Night Shyamalan movies, more often our last thought is: "I hope this doesn't piss me off." Night has brought this kind of scrutiny on himself, though. The writer-director scored major box-office success with 1999's "The Sixth Sense," followed that up with the underrated "Unbreakable" the next year, and then delivered a summer blockbuster with 2002's "Signs." With that last film, though, audiences were starting to get a bit weary of his fondness for

big-reveal plot twists. His "twist films" thereafter - "The Village," "Lady in the Water" and "The Happening" - brought out the proverbial pitchforks and torches from viewers and reviewers alike. They were followed by "The Last Airbender" and "After Earth," two terrible misfires.

"The Visit" really should have been the final nail in Shyamalan's cinema coffin. But I'm very pleased and more than a bit surprised to report that it's not! It's goofy as all Hell, but in a good way. There's a plot twist in it, yes. But it's a solid one, even if you see it coming. It's also one of those "found footage" movies I've really come to hate. But here, this style works

in creating visual tension and in moving the story along.

Newcomer Olivia DeJonge stars as the teenage Becca, an aspiring filmmaker who travels with her younger tween brother, Tyler (Ed Oxenbould), to meet their grandma and grandpa for the very first time. The grandparents had a bad falling out with Becca and Tyler's mom (Kathryn Hahn) before they were born and the three haven't spoken since. But the two seniors recently looked their daughter up on the Internet, exchanged e-mails, and ultimately convinced her to let the two grandkids come visit, enabling her an overworked single mom - to go on a long-deserved cruise.

Almost immediately, Becca and Tyler start to notice strange things about their Nana (Deanna Dunagan) and Pop-Pop (Peter McRobbie). She wanders the house at night, making all sorts of weird noises and sounds. He likes to go out to his shed at least a couple of times a day. As the week goes on, their behavior gets more and more bizarre. Nana damages Becca's laptop. She then asks her to clean her stove... from the inside! Tyler, meanwhile, finds the grandparents' one rule - don't leave your room after 9:30 at night - hard to follow.

I really can't say enough about how well cast this movie is. DeJonge is indeed

a find. And Oxenbould follows up his success as the title character in "Alexander and the Terrible, Horrible, No Good, Very Bad Day" with a quirky, funny turn here despite having a truly awful, harrowing, way-messed-up day, night and week!

But the real scores here are Dunagan and McRobbie as Nana and Pop-Pop! You've likely seen both of these actors in other films and TV shows. A quick look at their IMDB pages shows they've been in the biz for the better part of 30 years. But more often than not, they've been on the peripheral. It would have made box office sense to put two known vets like, say, Robert Duvall and Helen Mirren in these parts. But with Dunagan and McRobbie, because you don't have any major connections with them from past productions, you just watch them in this movie and marvel, "Where did M. Night find these two?!'

Shyamalan still knows how to deliver a good jolt from time to time, too. The hide-and-seek game under the house is freaky, and what Pop-Pop does after delivering the line "Hey, you have a problem with germs, right?" is just SO wrong! I think I laughed more than anything while watching "The Visit." But I was laughing with the filmmaker this time rather than at him. This was a fun "Visit" to the theater, folks.



- 4) "The Hateful Eight" Speaking of Q.T., his eighth directorial effort will not star Waltz. But it will feature Kurt Russell, Samuel L. Jackson and six other insanely cool people starring as a gaggle of cutthroats, bounty hunters and other Western archetypes holed up in a snowy cabin (Dec. 25).



Labor Day efforts yield high results for MSP

The Labor Day weekend efforts of the Maryland State Police had a positive effect on reducing crashes and keeping the public safe to enjoy the last holiday of summer.

Preliminary information indicates that from Sept. 4 through Sept. 7, troopers made approximately 8,075 traffic stops. They issued 5,493 citations and 4,720 warnings. There were 126 drunk driving arrests and 866 repair orders issued for defective vehicle equipment

In support of the "Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over" campaign, S.P.I.D.R.E., a full-time drunk driving enforcement team, was out that weekend in areas of Prince George's County where drunk drivers and drunk driving crashes are known to be prevalent. The team arrested 20 impaired drivers and issued over 120 citations. Five of those drivers arrested were repeat offenders.

The traffic enforcement efforts of the Maryland State Police led to criminal violations as well. Troopers made 65 arrests and an additional 75 wanted people were arrested on outstanding criminal warrants.

Troopers assigned to the Southern Maryland and Eastern Shore regions worked the Operation SHOW-BOAT initiative and inundated the Route 50 corridor from the Chesapeake Bay to Ocean City. Operation Millipede enforcement efforts placed troopers along the entire I-95/I-495 corridor from the Delaware to Virginia state lines. Both operations successfully contributed to highway safety this weekend. During these initiatives there were no fatal or serious crashes.


The Maryland State Police continue to support the Maryland Highway Safety Office's 'Move Toward Zero Deaths' campaign. These high visibility enforcement efforts reduce the number of aggressive driving motor vehicle crashes in which speed, alcohol and other driving violations are contributing factors to crashes on Maryland roads. Troopers will continue initiatives throughout the year.

Police looking for suspects in Essex robbery

It's a myth that only new car dealers can service vehicles under warranty

True or false: Until your vehicle is out-of-warranty, it must be serviced by the new car dealer or the factory warranty will be void. Although you may have answered "true," the correct answer is "false."

It's the law that consumers can have routine repairs performed by their local independent repair shop or do the work themselves without affecting the warranty. The Magnuson-Moss Warranty Act, enforced by the Federal Trade Commission (FTC), prohibits a manufacturer from voiding the vehicle warranty because service was done by a non-dealer.

According to the FTC, "It is illegal

for a dealer to deny your warranty coverage simply because you had routine maintenance or repairs performed by someone else. Routine maintenance often includes oil changes, tire rotations, belt replacement, fluid checks and flushes, new brake pads and inspections." It is also important to note that the "Magnuson-Moss Warranty Act makes it illegal for companies to void your warranty or deny coverage under the warranty simply because you used an aftermarket or recycled part."

The council strongly recommends adhering to scheduled maintenance requirements and keeping records and receipts for all vehicle service. If a warranty claim arises, these records will provide proof that maintenance has been performed in accordance with the manufacturers' recommendations and requirements.

· Keep a first-aid kit, spare tire and tire jack in the car at all times. Flat tires are no fun, but they are even more of a nuisance when drivers are not prepared to address them. Always keep a jack and spare tire in your car, even if the spare is a donut you can temporarily use to replace a flat tire until you make it to a filling station or automotive supply store. As an added safety measure, keep a fully stocked first aid kit in your vehicle in case you cut yourself while changing the tire or need to address another medical situation. · Make note of your surroundings. Always pay attention to mile markers and any landmarks that might help you describe where you are. Car troubles can strike at any time and anywhere, so be sure to pay special attention to your surroundings when driving in unfamiliar areas.

· Pull over. Don't panic if an issue arises suddenly. Remain calm and pull over onto the shoulder. The right shoulder is the area for pulling over on most roads, but you may also use the left shoulder on multilane highways with medians. Try to get as far away from traffic as possible without driving off of level ground, and always use your signals when pulling onto the shoulder. If the vehicle can't make it to the median, put your emergency flashers on and get out of the car, moving away from both the vehicle and traffic. Immediately call for emergency roadside assistance, alerting the authorities if need be.

· Use flares or triangles to alert other drivers. So long as you are not risking your well-being, you can place flares and/or warning triangles behind your vehicle so oncoming traffic knows to drive around it. The popular not-for-profit motor club AAA recommends placing the first flare or triangle 10 feet directly behind the side of the vehicle that is closest to the road. The second should be placed between 30 and 60 feet (increase the distances as the posted speed limit increases) behind the middle of the bumper, while the third flare or triangle should be placed between 120 and 360 feet behind the vehicle's right

· Stay with the vehicle. Once you have called for help and set up flares or triangles, stay with the vehicle, though do so at a safe enough distance so you are not in harm's way.



The intention of this petition is to stop the development of Paragon Outlets in White Marsh on Route 7 near Route 43 and I-95. The company who is intending to build has agreed to comply with the latest environmental standards, thus protecting the Bird River, White Marsh Run and the Chesapeake Bay.

Additionally, there will be enhancements to the roads in the area, to include an eastbound ramp to Route 43. This addition and the completion of Campbell Boulevard should alleviate traffic congestion on Route 7 between 43 and Cowenton Avenue. With the outlets project there is no proposed residential space, thus protecting our schools from any additional crowding issues. Lastly, it will promote the economy, create construction and retail jobs and promote a business-friendly environment in Baltimore County. Keep in mind that "Maryland is Open for Business." 

Perry Hall falters against Franklin while Dundalk and Tech surge

My father always told me that practice doesn't make perfect, it makes permanent. Meaning the way that you practice will indeed be the way that you play. If you laze around and don't push yourself, it's going to show on

But sometimes, as was the case last week, practice isn't an option.

Twice during the week Baltimore County Public Schools shut down early and canceled all after-school activities, which is both a blessing and a curse. Obviously safety is what's most important, and when it gets to be as hot and humid as it was, the possibility of a heat stroke or dehydration or any other injury increases. So on that end it was a great call by the school system.

But I'm willing to bet there are quite a few football teams who wished they could have been on the practice field

It's early in the season and most teams are still trying to find a rhythm. Early season practices carry a lot of weight, and not being out on the field can really hurt a team.

That was evident as Perry Hall hosted Franklin on Friday night. The Gators looked sluggish and lost on the field, with Franklin dominating from the beginning.

Over the past few years Perry Hall

and Franklin have put on some entertaining performances. It's one of the best rivalries in the area, but unfortunately it couldn't deliver this year.

Coming off of a nice win against Aberdeen, I was expecting more of the same from Perry Hall. Two weeks ago Aberdeen was held to 16 points by what looked to be a strong defense. But last week was a bit of an eye opener, as Franklin marched down the field at will time and time again on their way to a 40 point performance.

Whether it was a failure to hit the holes provided or the inability to block the right men, Franklin seemed to always have an answer for what the Gators were throwing their way.

However, while Perry Hall will undoubtedly be disappointed by the result, it's worth noting that Franklin has an incredible squad, one that ranks

in the top five in the area according to the *Baltimore Sun*. It was never going to be an easy match, but in those cases it helps to not make it more difficult on yourselves by lapses in concentration. Too often the Gators were caught off guard, and that simply can't happen against strong teams.

Around the league

The two teams that have been the most impressive so far in the area are the Dundalk Owls and the Eastern Tech Mavericks. Both teams sit with 2 - 0 records after two weeks of play, and both look pretty scary.

Dundalk especially looks strong, with their defense playing at a level I've not seen them reach in my time covering football. Their team returned almost all of their defensive starters from last year, and it shows.

While I'm giving Perry Hall the benefit of the doubt considering the strength of their opponent, Dundalk didn't have an easy win lined up against Milford Mill, a team that has received decent hype so far this season.

But Dundalk stepped up big time over the weekend, smothering Milford on the defensive end on their way to a big 21 - 6 victory.

But much like Perry Hall, the Owls almost didn't do enough on the offensive side of the ball. With starting quarterback Duron Ball still injured, Darrius Sample was called upon again to lead the team. He wasn't quite able enough to repeat his ridiculous stat line from the previous week, but he did enough, throwing for a touchdown in the second half.

But where Dundalk really got a boost is on defense and special teams, where a punt return and fumble return added the necessary points to squeak by.

And that brings me to what I like about Eastern Tech as well. Both Dundalk and Tech are very complete teams. They have offensive playmakers, defensive studs and special teams units that will absolutely punish you.

Over the weekend, Tech took on Middletown and was just able to hang on for a big 20 - 14 win.

The first half was all Tech with their special teams unit doing damage early on, returning a blocked punt for a touchdown giving the Mavericks the early lead.

Stud running back Ian McBorrough added a three-yard touchdown run in the second quarter to give Tech a 14 - 0 lead.

The second half got a little dicey for the Mavericks, as the defense gave up a big 40-yard touchdown through the air. But they responded how they always do - with a strong run game and a drive capped off by a short McBorrough touchdown.

Tech would give up one more touchdown, but by that point the game was pretty much out of reach for Middletown.

With the win, Eastern Tech slid into the top ten in the Sun's area ranking,

and solidified themselves as a complete team. Teams as complete as the Owls and Mavericks don't come along often in high school football, so keep your eye on these two as the season progresses. Good things are ahead.







