immense impact on every aspect of our culture," Melson said. "It has informed our laws, our literature, and guided many of this nation's greatest leaders. I look forward to Alabama students having the opportunity to examine this transformative book whose impact is realized across the world."

According to the text of Senate Bill 391, the elective course would familiarize students with the contents, history, literary style, and structure of the Bible. It would also teach students about Biblical characters, poetry, and narratives that are useful for understanding history, contemporary society and culture, art, music, social mores, oration, and public policy.

policy.

"There is no denying the beneficial impact that the Bible has had on our culture," said Senate Majority Leader Greg Reed (R-Jasper).

"It is right and good that Alabama students be given the opportunity to study its place in our society's history and way of life."

The bill now heads to the Senate floor for consideration.

the college or university of their choice, a Chromebook, and a \$100 Books-A-Million gift card.

Denver Benjamin from High School Cherokee one of the five was statewide winners of APT Heroes Award Young Denver and this year. the other Young Heroes were honored earlier this month during an Awards Dinner at the Embassy Suites in Montgomery. The following day the Young Heroes were invited to the Alabama Senate floor where their biographies were read by Senator Paul Bussman. Denver and her guests were also given a private tour of the Alabama State House and the Capital the District Representative for Cherokee, Johnny Mack

Denver was diagnosed with lupus when she was in the eighth grade. Lupus is a systemic autoimmune disease that causes a body's immune system to attack its own tissues and organs. Inflammation caused by lupus can affect many different body systems—including joints, kidneys, blood cells, the brain, the heart, and the lungs. In spite of this diagnosis, Denver remained actively involved at her school and excelled in academics, athletics, cheerleading, and multiple extracurricular activities.

In January of her sophomore year, Denver experienced something uncommon for people her age—a stroke. It was a huge setback for such an active young woman. The stroke left her with brain damage that made it look as if she would be unable to resume her previously active interests. She was in the hospital for two weeks and then spent most of the remainder of the school year as a homebound student. Denver had to relearn many abilities and tasks that are often taken for granted like

walking, talking, brushing your teeth, and feeding and bathing yourself. Loss of her short-term memory, loss of her ability to read and retain new information, and the loss of her athletic abilities were new hurdles to overcome.

Denver was determined to overcome the effects of the stroke. As soon as she was able, she began working hard in therapy and carefully following the instructions of her doctors. Slowly, progress was made. By the end of the school year, Denver was able to return to school for a couple of hours each day. She worked hard through the summer and returned to school full-time in the fall.

Back on course, Denver was again playing volleyball, basketball and softball, and cheerleading. She is now a senior at Cherokee High School where she was the captain of the cheerleading squad and the varsity volleyball and softball teams. She is president of the Student Council and of her school's chapter of the Fellowship Christian Athletes. Academically Denver is ranked 6th in her senior class of fifty students.

In her nomination of Denver, Cherokee High School guidance counselor Julia Gray wrote, "When I think of Denver, I think of a young person who overcomes. She is someone with a new outlook on life and a new reason to live. She explores her options for the future and takes the necessary steps to reach her goals. Things are still not easy for Denver and probably never will be. However, she will be a success and a productive member of society because she cares enough to give her best.'

Denver plans to attend college and to pursue a career as a neonatal nurse.



My husband hit a cow at night and our insurance won't pay and the owner of the cow won't pay either. What can I do?

Ashley, Tuscumbia, AL

The legislature provided for limited liability of livestock owners (farmers)

for damage to the owners or occupants of motor vehicles caused by hitting a cow. The only time the owner of livestock is responsible is if they "knowingly or willfully put or placed such stock upon such roadway."

'Willfulness is not equivalent to wantonness. Lyons v. Walker Reg'l Med. Ctr., 868 So.2d 1071 (Ala. 2003). That is, proof that one had "knowledge and

consciousness that the injury is likely to result from the act done or from the omission to act," Mazda Motor Corp. v. Hurst, [Ms. 1140545, July 7, 2017] So.3d, (Ala. 2017) (quoting Ex parte Dixon Mills Volunteer Fire Dep't. Inc., although sufficient to establish wantonness, is not sufficient to establish that one has acted willfully.

All that legal jargon means is that unless you can prove that the farmer or owner of the cow placed the cow in the road on purpose, you can't win. We do dog bite cases. We have sued successfully when people don't keep fences up when they keep dangerous dogs. Negligent fencing is a pretty good case in dog bite cases. By law, farmers are supposed to fence their cows. However, there is no successful case if they don't.

Unless you have comprehensive coverage on your car, you are responsible for the damages to your car. I don't think it is right but law often protects the owners of property in ways that don't provide true justice.

ON YOUR DEBT

If you Contribute to an IRA by April 17, 2018, you can claim it for 2017

If you own an Individual Retirement Arrangement (IRA) you still have until April 17, 2018 to make your contribution to be eligible for a tax credit or deduction on your 2017 tax

If you are wondering why that particular date, this year's tax-filing deadline is April 17th. So make sure your file your 2017 tax return or extension on or prior to then as well.

An IRA is designed to enable employees and the self-employed to save for retirement. Most taxpayers who work are eligible to start a traditional or Roth IRA or add money to an existing account.

Contributions to a traditional IRA are often tax deductible, but the distributions are generally taxable. Contributions to a Roth IRA are not deductible, but the qualified distributions are taxfree. To count for a 2017 tax return, contributions must be made by April 17, 2018. In addition, lowand moderate-income taxpayers making these contributions may also qualify for the Retirement Savings Contribution Credit a/k/a "Saver's Credit". You're eligible for the credit if you're:

- 1. Age 18 or older;
- 2. Not a full-time student; and
- 3. Not claimed as a dependent on another person's return.

You or your tax preparer will need to use IRS Form 8880 to take the "Saver's Credit". The amount of the credit is 50%, 20% or 10% of your retirement plan or IRA contributions up to \$2,000 (\$4,000 if married filing jointly), depending on your adjusted gross income. The Saver's Credit is often available to IRA contributors whose adjusted gross income falls below certain levels. Eligible taxpayers get the credit even if they qualify for other retirement-related tax benefits. Like other tax credits, the Saver's Credit can increase a taxpayer's refund or reduce the taxes they owe. The amount of the credit is based on several factors, including the amount contributed to either a Roth or traditional IRA and other qualifying retirement programs.

Generally, eligible taxpayers can contribute up to \$5,500 to an IRA. For someone who was 50 years of age or older at the end of 2017, the limit is increased to \$6,500. The same general contribution limit applies to both Roth and traditional IRAs. However, a Roth IRA contribution might be limited based on filing status and income. An individual can't make regular contributions to a traditional IRA in the year they reach 70½ and older. However, they can still contribute to a Roth IRA and make rollover contributions to a Roth or traditional IRA regardless

If neither the taxpayer nor their spouse was covered for any part of the year by an employer retirement plan, they can take a deduction for total contributions to one or more traditional IRAs up to the contribution limit or 100 percent of the taxpayer's compensation, whichever is less.

confronting humanity.

Anyone interested in investigating good science on the issue of gender should read, The Gene by Siddhartha Mukherjee, the Pulitzer Prize-winning, bestselling author of *The Emperor of All Maladies*—a magnificent history of the gene and a response to the defining question of the future: What becomes of being human when we learn to read and write our own genetic information?



Three of Muscle Shoals named first team All-State High School's greatest athletes were inducted together into the Muscle Shoals Athletics Hall of Fame in 2017. Jarius Hayes, a 1991 graduate, led the Trojans football team to the school's first-ever 12-win season in 1988 and their first-ever trip to the Class 5-A semifinals. He signed a scholarship with the University of North Alabama where he became one of the school's legendary football players.

Haves started consecutive games at tight end for Bobby Wallace's Lions and was a part of UNA'S three consecutive NCAA Division II National Championships in 1993-94-95. He was drafted by the Arizona Cardinals in the NFL and played for the Cardinals from 1996-1998. Hayes was inducted into the UNA Athletics Hall of Fame in 2007. In 2008, Hayes was inducted into the Colbert

County Sports Hall of Fame. Andy Martin graduated from Muscle Shoals in 1980 and was considered one of the top 25 quarterbacks in the country and one of Alabama's top 10 most wanted high school players. Martin was one of the most versatile athletes in the and suggestions school's history. He was

He led the Trojans to the Final Four as a player and because of his leadership abilities was dubbed a "coach" on the floor. Peters received All-State honors and was named honorable mention on the McDonald's All-American team.

Peters signed to play for William and Mary where he was a four-year letterman and two-time Colonial Athletic Association Defensive Player of the Year. He averaged 18.2 points per game for William and Mary.

Medicare Minute

"Mail, Calls and Door Knocking 2"

Last week we began discussing ways that agents and companies market Medicare plans to people turning 65. We discussed the phone calls you may receive and the possibility of someone showing up unannounced at your door. This week we will look at online marketing and direct mail.

Direct mail – This is the most common way companies market their plans. When you are within 6 months of turning 65 a company will purchase a mailing list with your name and address on it. Most companies will start sending mail 6 months prior to the month you turn 65. This is because you are eligible to purchase a Medicare supplement any time during that 6 month period. In most cases direct mail is designed to initiate a response on your part. That response is to call a toll free number. You may be calling to get information but usually are connected to a sales person. If you do respond to direct mail, our advice is to never give the agent on the line your social security number until you are ready to buy. This should protect you against unknowingly signing up for a plan.

Online marketing – Occasionally we will have someone stop by our office that has gone online to research Medicare plans. Most online marketing companies will ask you to provide your phone number and/or email address to get pricing information. Once you enter this information you will immediately begin getting phone calls. This is because when you hit "send" that information goes out to 10 or more agents who have bought that lead. All the agents will begin reaching out to you within minutes.

Phone calls, direct mail, door knocking and online marketing are perfectly legal and compliant under Medicare guidelines for some plans but not others. If you have any questions concerning any of these you can contact our office for more information.

How to Choose a Memory Care Unit

Dear Savvy Senior,

My mom has Alzheimer's disease and has gotten to the point that she can't live at home any longer. I need to find a good memory care residential unit for her but could use some help. Any suggestions?

Exhausted Daughter

Dear Exhausted,

Choosing a good memory care residential unit for a loved one with Alzheimer's disease is a very important decision that requires careful evaluation and some homework

Most memory care units, sometimes called special care units, are housed within assisted living or nursing home facilities. At their best, they offer staff extensively trained in caring for people with dementia, individualized care that minimizes the use of dangerous psychotropic drugs, a home-like environment and activities that improve residents quality of life. But at their worst, they can offer little more than a locked door. Here are some steps that can help you find a good facility and avoid a bad one.

Make a list: To identify some good memory care residential units in your area ask your mom's doctor for a referral, and use the Alzheimer's Association online tool at *CommunityResourceFinder.org*. Make sure the facilities on your list are close to family members and friends who can visit often, because residents with frequent visitors usually get better care.

Research your options: Once you've made a list, contact your local long-term care ombudsman (see *LTCombudsman.org*). This is a government official who investigates assisted living and nursing home complaints and can tell you which facilities have had problems in the past.

If you're looking at a memory care unit within a nursing home facility, use Medicare's nursing home compare tool (*Medicare.gov/nursinghomecompare*), which provides a 5-star rating system.

Call the facilities: Once you've identified a few facilities, call them to find out if they have any vacancies, if they provide the types of services your mother needs, what they charge and if they accept Medicaid.

Tour your top choices: During your tour, notice the cleanness and smell of the facility. Is it homey and inviting? Does the staff seem responsive and kind to its residents? Also be sure to taste the food, and talk to the current resident's family members, if available.

Also, find out about staff screening and training procedures, their turnover rate, and the staff-to-resident ratio. They should have at least one staff member for every five residents.

Make sure the facility offers quality activities that can keep your mom engaged, even at night when she may be awake. Ask how they respond to residents who may wander or become aggressive. If the answer is locked doors and antipsychotic drugs, that's a red flag.

Because transitions can be unsettling for dementia suffers, make sure that your mom will be able to remain at the facility for the foreseeable future. And find out what, if any, health conditions might require your mom to leave the facility or move to a higher and more expansive level of care.

It's also a good idea to make multiple visits to the facility including an unscheduled visit at night or on weekends when the staff is more likely to be stretched thin.

To help you evaluate your visit, the Alzheimer's Association offers a checklist that you can access at *ALZ. org/residentialfacilities*.

Paying for care: The national average costs for memory care within an assisted living facility is over \$5,000 per month, and over \$7,500/month for nursing home care, but costs can vary widely depending on your location. Since Medicare does not cover long-term care, most residents pay for care from either personal savings, a long-term care insurance policy, or through Medicaid (if available) once their savings are depleted.



TWO EXTREMES

Dear Dave,

I'm about to graduate from college, and while I've been in school my mom has been handling most of my finances. Recently, I discovered she's been taking my student loan money and spending it on herself. So far, it looks like she's taken around \$12,000, and I have a total of \$25,000 in student loan debt. Since I realized this was happening, I've been reading your books and learning how to manage my own money. I don't know how to deal with this situation with her, though. She admits she did wrong, but says she can't pay it back. Can you help? Alan

Dear Alan,

I hate hearing this. There's no easy way to deal with these kinds of situations.

The first thing you need to do is take over complete and total control of all your finances. Shut down any accounts that have her name on them, and anything else financially-related that she can access. I know this sounds harsh, but she has proven she's ust not trustworthy. It's a hard thing to hear about a parent, but at this point you've got to take steps to protect yourself. What she has been doing is theft, and financial child abuse.

One extreme is to press criminal charges. The other extreme is to just forget it, and pay it. In between is a promise from her to repay everything she has taken, but she's already out of control. That's a promise that wouldn't be kept. The problem with prosecuting

someone criminally for this type of action — other than the emotional toll, because she's your mom — is the money's already gone. It's doesn't make them magically have the money to repay you. On top of all this, you'd have a really hard time legally getting the student loans removed from your name

due to theft.

Honestly, under the circumstances I think you're probably going to end up eating this. But sit down, and try to have a calm, clear discussion about what has happened, and why it happened. Let her know first, without a doubt, that you will criminally prosecute her if she ever uses your name to put money into her own pocket again. Second, tell her you're prepared to forgive her and forget about it and she pays you back at some point, if she can if she agrees to get some financial and emotional counseling.

Try to get her some help, and get her under control, Alan. If you don't, I'm afraid things are only going downhill from here.







Pet Odor

One of the fastest ways to lose a potential buyer who's looking at your home is for the home to have a strong pet or smoking odor.

Get an honest opinion from someone who can tell you the truth about any bad odor in your home and who does not have to worry about hurting your feelings or causing you to become defensive or offended. Do what it takes even if this means making some temporary arrangements that may be a little inconvenient. It will definitely pay off. -mr
