REINS connects people with horses

Since 1982, a program known as REINS, Inc. Equine-Assisted Activities and Therapies has provided opportunities for people and horses to connect for therapeutic purposes. Clients with physical, cognitive or emotional challenges are paired with horses in the REINS riding experience to assist in the treatment of a variety of challenges under the instruction of a PATH Certified Therapeutic Riding Instructor. REINS, Inc. places its focus on equine-assisted activities and therapies to improve the participants' quality of life, inspiring personal growth, challenge and development. A non-profit organization, REINS, Inc. is dedicated to improving lives through planned therapeutic interactions with horses.

Many benefits

Among the many benefits of REINS' efforts are the following—EDUCATIONAL - promoting reading and math, improving sequencing, patterning and motor planning; PSYCHOLOGICAL - promoting self confidence, pride, independence, normality, self control and control of fears; SOCIAL - improves listening skills, attention span, provides opportunities to make new friends and networking for families. PHYSICAL - improves sitting and standing balance, decreases spasticity and abnormal movements and improves posture, flexibility and poise.

Part of care


"Our participants come by way of recommendation of therapists, school counselors and physicians, sometimes with the encouragement from parents or guardians who have heard about our program and are seeking a unique and powerful therapy to help their loved one," Zimmermann said. In 2018, the program appears to be growing in leaps and bounds. Program Director Theresa Zimmermann said that the number of clients for the program has increased from 38 to 67 riding participants.

REINS sessions

While REINS was originally housed at Lakeshore Technical College in its early years, the program now calls Majestic Crossing Dairy its home, on County O, near Sheboygan Falls. Owners of the property and building allow REINS to take over a storage building in the late spring through summer for the program. Horses are "loaned" to the program from their owners, and REINS works to train, feed and care for the horses on the site. "Our landlords are very generous, as they offer us a lease for \$1 a year. Many horses participate from previous years, but REINS has the ongoing task of recruiting horses to be part of program. "Our horses get great care and training, and they are just so loved by the participants in our program," Zimmermann said.

People recruitment, too

REINS is also in the business of people recruitment as well. In addition to the qualified and PATH accredited instructional staff, REINS also depends on a force of volunteers to assist with the riding therapy. It takes up to three volunteers to properly assist and provide a safe experience for each rider. Do the math. That means more than 200 volunteers are needed each year to help provide the REINS experience to its clients. In addi-







tion to being around the riders, volunteers also get a huge dose of horse contact. They assist with grooming the horses, providing clean stalls, fresh water and hay, and assisting with riding equipment. "They get to assist in the arena with our instructors and provide an extra set of eyes during ever lesson," Zimmermann added. Volunteers can be as young as 12-14 years old, depending on the role they are called on to fill. Some get to lead horses, while others may be side-walkers. Every volunteer gets more than two hours of training. They come back for a dress rehearsal the week before the therapeutic sessions start to get introduced to the challenges their rider faces on a daily basis, what their likes

and dislikes are as well as the goals their rider has set for the summer. "We actually bring mock riders out to act out the roles of our clients the week before the therapy begins. It helps our volunteers become familiar with their rider before we start," Zimmermann said. Therapy sessions are held from June 11 through August 24. Riding experiences take place each weekday except for Wednesday. Wednesdays are reserved for their Equine Assisted Learning Program and utilize ground based lessons. These are horse related therapy sessions, without riding. Working with equines provides opportunities to teach critical life skills such as trust, respect, honesty and communication. Up to 24 youth and teens

will participate in this program during the 2018 season. In addition to weekly classes, extra weekend seminars will be held to allow the PATH Certified Equine Specialist in Mental Health and Learning to work with up to 49 youth of both Sheboygan and Manitowoc County.

Donors offer key support

REINS, being a non-profit organization relies heavily on support from donors in the community, both individuals and organizations. One of their key supports has been the Midwest Council for Children with Disabilities, offering significant contributions through the Top Chef Elkhart

Lake fundraiser held each year. Riders pay a tuition fee of \$400 to take part in the REINS program, but the actual cost of each rider's participation approaches \$1,200. Many generous donors have begun to offer contributions for the full cost of a rider in memory or honor of family members, as one example of how generosity supports REINS. 

to, Attention Ann Buechel Haack, EL-G School District, PO Box 326, Elkhart Lake,

These memories will be shared on our school website and hopefully enough will be shared to compile for distribution at the graduation ceremony. For example, while waiting in the chiropractor's office, a story was shared about how music was played in the original high school gym (now the elementary gym) during lunch hours so the students could dance and they all did—even the fellows. The Featured Performers

"Mill Street Live," now in its 10th year, was established at the Plymouth Arts Center in 2009. This summer musical revue features ten to twelve performers (17 and over,) who come together with a common goal to provide an exciting and highly energetic song and dance show. Their music selections span five decades and the show is appealing to all ages. Musical direction and choreography are organically produced within the group, as well as utilizing talents in art, costumes, staging, and general organization. In addition to the summer series, the group has presented several fundraising productions for the PAC, "Broadway Bound I & II;" "25th Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee;" Love is An Open Door;" "A Valentine's Evening of Mill Street Live; "Duets for the Arts;" "MSL Date Night;" and "A Walk Down Lover's Lane." This summer, seven shows will be presented on Friday nights featuring the MSL Alumni group.

The first "Shamrocks and Shenanigans," Irish Music Show was presented in March 2006. Plymouth's own Irish Lass, Mary Calvey, is the creator and director of this spirited show now in its 13th year. Each year is unique, but you can always be sure there will be traditional Irish ballads, pub songs, audience participation, a wee bit or two, and lots of fun! Musicians accompany on a variety of instruments, i.e.

fiddle, flute, bass, bodhrán, penny whistle, guitar, etc.

"Celtic Folk" and "Celtic Folk Christmas" were created and directed by Kerrylynn Kraemer and Tom Clegg. Inspiration for these shows was derived from the beautiful music of the popular national touring group Celtic Woman, and the wish to bring cherished traditional Carols and Celtic music to the PAC stage. The group consists of the lead singers, Kerrylynn and Tom & Friends, a chorus, and an acoustic band. Since 2013, three Celtic Christmas shows and Celtic Folk Memories have been presented. Look for two brand new Celtic Folk productions in 2019.

Theatre productions over the past 20+years have included, dramas, musicals, comedies, melodramas, farces, and more. PAC's Black-Box/Studio Theatre offers a flexible space that allows for temporary seating in a number of different configurations, thus serving as the perfect setting for an intimate theatre experience for audiences and the actors too! Under the direction of Kerrylynn Kraemer, PAC Theatre Company's most recent productions were: The Carol Burnett Show; "Ring of Fire....a Tribute to Johnny Cash;" and "Nunsensations: The Las Vegas Revue." PAC has also collaborated with the Youth Theatre Company on seven productions, and with the Theatre for Young Audiences' Summer Traveling Shows. This fall and Christmas, Ms. Kraemer will be directing three musical productions, "Annie;" The String-Along Band Musical; and the "Story of the Nutcracker," (in partnership with In-Motion Dance Studio.)

The Plymouth Arts Center Singers made their first appearance in June 1999 with a concert entitled, "Broadway Revue." Freddie Noordyk was the musical director and pianist. The group was organized to offer an opportunity to adult singers in the greater Plymouth area to participate in a choral setting. The group has grown from 12 members to over 40 singers, who enthusiastically love to rehearse and entertain the community with their Annual Spring Concert, "Musical Potpourri," and an Annual Christmas Concert, "Colors of Christmas." The group is directed by Barb Zirwes-Nysse, who is also PAC's Performing Arts Coordinator, and her co-directors, Mary Fellenz and Freddie Noordyk.

Pete and Karen Scheuerman initiated the Acoustic Open Mic in August 2003 to provide opportunities for the "play at home" folks, of whom many are awesome musicians, to mix and network with musicians of all abilities. Typically, it runs once per month on a Friday evening, September through May. Today, Jamie and Amy Odekirk continue the Scheuerman's tradition, and have been coordinating the event since 2013. The PAC greatroom offers a cozy, friendly, atmosphere with excellent of Irish humor, possibly an Irish Dancer acoustics. The Open Mic has proved to be a great way for musicians and singers to gain stage experience and to make

new friends. Over the years, several small bands have formed as a result of the Open Mic. Whether you play an instrument or sing, and whatever genre of music you enjoy – folk, bluegrass, country, Irish, blues, jazz – everyone is invited to come on down and play/sing along. It's a great, free family night out in downtown Plymouth.



The concert featured six accomplished performers who had either performed for PAC art show receptions or had presented their own recitals at the PAC. The concert pays tribute to the late Joseph Sartori and to thank the Sartori Family for the use of Papa Joe's Steinway piano. The Sartori Company sponsors the series. Jim Sartori offered these comments at after the first show: "Our dad, Joseph Sartori, while known primarily for his work with S & R Cheese/Sartori Foods, for most of his life, was also known as a highly accomplished pianist. Joseph's aunt, Ada Lombardi, an acclaimed concert pianist with the Philadelphia Philharmonic Orchestra, taught Joseph the piano, and especially "The Classics." While he did not pursue a musical career, as his aunt thought he


should, he did continue to play, practically daily, for the rest of his life. The Steinway grand piano used for "An Evening of the Classics" is the one our dad bought in the early 1960s. He played many of the same pieces performed for this concert for his own enjoyment, as well as that of his family and friends. Household Hazardous Waste

Sheboygan County has established three (potentially four) periodic collection sites for disposing of hazardous wastes. The majority of the program is funded with County tax dollars, so be prepared to show proof of residency. When those funds are depleted, the sites will be closed until funds are again available. Due to an unexpected, very steep increase in the cost of accepting electronics at these events, the fees have changed. The fees are now \$10 - vehicles with hazardous waste only, \$30 - vehicles with household size (6 items or less) electronics only, and \$30 – vehicles with both hazardous waste and household size electronics. If there are more than 6 electronics items, there will be additional fees. News on Water - Cross Connection Inspections

The Village will be putting more emphasis on inspecting homes and businesses for cross connections in the water system. The DNR requires that all homes and businesses are inspected for cross-connection.

What is cross-connection?

Cross-connection is an actual or potential connection between the safe drinking water supply and a source of contamination of pollution. State plumbing codes require approved backflow prevention methods to be installed at every point of potable water connection and use. Cross-connections must be properly protected or eliminated.

How does contamination occur?

When you turn on your faucet, you expect the water to be as safe as when it left the treatment plant or well. However, certain hydraulic conditions left unprotected within your plumbing system may allow hazardous substances to contaminate your own drinking water or the public water supply. Water normally forms in one direction; however, under certain conditions, water can actually flow backwards. This is known as backflow. Backsiphon-

age or backpressure may cause the water to flow backwards. Backsiphonage may occur due to a loss of pressure in the municipal water system during a fire fighting emergency, a water main break, or system repair. This creates a siphon in your plumbing system, which can draw water out of a sink or bucket and back into your water or the public water system. Backpressure may be created when a source of pressure (such as a boiler) creates a pressure greater than the pressure supplied from the public water system. This may cause contaminated water to be pushed into your plumbing system through an unprotected cross-connection.

In most cases where can cross connection issues occur?

In the bathroom with handheld shower fixtures and toilet tanks and in the kitchen.

How can you protect your drinking water?

Do

- Keep the ends of hoses clear of all possible contaminants.
- Make sure dishwashers are installed with a proper "air gap" device.
- Verify and install a simple hose bibb vacuum breaker on all threaded faucets around your home.
- Make sure water treatment devices such as water softeners have the proper "air gap", which is a minimum of one inch above any drain.

Don't

- Submerge hoses in buckets, pools, tubs, sinks or ponds.
- Use spray attachments without a backflow prevention device.
- Connect waste pipes from water softeners or other treatment systems directly to the sewer or submerged drain pipe. Always be sure there is a one inch "air gap" separation.


showers, you can replace your old toilet with a new 1.28 gallon/flush model, you can check for leaks in your toilets or faucets, or only do laundry when you have a full load, etc. These are all good ways to conserve water, but there are ways you can conserve water and use water efficiently outdoors.

Some things you can do outdoors include:

- Making lawn watering optional.
 Some people choose to forgo watering established lawns and allow their lawns to go dormant during hot periods in the summer.
- Decrease your lawn area. Assess your lawn and decide if you can convert lawn into garden beds.
- Use native plants. Plants and shrubs native to Wisconsin come in beautiful varieties. Correctly matched to soil and light needs, once established, native plants will survive wet weather and drought condi-

- Redirect and disconnect downspouts. In this case, redirecting your downspouts into your lawn or a garden, allows for some of that rainwater to infiltrate into the soil and eventually reach the water table. This practice keeps your water local and on your property as much as possible. This does not work for all situations such as if the downspout is keeping water out of your basement, but often the water can be redirected to flow into your lawn or garden with no detriment to your yard and a benefit to water supplies.
- Plant a rain garden. A rain garden is a specialized garden that uses water typically captured from a roof, and allows the rain to slowly infiltrate into the ground, contributing to groundwater supplies and reducing stormwater runoff.
- Create rain barrels. Installing a rain barrel connected to a downspout is a great way to create an additional water source. Rain barrel water can be used for outdoor and indoor non-edible plants. These barrels usually hold 50 gallons and fill quickly in a rainstorm.

People do not realize how a small leak can be costly. The image on page 16 that shows that a faucet dripping only 30 drops per minutes can mean that 54 gallons are lost a month. If you have a leaking toilet

that is leaking at ¼ gallon per minute, it can use 10,800 gallons per month and can cost over \$125 in water and sewer charges in one month in the Village of Elkhart Lake. If you suspect your toilet is running or leaking you can contact he public works department and they can check for a leaking toilet.





Trio of area education groups start nature based preschool

Staff from Camp Y-Koda, Maywood Environmental Park and the Sheboygan Area School District are partnering to launch a new nature based 4K preschool starting September 2018.

The preschool will be held Monday through Thursday from 8 a.m. to 11 a.m. at Maywood, 3615 Mueller Road in Sheboygn. A Wisconsin licensed 4K-third grade teacher, assistant teacher and naturalist from Camp Y-Koda will staff the preschool.

Children will spend at least 50 percent of the time outside among the 135 acres while learning within six diverse ecosystems, the Arboretum, four natural play areas, butterfly and hummingbird gardens, a mud kitchen, creek, and more. Child initiated outdoor investigations and unstructured time will also be included to enable children to know a place deeply and to develop a sense of place.

The nature based 4K initiative aims to develop the whole child through daily nature explorations, play and activities. Learning will be child-led, hands-on, and project oriented. Nature will be the central organizing concept of the preschool with curriculum based on local, seasonal, and natural occurrences. Nature is not merely a topic nor activity theme, but the integrating thread that intentionally ties all parts of the preschool together.

The program supports dual goals that address both child development and environmental education. The 4K preschool will include the development of the world of the child in all domains; cognitive, physical, social-emotional, aesthetic, language and spiritual; and the development of an ecological identity or environmental ethic.




