





Laughs and Lifts Lane Cake became the official state cake of Alabama when Governor Robert Bentley signed the bill in 2016.

Emma Rylander Lane of Clayton, AL. introduced the cake in her self published 1898 cook book, "A Few Good Things To Eat". She entitled the concoction "Prize Cake" as it had won first prize at a baking contest at a county fair in Columbus, GA.

Harper Lee, an Alabama native and author mentions the Lane Cake twice in her novel, "To Kill A Mockingbird".

In many Southern homes serving Lane Cake has become a tradition to celebrate special occasions.

SOUTHERN LANE CAKE

Ingredients

6 large egg whites 3/4 cup butter, softened

1-1/2 cups sugar

1 teaspoon vanilla extract

2-1/4 cups all-purpose flour

2-1/2 teaspoons baking powder

1/2 teaspoon salt

3/4 cup 2% milk

FILLING:

6 large egg yolks

1 cup sugar

1/2 cup butter, cubed

1/4 cup bourbon

1 tablespoon grated orange peel

1/4 teaspoon salt





Aunt T's Kitchen

3/4 cup raisins

3/4 cup sweetened shredded coconut

3/4 cup chopped pecans

3/4 cup coarsely chopped red candied cherries

1 cup heavy whipping cream, whipped and sweetened **Directions**

1. Line bottoms of three greased 9-in. round baking pans with parchment paper; grease paper; set aside. Place egg whites in a large bowl; let stand at room temperature 30 minutes.

2. In another large bowl, cream butter and sugar until light and fluffy. Beat in vanilla. In another bowl, whisk flour, baking powder and salt; add to creamed mixture alternately with milk, beating well after each addition. Beat egg whites until stiff peaks form; fold into batter. Transfer to prepared pans.

3. Bake at 325° for 20-25 minutes or until a toothpick inserted in the center comes out clean. Cool for 10 minutes before removing from pans to wire racks; remove paper. Cool completely.

4. For filling, combine egg yolks and sugar in a large saucepan. Add butter; cook and stir over medium-low heat until sugar is dissolved and mixture thickens (do not boil). Remove from the heat. Stir in bourbon, orange peel and salt. Fold in the raisins, coconut, pecans and cherries. Cool.

5. Place one cake layer on a serving plate; spread with a third of the filling. Repeat layers twice. Frost sides of cake with whipped cream. Refrigerate until serving. Yield: 12 servings.

ALABAMA LANE CAKE

Ingredients

1 c softened butter (room temp)

2 c sugar

1 tsp vanilla



ALABAMA LANE GAKES

3 1/4 c cake flour

3 1/2 tsp baking power

1/4 tsp salt

1 c milk

8 egg whites

filling /and topping

8 egg yolks

1 1/4 c sugar

1 grated rind from one orange

1/3 c bourbon or mixture apple/cherry/grape juice

1/2 tsp mace

1 1/2 c pecans, in pieces

1 c shredded coconut

1 c raisins

1/4 tsp salt

1 c glazed chopped red / green cherries

Directions

- 1. Preheat oven to 375 degrees f (190 C). Grease and flour three 9-inch round cake pans.
- 2. Cream butter and sugar together until light and creamy. Beat in vanilla.
- 3. Sift together flour, baking powder and salt twice. Stir flour mixture into batter alternately with milk.
- 4. Beat egg whites until stiff but not dry. Stir 1/4 of whites into batter. Fold in remaining whites until just mixed.
- 5. Spoon batter into the 3 prepared cake pans and bake 20 to 25 minutes. Cool in pans for 10 minutes; turn onto cake racks.
- To prepare filling, mix together yolks, sugar and orange rind in a heavy pan or in top of a double boiler.
- 7. Cook over medium heat, stirring constantly, until sugar dissolves and mixture thickens enough to coat back of spoon. Do not allow to boil or eggs will scramble.
- 8. Remove from heat and stir in remaining ingredients. Let filling cool. Fill the cake layers and spread on top and sides of cake.

9. Lane cake improves in flavor as it ages and mellows. Covered and uncut, this cake can be made 1 week before serving. It's not necessary to refrigerate just put a little bourbon in a spray bottle and spray it a couple times during the week.

SHORT CUT LANE CAKE

Ingredients

4 egg whites

1 (16.5-ounce) package white cake mix

1 cup water

1/4 cup vegetable oil

1 (15-ounce) container coconut pecan frosting

1 (10-ounce) jar maraschino cherries, well drained and chopped

1 cup coarsely chopped pecans

1/2 cup raisins, chopped

2 tablespoons brandy (optional)

1 (16-ounce) container white frosting

Directions

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F. Coat two 9-inch round cake pans with cooking spray; set aside.

In a large bowl with an electric mixer on high speed, beat egg whites until stiff peaks form. In another large bowl with electric mixer on medium speed, beat cake mix, water, and oil 2 minutes, or until smooth. Fold the beaten egg whites into the cake mixture. Divide batter between cake pans.

Bake 23 to 25 minutes, or until a toothpick inserted in center comes out clean. Let cool 10 minutes, then invert onto wire racks to cool completely. Cut cakes in half horizontally, forming four layers.

In a medium bowl, combine coconut pecan frosting, cherries, pecans, raisins, and brandy, if desired; mix well. Place 1 cake layer upside down on a serving plate and frost the top with one-third of the coconut pecan frosting mixture. Repeat the layers 2 more times and top with the fourth cake layer. Frost top and sides with the white frosting. Serve, or cover loosely.





Bartimaeus was a beggar sitting by the road side begging. We have seen people like him before, even on our own streets. Some of us will




pass on the other-side to avoid the beggar, place coins in the person's cup or maybe offer a meal.

Bartimaeus heard about Jesus and knew He was passing by; he called out to Him for help. Mark 10:51 states the request blind

Bartimaeus made when Jesus was passing by. It reads: "What do you want Me to do for you?" Jesus asked. "My Rabbi," the blind man said, "I want to see!"

Physical blindness can certainly impair the normal functions of life. When I read about Bartimaeus



this is what I see in the spirit realm; our eyes maybe wide

open, but be spiritually blind. There maybe people around us spiritually blind to the things of God, going through life tripping and stumbling over things like walking in total darkness; things that only the Holy Spirit can see and reveal to us which is the unseen. So we fix our eyes not on what is seen, but on what is unseen; for what is seen is temporary, but what is unseen is eternal. (2 Corinthians **4:18**) With our natural eyes we see temporary and tangible things, but with eyes of faith we see into the spirit realm of God.



Like the rest, we were by nature deserving of wrath. 4 But because of his great love for us, God, who is rich in mercy, 5 made us alive with Christ even when we were dead in transgressions—it is by grace you have been saved. 6 And God raised us up with Christ and seated us with him in the heavenly realms in Christ Jesus, 7 in order that in the coming ages he might show the incomparable riches of his grace, expressed in his kindness to us in Christ Jesus. 8 For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God— 9 not by works, so that no one can boast.

God's Desire is that we all are made alive in Christ. That we no longer walk like the dead but that we don't speak like the dead. Yes I know it's like an oxymoron. No dead man is walking or speaking, but without Jesus Christ in our lives this is exactly what is happening. Sometime we as Christians end up with an oxymoron in our life and we speak like a dead man. Romans 10:17: "So then faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the word of God."

If you've ever met a person of great faith, then you've met a person of great hearing who knows how to listen to the Word of God. If you looked up the word "Word" in this scripture you would find that it means rhma or rhema. Rhema simple means that which is or has been uttered by the living voice. Or another definition says: a declaration of one's mind made in words. So now we are speaking our mind. In order to speak like a person who is alive in Christ one must change the content in his mind. We must hear the written word of God and speak it with life. It's ok speak your mind as long as your mind lines up with his word!
