





Last Men in Aleppo (NR) - Feras Fayyad's poignant documentary mix-es devastation with the last vestiges of hope in a war-torn wasteland. The White Helmets are the men of the Syrian Civil Defense, unarmed volun-teers who rush in when bombs reduce their cities to rubble. They're the dif-ference between life and death for a staggering number of victims that they pull from the wreckage. The film follows three of these men - founders Khaled, Subhi and Mahmoud through the dangerous landscape of Aleppo, the decisions that keep them there, and how the remaining citi-zens — families, children — manage the anxiety of living from moment to moment. It's a gripping look into a life of heroes and humans

The Last Movie Star (R) - Burt Reynolds stars as Vic Edwards, a financially unstable, has-been legend who is minorly duped into accepting a Lifetime Achievement Award in person at what turns out to be, basically, a Nashville bar. In response, he diverts his young driver Lil (Ariel Winter) on a tour through Knoxville, where he was born and raised before the flood of celebrity and its aftermath. Chevy Chase guest stars briefly as Reynolds I mean Edwards', Hollywood best bud. This movie is confusing. It mixes real-life Burt Reynolds references and the fantasy actor Vic Edwards The relationship between Vic and Lil, which I am guessing is supposed to be significant, was uninteresting.

Roxanne Roxanne (NR) -Duchess of Dis, Roxanne Shante, was the breakthrough female rapper who preceded today's Cardi B and Nicki Minaj by decades, clawing her way to the top of the New York rap battle scene in the early 1980s. She finally finds the respect she deserves in her

very own biopic, streaming exclu-sively on Netflix. Shante (played by amazing newcomer Chante Adams) was barely out of middle school when she was vaulted to notoriety. This film shows the personal adversity of Shante's life, the struggle alongside the swagger. Nia Long is raw as her alcoholic mother, and Mahershala Ali plays the much older, abusive boyfriend who would father her first child

Acts of Violence (R) — Detective James Avery (Bruce Willis) has been trying to pin an unpinnable crime king whose goons snatch a pretty girl at her bachelorette party. When the police offer no real recourse, the girl's brothers - military trained Declan (Cole Hauser, notably), Brandon (Shawn Ashmore) and Roman (Ashton Holmes) — pick up where the detec-tive is unable to move ahead. This is a case of truth in advertising: a lot of bullets, brooding and vengeance. Is it winning Academy Awards? No. Is it do-able for a pizza and movie night? Absolutely, especially because Bruce Willis plays a stymied, underdog cop.







It centers on the story of a flawed and irreverent blind woman who is the only "witness" to the murder of her drug-dealing friend. After the police dismiss her story, she sets out with her dog, Pretzel, to find the killer.

Another series on the way is "Spencer," about a rising high-school foot-ball player from South Central LA who's recruited to play for Beverly Hills High. 

Caring For A Loved One With Mental Illness Starts By Caring For Yourself

(NAPSA)-Roughly 40 million Americans are family caregivers. As the nation's population ages, that number is expected to increase, according to AARP. That's one reason health experts have an important message for caregivers: To properly care for your loved one, you must first take care of yourself. **One Woman's Story**

Like many caregivers, "Éllen" (not her real name) is so focused on her husband's needs and managing their household that her own wellness is often neglected.

Some days can be very long and difficult," she explains. For the past six years, she's been a caregiver for her husband, "Dan," who was diagnosed with a mental illness. Dan's anxiety and depression can be paralyzing and he gets scared, agitated and nervous when Ellen isn't by his side.

In addition to the emotional stress she feels from her 24/7 role of caring for Dan's physical and mental needs, Ellen, who is in her late 50s, also worries about finances. "I wonder how I'll find a job that will pay the bills and still allow me to be available to my husband." In the same breath, despite the obvious challenges she faces, Ellen speaks to the rewards of being a caregiver. "I believe it's made our marriage stronger in many ways. We cut out the silly little things

Make wellness part of everyday life. Online resources, such as the Eight Dimensions of Wellness, provide practical ways to develop healthy habits that can have a positive effect on your mental and physical health. SAMHSA's wellness strategies address emotional and general health, which are both needed to improve personal resilience

and manage stress. Connect with friends and family. Relationships and social networks that provide support, friendship, love and

hope are essential to well-being. Schedule regular checkups and health screenings. Act on results of checkups and health screenings, such as maintaining a healthy weight and blood pressure. Primary care physicians can recommend medications or nents to help manage • Find a support group or mental health professional. Family doctors may be able to recommend a counselor or therapist. SAMHSA can also identify mental health professionals by zip code through its Behavioral Health Treatment Services Locator: www.findtreatment.samhsa.gov. As for Ellen, she's been taking steps to make her mental and physical health a priority. During times when she feels overwhelmed, Ellen has actively started to add in her own stress relievers. "I read a book, walk around the block or sit with our cats. Sometimes I'll call a friend to come over and sit with Dan, so I can take a break or run a quick errand." She recently signed up for a 12-week course for caregivers, something a friend offered to attend with her. It helps her feel less stressed and boosts her well-being. Providing care for loved ones is an act of great generosity and it can be rewarding. However, it can also be stressful and may occupy a great deal of time. It's critical for caregivers to balance their own needs with what they provide to others. Not only will they feel better, they'll be better able to help. The key is learning to incorporate wellness into everyday life.







Why All the Hysteria Over Measles Outbreak? DEAR DR. ROACH: I do not understand the hysteria over the measles outbreak. In my day, every kid had the measles and other childhood diseases, and all survived with strengthened immune sysoung eople have no natural defenses against diseases because their immune systems have been compromised by drugs. With the exception of smallpox and polio, childhood diseases are a rite of passage. - B.W. ANSWER: In the days before vaccines, pretty much every kid did get the measles, but unfortunately, not all of them survived. Although measles death rates were already dropping, before the vaccine was available there were still hundreds of thousands of cases every year, with hundreds of deaths and thousands of cases of severe complications, such as encephalitis, an extremely serious inflammation of the brain that can have long-term repercussions. The vaccine reduced the death rate to essentially zero and the case rate to a few cases per year, mostly from international travelers. Over the decades, the measles vaccine has prevented many thousands of children from death and disability. People, including me, are worried about the measles outbreak because there are many more people now who, because of diseases like HIV and cancer, have immune systems that leave them susceptible to measles, a highly infectious disease. Children under 1 year cannot get the vaccine and the immunity they get from their mother's immune system wanes over time Thus, there are many people at high

not weakens, the immune system, and provides lifelong immunity for nearly everybody who gets two doses. There are risks of the vaccine, but serious adverse effects from it are rare.

DEAR DR. ROACH: Have you ever heard of anyone being allergic or sensitive to newspaper print? I read the newspaper from front to back and like to know what the latest news is. I always seem to have burning eyes, itchy nose and some difficulty breathing. Is an allergy possible, and if so, how can I remedy it? — J.L.

ANSWER: It certainly is possible, and there have been some high-profile cases lately, including a Baltimore newspaper reporter. Most often, the chemical is from pine rosin, used in the printing process. An allergist can

DEAR DR. ROACH: We are reg-ular readers of your column. At 72, I have fasting labs done every six months (metabolic and lipid panels and yearly vitamin D check). Some doctors say that having coffee in the morning before a blood draw is OK if you don't use milk or sugar: other doctors say no coffee. What is the professional advice on this? -D.B.

ANSWER: Coffee or tea without milk or sugar does not interfere with the blood testing.

Should Shock Collars be Banned in U.S.?


DEAR PAW'S CORNER: What do you think about England banning "shock collars," which give dogs a mild electric shock when they misbehave or try to cross an electric-fence boundary? - Jim H., via email

DEAR JIM: I'm all for it. Shock collars are just plain cruel. Never mind that they give purely negative feedback, something that should be limited when training a dog.

England's ban will take effect this year. Other parts of Britain already have banned or are considering a ban on the use of shock collars, including Wales and Scotland.

Here in the U.S., however, there is no such legislation that I know of in any state that bans the sale or use of shock collars. A growing movement is taking shape, however: The Animal Rescue Site is circulating a petition and plans to deliver it to the House Committee on Agriculture, as well as the Senate Committee on Agriculture, Nutrition and Forestry, and the U.S. Department of Agriculture Animal Care.

Veterinary Society of Animal Behavior and the Humane Society of the United States have issued statements against the use of these collars. "The least humane and most controversial use of the shock collar is as a training device," the HSUS says on its website.

As AVSAB says in its position paper on the issue, "Training should focus on reinforcing desired behaviors, removing the reinforcer for inappropriate behaviors, and addressing the emotional state and environmental conditions driving the undesirable behavior.'

In short, owners who want to train their dogs correctly should focus on positive reinforcement. If training a dog becomes difficult, consult a professional trainer rather than shift straight to a shock collar or choke collar.

ful not to overwater. When ready to transplant, bring the plant-filled tray outdoors for a day to adjust, then plant the whole pots in the ground or in a container on your deck. TIP: Make and plant seed-starting pots with other families, and share the seeds.





Come spring, I love cooking and serving Australian grass-fed lamb, especially the shank portions for dinner. I fell in love with braised lamb shanks years ago at the now-closed Kate Mantilini's restaurant in Beverly Hills, California.

Lamb shanks can be served in many as the main meat course with the braising sauce over a starch, picked off the bone and used as a filling for Greek-style gyros, mixed with barbeque sauce and placed on a toasted bun, combined with salsa and served in a taco shell,

or used in casseroles, stews and soups. The shank is the cut

Lamb shanks have a paper-thin membrane covering that should be removed. They also have a thin layer of fat, but are leaner than the sirloin part of a lamb. Once the shank has been properly prepared, seasoned and braised in the oven or simmered for eight hours in a slow-cooker, it practically melts off the bone!

You can make this delicious recipe ahead of time and warm up the shanks right before serving. I've also included a recipe for Lemon and Baby Spinach Fettuccini, which is the perfect spring side dish. The warm pasta and tender spinach soak up the flavorful braising liquid, and the lemon complements



It's A Myth That Only New-Car Dealers **Can Service Vehicles Under Warranty**

(NAPSA)-True or false: Until your vehicle is out of warranty, it must be ser-viced by the new-car dealer or the factory warranty will be void. Although many people would have answered "true," the

correct answer is "false," according to the Car Care Council. By law, independent repair shops

can also provide services to maintain your new-car warranty. Consumers are protected by the Magnuson-Moss Warranty Act, enforced by the Federal Trade Commission (FTC), which prohibits a manufacturer from voiding the vehicle warranty because service was done by a nondealer.

According to the FTC, "It's illegal for a dealer to deny your warranty coverage simply because you had routine maintenance or repairs performed by someone else. Routine maintenance often includes oil changes, tire rotations, belt replacement, fluid checks and flushes, new brake pads and inspections." It's also important to note that the "Magnuson-Moss Warranty Act makes it illegal for companies to void your warranty or deny coverage under the warranty simply because you

under the warranty simply because you used an aftermarket or recycled part.² When using a nondealer, indepen-dent aftermarket shop to maintain your vehicle, the council strongly recom-mends you keep records and receipts for all maintenance done to the vehicle and adhere to scheduled maintenance requirements. If a warranty claim arises, these records will provide proof that maintenance has been performed in accordance with the manufacturer's rec

ommendations and requirements.

lt's A Myth

You don't have to get your car serviced at the dealer—but wherever you go, keep the receipts.

"It's a common misconception that only car dealers can perform the rou tine maintenance and repairs on a new er vehicle that is under warranty," said Rich White, executive director, Car Care Council. "The truth is that consumers can have routine repairs performed by their local independent repair shop or do the work themselves without affect-

ing the warranty." The nonprofit Car Care Council is the source of information for the "Be Car Care Aware" consumer education campaign promoting the benefits of regular vehicle care, maintenance and repair to consumers.

Underdog Is Here Many comic book, movie and TV heroes are so popular that they inspire hundreds of different collectibles. Often, interest in the characters dies about 25 years after the last new episode of their shows are shown. Some have continued to be popular because of TV reruns and their rebirth in new movies, comics or even plays.



Underdog is pictured on this metal lunchbox and matching thermos that auctioned for \$2.296. The comic character has remained popular since the 1950s because of television reruns.

"Underdog" was one of the char-acters created in 1959 for television cartoons selling General Mills cereal. He formerly was Shoeshine Boy, who went into a phone booth to take a pill that turned him into the superpowered Underdog. He always damaged the booth and spoke in rhymes. In 1969, the show lost its sponsor, but 62 shows continued in syndication. They can be seen on TV, and other syndicated shows with Underdog as the hero were edited, rewritten and re-bundled to remain on TV until the late 1990s.

Many years on the air have helped "Underdog" collectibles remain pop-ular ... and expensive. A 1974 child's metal "Underdog" lunchbox and ther-mos sold at a Hakes.com auction in fall 2015 for \$2,296. Other undiscov ered "Underdog" memorabilia still is waiting in garage sales and flea markets, usually without the history that

•We've just been given a set of silverware that we were told is 100-plus years old. It belonged to a friend of my husband's grandmother who gave it to his mother about 1910. It's a service for eight and pieces are marked "Lake Betty Silver Plate" on the backs. All are in excellent condition in a leather, velvet-lined case. We are wondering if the set has any value, other than sentimental.

A. Your silver-plated flatware is not as old as you think it is. The pattern name is Lady Betty and was introduced by International Silver Co. of Meriden, Connecticut, in 1940. The company was formed when some independent silver makers merged in 1898. Silver plating by electricity began (in the U.S.) in 1847, earlier in England. By the 1880s, more than 40 firms, mostly centered near Meriden, made simple to elaborate silver-plated tableware until the 1980s. Silver-plat-ed items generally have a modest value unless they are either very fancy or very rare. Your flatware is not worth much — under \$100 — and places that buy silver to melt are looking for sterling silver, not silver plate.







• On April 13, 1970, disaster strikes 200,000 miles from Earth when oxygen tank No. 2 blows up on Apollo 13. Commander James Lovell reported to mission control on Earth: "Houston, we've had a problem here." Using dramatic and untested maneuvers, Apollo 13 touched down safely in the Pacific Ocean four days later.




