

the Lauderdale County Extension Office in coordinating a program with the local schools called Reality Check. She brings in volunteers to help produce a simulated experience of life decisions. The program takes students in the 8th grade through an exercise of learning to manage their lives and money. A large area such as a gymnasium is used to enable the students to work through an exercise. This is through an exercise. This is an individual assignment. Each student is assigned a family situation such as married, children, educated, employed with a salary. The area is set up as stations from the banker, real estate agent, car dealer, childcare, to other needs such as insurance and savings. The students purchase their services from their paychecks assigned. It is indeed a reality check for many students. Newland's efforts to bring community resources together make this experience possible In addition, Newland

is actively involved in workforce development in the Shoals community. She promotes and coordinates job fairs for the public, on line bulletin boards, promotes business involvement in education, and regularly speaks to groups about her work. Newland manages several grants focused on workforce development.

She works with several regional partners across Alabama northern including the Region 1 Workforce Development Council; a statewide on matching initiative business needs with the education system's products. educational Stephanie is also actively involved with the Shoals Economic Development Authority, Northwest Alabama Council of Local Governments (NACOLG), Alabama Career Center,



I was in an automobile accident and went to the ER by ambulance. After a couple of weeks I went to the chiropractor and after a month or so of weekly treatments began to feel a lot better. The accident was caused by the driver who hit me from behind but his insurance company says that because my blue cross blue shield paid most of the bills that they will not pay me without paying blue cross and if they do that there won't be any money for me. I really hurt for a while and missed three days work which I needed and think I am due some money. How much should they have to pay me and what does blue cross blue shield have to do with it??

Thomas, Sheffield, AL

You should be reimbursed for the pay you missed and you should be compensated for the pain you suffered. I guarantee you that if it were the insurance adjuster who had missed his pay check and had been injured, he would insist on the same.

We go to such great lengths to enjoy our lives and be comfortable and safe that an injury caused by someone else's inattention while driving is unacceptable. Alabama law provides, just like the Bible and other codes of justice, for compensation for wrong. Alabama law says that you are entitled to be reimbursed for your loss wages and that people sitting on a jury just like you get to decide how much money it is worth to be injured through no fault of your own.

Blue cross blue shield is entitled to be paid back for money they spent for your medical bills. They have to share in the cost of the recovery meaning that they have to pay their fair share of the attorney's fees and costs for recovering that money. Occasionally this is extremely important in cases where the medical bills exceed the amount of available insurance coverage. In those cases we can negotiate with blue cross blue shield to lower the amount they claim so that everybody gets some monetary compensation. If blue cross paid \$30,000 in medical bills and all the available coverage totaled \$30,000, blue cross would have to take under \$20,000 and would likely accept \$10,000.

One of the most unfair laws ever passed in this State is the law that says that if someone like you injured through no fault of their own has insurance to pay their bills the jury is told of the injured party's insurance. The jury can never be told that the defendant has insurance and as I have stated many times before insurance defense attorneys go to great lengths to hide the fact that the defendant has a lawyer paid for by the insurance company and an insurance company to pay the jury verdict. So the person who did wrong hides the fact that they have insurance and the person who was injured through no fault of their own gets less money because they had the foresight to have insurance.

This client was an extreme example of a fear that I see quite often. "Radiation" from cell phones, WiFi, and computer screens have been a small controversy for forever. I bet all of us of a certain

age were told not to sit too close to the TV as children. Why? Because mom said so, is why. It also made you blind or grow a third arm or something.

I was recently reminded of my encounter with my client when I came across an article from a popular online magazine called *The Nation* that (mis)reported on a new study released in a respected medical journal. The report claimed that there were health risks involved in the upcoming roll-out of awesome 5G cellular networks which will make our current 4G speeds look like snails.

I don't have room to go into the details of the study here so I can only say that the article has been widely criticized for misrepresenting what the study actually said. In fact, there is good reason to suspect that there will never be a correlation between low-level microwaves and harm to us as humans. Our closest star, Sol, emits far more microwaves and other radiation than any of our little devices. Yet most of us run out to play in it every chance we get. The fact is, you'd have to string together about a thousand cell phones or WiFi routers and point them all at your head to get anywhere close to the "radiation" coming from a microwave oven (which is also (across from Hobby Lobby) 256-767-3337

harmless unless you put your head inside it while it's on). The microwaves transmitted by broadcast TV and radio are also far more powerful than our devices and we are bathed in them 24/7.

'Science" is never settled, of course. There is always room for some weird phenomenon that we never knew about before. But the preponderance of decades of research should ease your anxiety about keeping your phone in your pocket.



REJECTING GOD

All the government programs to deal with drug abuse, child sexual abuse, and other problems that are eating away at the very fabric of our society, are doomed to fail without acknowledging that turning away from God as a nation is the root of the problem.

There are many historical facts that demonstrate the intent of the founding fathers that our nation would be governed according to biblical principles. The Continental Congress formed the American Bible Society, and immediately after creating the Declaration of Independence voted to purchase and import 20,000 copies of scripture for the people of

Patrick Henry, who is called the firebrand of the American Revolution, is still remembered for his words, "Give me liberty or give me death." But in current textbooks the context of these words is deleted. Here is what he said:

"An appeal to arms and the God of hosts is all that has left us. But we shall not fight our battle alone. There is a just God that presides over the destinies of nations. The battle sir, is not of the strong alone. Is life so dear or peace so sweet as to be purchased at the price of chains and slavery? Forbid it almighty God. I know not what course others may take, but as for me, give me liberty, or give me death."

These sentences have been erased from our textbooks. Was Patrick Henry a Christian?

The following year, 1776, he wrote this: "It cannot be emphasized too strongly or too often that this great nation was founded not by religionists, but by Christians; not on religion, but on the Gospel of Jesus Christ. For that reason alone, people of other faiths have been afforded freedom of

Thomas Jefferson wrote these words on the front of his well- worn Bible: "I am a Christian, a disciple of the doctrines of Jesus. I have little doubt that our whole country will soon be rallied to the unity of our Creator and, I hope, to the pure doctrine of Jesus also.'

Of the first 108 universities founded in America, 106 were distinctly Christian, including the first one, Harvard University, chartered in 1636. In the original Harvard Student Handbook rule number one was that students seeking entrance must know Latin and Greek so that they could study the scriptures: "Let every student be plainly instructed and earnestly pressed to consider well, the main end of his life and studies is, to know God and Jesus Christ, which is eternal life, John 17:3; and therefore, to lay Jesus Christ as the only foundation of all sound knowledge and learning. And seeing the Lord only giveth wisdom, let everyone seriously set himself by prayer in secret to seek it of him (Proverbs 2:3)."

Problem Solving

I would like to tip my hat to the person who invented the garage door opener. Oh, I know that it is just a luxury and something we could live without, but I am glad I get to live with one. It is nice to open or close the door with the touch of a button, especially when it keeps you from things like having to get out of your car in the rain, etc.

One of the safety features of a garage door opener/closer is a built-in device that causes the door to reverse itself in case it happens to come down on

something accidentally, like the trunk of your car (or your head). If so, it will reverse and go back up, hopefully avoiding major damage.

However, back in the winter ours started malfunctioning when you tried to close the door. At first, it would reverse itself about half way down (for no reason), but if you kept pushing the button, it would go all the way down about the third try. Then, as time went on, it got worse. And finally it got to the point where it was nearly impossible to close without it reversing itself numerous times.

We wrestled with that thing about three months and I finally got up the nerve to tackle the problem. So, I got my favorite tool (a hammer) and a make-shift ladder (my trusty folding chair) and took a closer look. Guess what? On the side of the opener motor unit is a knob with words written over it which say: "Turn knob to right for increased tension of the door." I did- - and the door has been working great ever since!

Thinking back on this little experience, I was reminded that we often handle (or mishandle) our problems this way. Too often when there is a "little" something wrong, we just ignore it. Maybe we think it will correct itself or just go away on its own, but instead it usually gets worse. Sadly, little things will eventually turn into big things. Thus, if we learn to deal with the little things as they come along, we save ourselves a lot of life's big problems.

Interestingly, the Bible makes its own claim of "Giving us all things that pertain to life and Godliness..." (II Peter 1:3). So, the solutions to life's problems are printed clearly in God's manual. But just as it was with the garage door opener, it is up to you and me to step up- read the directions- and then follow them.

possible collusion between the campaign of now-president Donald Trump and the regime of Vladimir Putin.


His real goal is to overturn that election by getting Trump on something -- anything will do -- that Congress can treat, and that the public will accept as impeachable/indictable.

New Wildlife Program

Editor:

To the naked eye the forests of our beautiful corner of Alabama appear green and lush. However, they are not without their challenges in providing habitat for our beloved wildlife.

One of the biggest challenges relates to the rapid decline of the shortleaf pine tree species. Shortleaf pine provides an important food source and breeding ground for a variety of species including wild turkey, bobwhite quail, the threatened red-cockaded woodpecker, and many more.

Shortleaf pine used to be a dominate species across Alabama and all of the southeastern region. Over the past several decades, its decline has left only six million acres—only 2% of its original range.

Luckily though, many of the remaining standing shortleaf pine and the prime soil and conditions to grow new shortleaf, falls here across ... Is it possible that he whom no moral obligations bind, can have any real good will towards men?

the Cumberland region of Alabama, specifically in Colbert, Limestone and Lawrence counties.

A partnership called My Alabama Woods Cumberland Plateau project is newly available to families and private forest owners in the area. It's run by a collection of local and state organizations that is working with owners to help restore shortleaf pine ecosystem and better care for Alabama wildlife.

The partnership is looking for forest landowners who are interested in learning more about the trees on their property and helping wildlife. Interested landowners may be eligible to meet with a forester or biologist and to receive cost-share or payments to plant shortleaf or conduct other important forest practices on their property.

If you are interested in helping wildlife and live in Colbert, Limestone and Lawrence counties, visit Alabama. Woodscamp.com to see if you are eligible and get started.

or nothing to do with his overt mission, and of a few Russians for running an Internet "troll farm" that posted some cheesy social media ads. However, he has yet to put real meat on his mandate and doesn't seem to be getting much closer to Trump himself than when he started.

Now he's hitching his wagon to Stormy Daniels's star. There are two plausible

reasons why.

One is that he hopes to get Trump on something other than supposed collusion with Russia. Trump has publicly denied the affair with Daniels and knowledge of Cohen's payment to Daniels. If he's lying, and if the payment violated any laws, proof of that might be enough to get impeachment proceedings rolling in Congress and move a grand jury to indict.

The other possibility is that Mueller is baiting Trump to fire him. That would sure to be followed by the usual suspects crying obstruction and constitutional crisis then demanding Trump's head on a platter, and possibly getting it.







Simple Video Calling Devices for Tech-Challenged Seniors

Dear Savvy Senior,

Are there any senior-friendly devices that you can recommend for video calling? I live about a day's drive from my 83-year-old father and would like to see him more often but he doesn't use a computer, tablet or a smartphone.

Searching Susan

Dear Susan,

Video chatting is a great way to stay connected and keep tabs on an elder parent when you can't be there. To help you and your dad achieve this, there are various products on the market today that offer simple video calling for seniors who are unfamiliar or uncomfortable with technology. Here are three unique devices to consider.

ViewClix

If you're interested in a device that requires no input from your dad, check out the ViewClix Smart Frame. This is a 15-inch digital picture frame with video calling capabilities designed specifically for seniors.

Ready to use right out of the box, this device lets family and friends make video calls and send photos (displayed as a slideshow) directly to your dad's ViewClix Smart Frame anytime from their smartphone, tablet or computer. To do this, you simply download the free ViewClix app to your

All photos sent and video calls made to your dad's ViewClix are received automatically. But, it is worth noting that this is a receiving device only. Your dad cannot initiate video calls from his ViewClix.

This device is available at ViewClix.com or 800-304-4281 for \$299 (Wi-Fi is required), or you can purchase their 4G Broadband model that works with T-Mobile if Wi-Fi is not available for \$299, plus a \$20 monthly broadband fee.

GrandPad

Another nifty product that offers simple video calling, and much more, is the grandPad. This is an 8-inch touchscreen custom tablet designed for seniors, ages 75 and older. It comes with a stylus, charging stand and Verizon 4G LTE built-in so it works anywhere within the Verizon network home Wi-Fi is not necessary.

This unique tablet provides a simplified menu of big colorful icons and large text to only essential features, giving your dad clutter-free, one-touch access to make and receive video calls and phone calls, send voice emails, view photos and videos, listen to personalized music, check the weather, play games and more. But, to simplify usage and avoid confusion, it does not offer Web browsing.

GrandPad also has a "Help" button that offers 24/7 phone/tablet remote assistance to help your dad with any facet of his tablet, and it provides damage and theft insurance so if your dad breaks or loses his tablet it will be replaced at no additional cost. Available at grandPad.net or call 800-704-9412, a grandPad leases for \$66 per month, or \$49/month if you pay one year in advance.

Echo Show

If you don't think your dad would mind talking to a machine, the voice activated Amazon Echo Show is another senior-friendly device for video chatting (Wi-Fi is required). Available at Amazon.com for \$230, the Echo Show has

a 7-inch color touchscreen that would let your dad make and receive video calls to those who have their own device, or who have the free Amazon Alexa app installed on their smartphone or tablet.

Once you set up his contacts, to make a call your dad would simply say, "Alexa, call Susan." And when a call comes in, he would ask Alexa to answer or ignore the call. There's also a feature called "drop-in," which could allow vou and other preselected relatives or friends to video in to your dad's device at any time without his input.

The Echo Show also offers a bevy of other features your dad might enjoy like voice-activated access to news, weather, his favorite music and more contact information.



Medicare Minute

"Medicare 'Donut Hole'"

May and June are two months we get calls on the coverage gap or "donut hole". This happens because there is a temporary limit on what your drug plan will pay while you are in the gap. The good news is not everyone will enter the coverage gap. The coverage gap begins after you and your plan have spent a certain amount on covered drugs. In 2018 once you and your plan combined have spent \$3,740 you will enter the coverage gap.

Here's the way the coverage gap works. Imagine you have a prescription that retails for \$300 per month. Your copay, hypothetically, is \$30. This means your plan would pay the rest of the cost or \$270. Medicare will track what you paid (\$30) and what your plan paid (\$270) and count the cost of the drug as \$300 for that month. Let's also say that the other prescriptions you are taking equals \$100 per month. You are now at \$400 per month. In this example you would reach the coverage gap sometime in October.

Under most plans in 2018 once you have reached the coverage gap your plan will temporarily stop paying anything on your drugs. This means you will be responsible for the entire cost of your prescriptions. The silver lining around this very dark cloud is Medicare has negotiated a discount on the drugs you use. For name brand drugs you will pay 35% of the retail price of the drug and on generic drugs you will pay 44% of the retail price.

If you are eligible for Medicare but still on employer coverage you may wonder why you have never reach the coverage gap. This is because employer coverage does not have the "donut hole". The coverage gap only applies to Medicare prescription drug plans. Also remember that Medicare drug plans can vary which means your coverage in the gap can vary.



Try This - "The Name Game..."

University thirteen times my oldest sister's freshman year. Thirteen Sundays that year, we drove those 171 miles to see Ros. Mom would fry chicken, make potato salad, pack some frozen sodas and off we would go. Mom, my sister, my brother, and I would pile into our 196? sea

History says that we end (I loved that car) and we visited Winston-Salem State would spend 3 hours going and 3 hours coming back. And for the next 6 years (my second sister ended up on the same campus), we would make that trip many times. There was no technology. No TVs in the car. No tablets. No cell phones. There was probably a radio, but we didn't listen foam green Dodge Rambler to it. We talked, read books, with its wing-tipped back slept or played games. The

games grew deeper as we got older – from "I Spy with My Little Eye" to finding the alphabet in the signs to "The Name Game where you have to Guess the People" game. I thought that I would share that game here for posterity – I don't want to go to my grave without telling someone how to play this game. I don't know if my children will pass it on because it takes more than a minute to explain. I am sure, in the future, when things get crazy on their family trips, that they will try to remember how to play it. And you, my friend, might be able to use this game on a summer trip soon. "The Name Game...."

- One person chooses the name of a famous person and reveals the initial of the famous last name. Now, keep in mind, that there are two phases to this game. In the first phase, the questioners, the people trying to figure out the famous person, have to try to stump the name person by making the name person guess the famous person who the individual questioner is thinking of whose name begins with that same letter. For instance, if the famous person is P.T. Barnum, the questioners may ask questions about Pearl Bailey, Jeff Bridges, Bob Barker, Bobby Brown, G.W. Bush, Ruby Bridges, etc. The questioner may say "Were you the 43rd say, "Were you the 43rd President of the U.S.?" The name person responds, "No, I am not, G.W. Bush." Or "Were you the first African-American child to integrate schools in Louisiana?" The name person may not know Ruby Bridges. Answer: "Yes, I am P.T. Barnum." The questioner who figures out the name gets to be the next name person.

This game took time and thought. The trips went fast. And as the youngest in the car, I learned while we played. Because of the games we played, college and the trips were not so traumatic. I don't know where my mom got this name game, but she always took pleasure in making us think. Think play – what a great way to spend time on a trip – along with munching on fried chicken. Try it – minus the chicken - you and your children might enjoy thinking and playing together. Any way you can, encourage thinking.

EXPENSES, **NOT INCOME**

Dear Dave,

I bring home \$4,100 a month in military disability pay and Social Security combined. My wife brings home an additional \$2,000 each month. Should we base guaranteed?

Dear Lewis,

Your emergency fund shouldn't be based on income. I recommend folks have three to six months of household expenses set aside in an emergency fund. What would it take to operate your household if one or both of your incomes disappeared?


I don't anticipate your income stopping, Lewis. But income loss isn't the only thing you're guarding against with an emergency fund. You're also guarding against things like an illness in the family, if the transmission in the car heating and cooling unit needs to be replaced. There are many more crises that can come upon a family other than a loss of income.

I don't mind if you two lean toward the threemonth side of expenses, since your income is pretty stable. But always remember, an emergency fund should contain three to six months of expenses, not income.

In many cases it simply does not get paid. Relatives or heirs of the deceased are for that length of time not responsible for a friend or family member's debt, except in cases where they have been a co-signer on that debt.

Let's say someone's parents died, and at the time of their death they had \$100,000 in debt in their names only. The only way that debt will be paid is if they owned enough goes out, or your home's stuff — if they had enough in the way of assets — to pay the debt. If they owned a \$200,000 home, the house would have to be sold in order to pay the debts. Their estate would be the only thing standing good for the debt. If they owned nothing, and had no co-signers on any of the debt, the creditor would not get paid. The bank lost that money.
