#### ALABAMA AMBROSIA SALAD

#### Ingredients



- 1 (11 ounce) can mandarin oranges
- 1 (8 ounce) can crushed pineapple, drained 3 bananas, sliced
- 2 cups flaked coconut
- 2 cups miniature marshmallows
- 1 cup pecan pieces
- 1 (16 ounce) container frozen whipped topping, thawed
- 1 cup maraschino cherries

#### Directions

In a large bowl, combine mandarin oranges, crushed pineapple, bananas, coconut, marshmallows, and pecan pieces. Fold in whipped topping. Garnish with maraschino cherries. Chill for 1 hour or overnight.

#### ALABAMA JAM CAKE

#### Ingredients

- 1 cup shortening, melted
- 1 1/2 cup sugar
- 3 eggs, beaten
- 3 cups flour
- 1 1/2 teaspoon soda
- 2 teaspoons cinnamon
- 1 teaspoon cloves
- 1 teaspoon nutmeg
- 1 1/2 cup buttermilk
- 2 cups blackberry jam





- 1 cup pecan pieces
- 1 cup raisins, cooked 5 minutes and drained

#### Directions

Sift together all dried ingredients (sugar, flour, soda and spices) in a large bowl. Mix melted shortening, eggs, jam, pecans, raisins and buttermilk. Then beat about 4 minutes. Blend in dry ingredients. Pour into 3 greased layer cake pans (9-inch). Bake about 25 minutes in 350 degrees F oven or until cake is done. Ice with your favorite icing for jam cake.

#### ALABAMA MUD CAKE

#### Ingredients

- 1 (20 ounce) can crushed pineapple, with juice
- 1 (21 ounce) can cherry pie filling
- 1 (18.25 ounce) package devil's food cake mix
- 1 cup chopped pecans
- 1/2 cup mint chocolate chips
- 1/2 cup butter, sliced

#### Directions

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C). Grease and flour a 9x13 inch pan. Pour pineapple with juice into prepared pan, spreading evenly to make the first layer. Spread





cherry pie filling over the pineapple layer, then spread the cake mix over the cherry pie filling. Sprinkle the cake mix layer with pecans and mint chocolate chips, then distribute the sliced butter evenly over the top.

Bake in the preheated oven for 40 minutes, or until a toothpick inserted into the center of the cake comes out clean. Allow to cool.

#### ALABAMA FUDGE PECAN CHEWIES

#### Ingredients



- 1/4 cup butter or margarine
- 1 can (14 ounce size) sweetened condensed milk
- 1 package (12 ounce size) semisweet chocolate chips
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1 cup flour
- 1/2 cup pecans, chopped
- 60 pecan halves

#### Directions

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F.

Combine first 3 ingredients in a heavy saucepan. Cook over medium low heat stirring constantly until chocolate and butter melt.

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Remove from heat. Stir in vanilla, flour, and chopped pecans.

Drop by teaspoonfuls onto ungreased cookie sheets.

Press a pecan half into the center of each cookie. Bake for 7 minutes. DO NOT OVERBAKE.

Remove cookies to wire racks to cool. Store in an airtight container.

#### **ALABAMA COOKIES**

#### Ingredients

- 1 cup shortening
- 1 cup sugar
- 1 cup brown sugar, packed
- 2 large egg
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1 1/2 cup flour
- 1 tablespoon salt
- 2 cups regular oats
- 2 cups pecans, chopped
- 1 cup rice krispies
- 1 cup sweetened flaked coconut

#### Directions

Cream shortening, gradually add sugars, beating well at medium speed of mixer.

Add eggs and vanilla, beating well.

Combine flour and salt, add to creamed mixture, mixing well. Stir in oats and remaining ingredients.

Drop dough by heaping teaspoons onto greased cookie sheets.

Bake at 325 degrees F for 10 to 12 minutes. Let cool slightly on cookie sheets, remove to wire rack to cool completely.
