

Vergreen resident and Assistant District Attorney Cindy Hendrickson has received the Honoree Unsung Hero award in Santa Clara County.



LeyVa students raise funds for school in Nicaragua

any Evergreen students have been enduring the Lharsh effects of continuous district budget cuts, and coping as class sizes go up and programs and staffing goes down.

Despite feeling the strain on their own education, students at LeyVa Middle School have been able to hold on to perspective and recognize that far beyond Evergreen there are students who are experiencing severely dire circumstances.

Knowing that in other parts of the world students are learning in poor conditions has moved a group LeyVa Middle School students to take the advice of Mahatma Gandhi by being the change they would like to see in the world. Through their science classes, the students have teamed up with One Dollar for Life (ODFL) to raise money for El Paraiso School in Matagalpa, Nicaragua.

El Paraiso School serves a fast

growing community, and educates seventy students in six grades using two classrooms. The students are forced to come to school in shifts, placing added stress on families. The school's kitchen had to be converted into a preschool classroom, which means lunches can no longer be made on-site.

To help with these growing problems, LeyVa Middle School

students raised more than \$1000 for the Nicaragua school. The money raised by students is used to pay for improvements on the school grounds to make it safe, hygienic, and will result to accommodate an increased enrollment. The funds raised will also help pay for a new play structure on the

Anika Kumar presented with 'Crystal Ball Award'

Anika Kumar (inset) has been recognized for the great things her non-profit, *Forget Me Not*, that she founded at the age of 15, is doing for the community.

In recognition of Kumar's work with seniors through *Forget Me Not*, she was presented with the Crystal Ball award from the Junior League on April 17 at the 49th Annual Recognition Luncheon.

The Junior League award is given to only 10 individuals in the Bay Area that demonstrate exemplary community service in making their community a better place. She is the youngest recipient of this award for this year.

The Volunteer Recognition Luncheon brings together more than 500 community members to celebrate voluntarism while recognizing individuals who generously give their time, energy, and skills to improve the lives of others.

Forget Me Not serves to partner high school students with isolated seniors who suffer from social isolation in a social companionship phone call program. Social isolation is the absence of social relationships, which is prevalent among adults over the age of 65 who are living alone and who are unable to participate in many activities. Isolation can lead to increased risks of depression, cardiovascular diseases, and feelings of denial, guilt, and self-loathing. Tackling the problem, Kumar designed the Forget Me Not companion program.

How it works

Seniors sign up for the phone call program by filling out a simple registration and interests form. High school students volunteer and are carefully paired with registered adults once they complete a mandatory training program. Student volunteers are trained by Britt Bassoni of the Episcopal Senior Communities, who also supervises the call sessions. Once a week, at a predetermined time, high school volunteers make social companionship phone calls of about 20-30 minutes in length to their respective older adults.

Panelist

Kumar was recently contacted by South by Southwest organizers to serve as a panelist to discuss ways to combat loneliness which can lead to increased incidences of depression,

suicide, isolation and even complications from chronic conditions such as diabetes and hypertension. Anika was featured prominently at the conference where she spoke of the effects of loneliness and isolation in the elder population and how to combat this prevalent issue.

The session was such a success that another session was added to accommodate all those that wanted

to attend. Her conversation garnered many accolades and she was the youngest person speaking at this very prominent and well attended conference. For this session, she was also featured in Forbes Magazine.

Jefferson Award

Last year, Kumar won the Jefferson Award and was featured on CBS news. The Jefferson Awards Foundation was created in 1972 by the American Institute for Public Service. Local winners are ordinary people who do extraordinary things without expectation of recognition.

Commencement address

At her Notre Dame High School commencement address, Kumar reminded her fellow students that, "We are the next generation of thinkers, leaders, and achievers. May we never shy away from bold ideas, courageous decisions, and unflinching perseverance. May we never miss an opportunity to step up and take the plunge to change the world around us"

Kumar would like to expand *Forget Me Not* so it can have a positive impact with seniors living in other cities.

Kumar is currently studying molecular and cell biology and public health at UC Berkley. "I chose Cal because of the breadth of diverse opportunities and experiences the school offers," said Kumar.

Here's how Apoorva felt during the last moments of the episode Genius Junior: Braniums and Craniums: "We couldn't believe we had actually conquered the Cortex. My heart was beating really quickly, I could feel adrenaline rushing through me up till that very last second when I answered the final question with only one second left on the clock. Everything felt like it was moving in slow motion. My family was cheering in the crowd and my team ran down the stairs to hug the host, Neil Patrick Harris."

Apoorva said she is thrilled about how well her team competed during the live broadcast. "I'm so grateful that we get to return for the semifinals. All the kids on the show were incredible and had their own set of skills and talents. I had a great time meeting all of them. Like one of the kids on the show said, "It's not about winning or losing," but a celebration of great minds."

Apoorva made her Genius Junior TV debut on April 22, a new kid's quiz show that celebrates bright kids in America, with only 36 chosen from across the nation to participate. Apoorva's team is called The Fast and the Curious, and she is joined by Treasure, a 9-year-old from Jupiter, Florida; and Sebastian, a 12-yearold from New Hyde Park, New York.

Apoorva is known to many of her friends as the "Human Calculator" because she can solve any math problem in her head faster than a calculator.

Apoorva was the "Super Brain" for math; this means that she takes on the Number Cruncher round as an individual on the center stage, and has to answer all the math equations in 90 secs. She calculated and correctly answered every question, within seconds. Neil Patrick Harris, the team, and the crowd cheered for her as she completed her round and answered the 7th question when the timer was done. After the show, friends and family sent in tons of messages congratulating her performance.



The Villages Tennis Club Scholarship Committee is the largest donor of scholarships at Silver Creek High School.


Since 2004, the Villages Tennis Club has provided scholarships to members of the Boys and Girls Tennis Teams.

This year four deserving students are each receiving \$3,000, bringing the grand total of scholarships to \$12,000.


The students and their parents will be introduced at the Scholarship Fund Raising BBQ Dinner at The Villages on Sunday, April 29.

Largest 'World Class' bike and skate park opens in Evergreen

Bring your pedal power and glide like a bird

Thousands flocked to the grand opening of the new Lake Cunningham Action Sports Park on a super blue sunny sky Saturday morning.

A blue satin ribbon was cut to open the park on April 14 and invite the whole city to begin using the largest bike and skate park in the U.S.A.

One spectator said, "This is pure joy to watch!"

The sound system and bike demo was like that of watching professional skiers in

Squaw Valley going over moguls and it accentuated the excitement of the grand opening.

Peter Brandt of Robert Castillo's BMX Freestyle Bike Team began the show with a breathless announcer voice delivery describing the spectacular stunts of top flight BMX riders who put on a world class show.

At the end of the early morning demo, one person said, "I feel exhausted just watching that." It's true; the audience becomes one with the rider because each onlooker pulls for an incredible execution of the jump and stunt. Castillo's group has performed in more than 6,000 shows, including Las Vegas.

The show stopping BMX riders ran down the dirt track and went up and over many undulated hills preforming unbelievable flying acrobatics. They would spin their handlebars and entire bikes in air, and after executing numerous combined stunts, graceful as a bobcat, would regain their proper positions just prior to smoothly landing without a hitch.

Announcer, Brandt would draw the crowd into participation pushing for involvement with applause by impassionedly saying over the sounds of jagged music, "let's put it together for ..." or "a little voice from the audience..." It was like a Rock and Roll sermon of sorts.

Brandt wound up the crowd and drew everyone in with his expert tone and enunciation of words which contained savvy statements such as, "this guy demands the best out of himself each and every time," (during the run).

Then there was a crash, but quick as he fell and dragged across the dirt, the rider got right back up and the announcer with measured composure and a low kick back voice droned, "Wow, goin' for it, not afraid to take a crash especially for entertainment, try again and never give up!," to which indeed the rider got right back in the hunt investing in many other runs. This kind of talk was inspirational to young and old alike

After a successful emotional run, some of the racers would hold their arm up high in the air and give a sign of having their thumb and little finger up with the 2,3 and 4th finger clinched down into the palm of their hand. This communication surely traveled over here from Hawaii.

Girl power awaits

But wait a moment, something was missing. There were no girls riding over the mounds and doing stunts. For sure, the new Cunningham Bike Park will change all that and San Jose will lead the way with you go girl BMX championship winners too! It's just a matter of time.

History in the making

The announcer with his motorboat voice then asked the swarm of people over the entrancing sounds of invigorating laid down song selections "Do you guys want to see some back flips," to which the crowd began to cheer. The riders had it all planned out and ran in order in what is referred to in the BMX realm as a "train." One right after another did a different variation of a flip or personal trick innovation

"I grew up in south San Jose," said Ash Kalra, California State Assembly member. Kalra went on to say that sure enough someone got hurt; so it's wonderful that today in San Jose, instead of kids building ramps at home in the streets, they now can come to a safe place to ride and jump their bikes. "This is what the city is able to do when the community comes together," said Kalra. "Creative and forward thinking ideas were used to plan such a place and that there are no other places like this in California. We need places like this that are accessible to everyone!"

Dave Cortese

"I want everyone to know that I am the first person to show up at this BMX Park with a suit on, I hold the record now," said a jovial Dave Cortese as he spoke to the crowd (always dedicated and devoted to the county, he also was on his way that day to another very important event honoring Veterans).

Cortese said: "It took many years but now it is a reality! People of all ages are to play in this city. In 2008, I cut the ribbon for the opening of the skate board part of Cunningham Park and former Vice Mayor Rose Herrera and San Jose City Councilwoman Sylvia Arenas have carried the torch to keep it all going. It is important to let your representatives know what you want. Your investment is to let your representatives know and it may take years but eventually it can be done! This new bike park as an actual example that citizens work hand and hand with those in city government to make things happen in ways the general public want and need."

Nova


Sitting on her bike and awaiting the start of the event, Nova traveled more than 50 miles to attend as spectator and rider. Due to unforeseen circumstances, Councilwoman Arenas was not able to make the event. However, she delivered this important quote to the community at press time, "Lake Cunningham Action Sports Park combines the existing largest skate park in California with a brand new bike park that has the most riding features of any bike park in America. Teenagers are sometimes the residents most in need of our support, and at the same time, the hardest to reach. This park creates an amazing place for teens to

congregate, learn from mentors, and develop perseverance."

Angel Rios Jr.

"I know we are all ready to put our helmets on and ride. This park was created for everyone. The Parks and recreation mantra is, 'We Build Community Through Fun!," said Rios Jr. who is Director of Parks, Recreation and Neighborhood services. "We manage public spaces that allow people to connect to people and places. We are in the business of providing such parks. It takes a team. Our shop sells some BMX bikes and dirt jumpers that are more specific for riding in this kind of park. We welcome all ages to look at bikes and to enjoy this awesome new park. You can always come visit us and will show you and let you try out specific top notch models for dirt riding."

Parker and Spencer

Two riders "Parker" and "Spencer" said the new bike park was great because the tracks are already in place (meaning that often dirt bikers have to take lots of time to



make and prepare slalom tracks to run). They also gave approval to the main jump line (this is a carefully designed run of hills and ramps).

Scooters and skateboards can squabble

In our world often one group of people can steer away from hanging out with another for within the Venn diagram of friendship, exclusivity of the groups in the outer circles can sometimes be separated by rides of choice. At the event, an old school skateboarder with young daughter earnestly said that they wanted the bikes and trikes to stay clear of the bowls in the classic skateboard cement zone areas. Though the bike and skate park is monitored by earnest city workers they suggested, "if anyone is under 18 years old it might be good to have a parent near to watch over what they are doing," (meaning sometimes a young person might not recognize the swift danger if skating down into a bowl that has a fast rider entering behind them). It was thought that large kids might run down some of the smaller tikes unless everyone is careful. These are some of the rough edges that will be figured out over time in the combination world's largest skateboard and Bike Park in the U.S.A. Some riders push it to the max and that means the energy in the park is never boring for feats of courage are always taking place.

Steve Bennette. a 40-plus year resident of San Jose said face to face to the mayor, "thank you for being the face of San Jose, I think you're the best Mayor we've ever had."

A little girl named Abby was rolling her bike with her dad and said, "I've been watching the jumps and they look really cool. I want to come back and try it all. Good Job San Jose!" It's also a healthy place for teenagers to go and get away from it all. To unplug and visit a safe place with a vibe they like; a kind of 21st century hangout.

One mom said, "I am so happy they built this park for I come here and watch my son ride." She said that the workers at the Skate Park are so nice that she regards them as "family" and her son is absolutely thrilled about this new bike park opening up and joining with the skate park. "He just loves coming to ride here!" she said.

Never a dull moment

The bike park has many features which manufacture lots of excitement for the biker, skater and onlooker. The 8.5 acre bike park is designed well, with trails that zig zag to gradually take people up to the top where comfortable benches allow all to rest and view both the jump bike runs and the 68,000 square foot skateboard park. As you walk the trail you get exercise and inspiration in watching particular ramps which are used in unique ways of expertise by riders one right after another. There is never a dull moment by the onlookers who place themselves in strategic points of on-looking interest along the

The only fees are for riders. Visitors get a thrill just by watching. All San Jose parks can be entered at no charge by walking, jogging, skateboarding or bike riding. It is a philosophy of the city to welcome all! Anyone can walk the trail of the bike park. It's a great place for a family destination; just to watch top flight bike riders and skaters is invigorating. Viewing others get in shape at such destinations is contagious and builds community which perhaps subliminally allows all to realize we are all part of the same family of man and womankind (a new inclusive term coined where else but here in Silicon Valley).

At the conclusion of the event hundreds of riders lined up on trails to take the plunge with many moms, dads, girlfriends and boyfriends waiting at a point on the trail to cheer on their loved one on. Bike enthusiast Thompson's words rang true when he said, "Sam Liccardo and Sylvia Arenas are the finest folks and Parks and Rec have gone above and beyond to build the greatest bike park in California. Ride on San Jose!" Wow, could this be the new coining of a catch phrase that is reminiscent of the 60's counter culture. Will the words "Ride On!" catch fire and take over in lieu of the phrase "Right On" and perhaps spread across the country. Ya, "Ride On," meaning look forward and never get hung up on the past. Well, we'll just have to wait and see but remember, you read it here first in the Evergreen Times! "Ride



We lost our 'Meatball' but gained a 'Milan'

There's no denying that running a restaurant can be a daunting task!

Case in point, House of Meatball restaurant, located at the corner of San Felipe and Yerba Buena Roads has called it quits and closed their doors after less than a year in business.

House of Meatball was plagued with staffing problems from the very start and there were reviews written throughout their tenure, some favorable, and others that were unfavorable. There were many patrons who posted on social media that the House of Meatball breakfasts were very tasty. Other comments were not complimentary. One patron posted, "My husband and I went there one afternoon and there was only one other attendee, who sat in the patio. The two people working there kept directing all their attention to that one person. We finally got, what we thought was the waiter's, attention and he took our order. When the food came it was barely edible and the service was terrible!"

This just about sizes up the situation! As the old song used to go: "On top of Spaghetti, all covered with cheese, I lost my poor meatball when somebody sneezed." But with allergy season upon us, who knows?

A sign of change

A sign on the window, about a week ago, stated that the restaurant would be closed until at least the following Friday, or until the place was properly cleaned up and everything set shipshape. Management told the Evergreen Times that a consultant was going to be hired and a new menu was in the works. But, there has been no activity around the restaurant until last week when several folks from the Villages Golf and Country Club said that they looked forward to someone taking over the location after seeing a sandwich board sign on the sidewalk in front of the restaurant stating that House of Meatballs was permanently closed and that another owner would be opening a fine Italian restaurant soon. By happenstance, the new General Manager, was on the premises guiding the remodel effort.

Welcome to Milan

The new restaurant taking over House of Meatball's location is called Milan. The new restaurant will offer Italian Cuisine, full bar with crafted drinks, and an extensive wine selection. The scheduled opening is sometime in early May.

"We will offer special discounts for senior citizens," said General Manager, Christine Schoonover. Christine is a very energetic and enthusiastic restauranteur, already managing Cucina Venti Italian Restaurant, and the Voya (South American cuisine restaurant) both located in Mountain View. Voya earned the Michelin guide in 2016.

Christine said Milan will offer fine Italian dining at comparable prices, which is good news for patrons coming to the shopping center where Milan is located, who are on fixed incomes or students attending Evergreen College.

The new owner, Bella Adwisha, assures the Evergreen community that "our new restaurant is being propelled forward by our uncompromising refusal to sacrifice quality. It is imperative to prepare food with fresh ingredients and it is also important to respect the quality of each dish prepared."

Pasta Pomodoro made a stab at trying to serve the Evergreen community, before the location was taken over by House of Meatball. Some believe that Pasta Pomodoro failed due to a decline in food quality during 2016. Others state that staffing problems brought down House of Meatball.

Quite a number of comments on the website Nextdoor.com have been encouraging. The consensus of the community believes the next venture, Milan, will work out providing the prices are reasonable, a good chef can be procured, and the staff is properly trained.

Adwisha further stated, "Executive Chef, Antonio Marco, is trained in classic Italian and Mediterranean cuisine. "He incorporates Italian, French, and Spanish influences into his dishes and believes that cooking is a craft. His simple dishes, prepared using the freshest, seasonal ingredients found locally, are flavorful, allowing the ingredients to take center stage!"

Adwisha continued, "It is my hope the Milan Restaurant will impact our lives. It will be a fine dining experience for special occasions: anniversaries, graduations, promotions and other celebrations; how about the first date spot or a perfect place to 'meet the parents?' Join the 2018 bus trip to **Sacramento: Speak up for Education in the county**

n 2013, the California Legislature approved the biggest changes to education funding in 40 years by establishing the Local Control Funding Formula that gave counties and school districts more control over how they spend state funds.

During our 2014 Sacramento Bus Trip for Education, participants learned a lot about how the formula would work and its goal for distributing funds according to the level of student need, with more spending flexibility at the local level.

Four years later, you have the opportunity to tell the State Legislators who represent Santa Clara County if you think the new formula is working, how it could be changed and if you think students and your communities are better off.

Our 16th Bus Trip for Education, which is free to participants, will be on Tuesday, May 15, with the goal of connecting educators, students, parents and residents with legislators and state officials who can hear your concerns and suggestions and answer your questions.

The issues have changed over the 15 years of bus trips, and our participation has grown to include more students. But our goals to bring you closer to the decisions-makers and provide you with information have remained the same.

The proposed state budget for 2018-19 includes \$3 billion in funding for the Local Control Funding Formula, which means it would be fully implemented two years ahead of schedule. The budget also proposes requiring school districts to create a link between their local accountability plans and their budgets to show how this increased funding is being spent.

You will be able to receive an update on what's next for this revolutionary change. Other issues of interest have been support for students who want to attend college and the

California Common Core Standards of education adopted by the State Board of Education in 2010. Attendees are welcome to bring up other issues, as well.

The Bus Trip for Education is sponsored by my office and the Silicon Valley Education Foundation. Participants receive updates on current legislative proposals, a status update on school funding and other key public education efforts. Our Legislators also tell us about other non-education bills they are working on. There will also be guided tours of the Capitol.




