

God's Design

For those that know me, it is probably hard to believe that I watch anything on TV other than college football and reruns of "The Andy Griffith Show." And while these are my go-to watching experiences, I do venture out every now and then.

For example, last Sunday afternoon my wife and I sat down and watched an episode of "Discovering Alabama" on the Alabama Public Television network. This particular episode dealt with "Coastal Ecology." I know, it sounds like one of those documentaries where you yawn and quickly change the channel. But this one captured my attention, because it

validated God's design in creation- - once again.

I was especially intrigued by a segment where they talked about beach mice and how their population has been threatened by commercial development. Ordinarily, I would not think of a decline in any mouse population as a bad thing. But in this case, I would be wrong.

For example, there was once a property very near to the beach where a condominium complex was planning to be built. It was also home to a large beach mouse population. So, the developer came up with an idea. He went to the Animal Shelter, got some cats and released them in the area. It did take care of the mice, but created another problem.

Little known to most, the documentary pointed out that beach mice make a valuable contribution to the ecological balance where they live. They make their homes in the sand dunes where sea oats grow. Sea oats are a sub-tropical grass with leaves that catch wind-blown sand which turns into sand dunes. Further, sea oats have deep roots and rhizomes which stabilize the dunes. These dunes provide a natural buffer to the inlands from high winds, storm surges and tides.

The sand mice serve as powerful distributors of the seeds of the sea oats along the sand to initiate these protective dunes. Isn't that amazing? It would be even more amazing to think that this happens just by accident! But no, this is one of countless illustrations that prove that there is intelligent design in our entire world. And if there is design, there must also be a Designer!

Let us take note of these words from Job: "But now ask the beasts, and they will teach you; and the birds of the air, and they will tell you; or speak to the earth, and it will teach you; and the fish of the sea will explain to you. Who among all these does not know that the hand of the Lord has done this, in whose hand is the life of every living thing, and the breath of all mankind?" (Job 12:7-10).



spectrum consists of the following frequencies in order from low to high:

Radio waves/microwaves/ infrared radiation/VISIBLE LIGHT/ultraviolet radiation/Xrays/Gamma-rays

rays/Gamma-rays Radiation to the left of "visible light" certainly CAN be harmful. For example, place your hand in a 500-degree oven and it will be severely damaged by infrared radiation. The "heat" from a microwave oven heats up leftovers in the exact same way that a radiant oven does -- by causing atoms to vibrate.

It's just that microwaves can penetráte a little deeper than infrared radiation. But these frequencies simply do not have enough energy to damage DNA and cause cancer.

the energies are high enough that they can knock an electron out of the orbit of an atom. That translates to "DNA damage" which translates to "cancer." None of our devices emit these high energy waves, thus we are safe.







You've been paying for the last 25-30 years involuntarily. You will not get Medicare. That's why your check has been increased. No more Medicare payments are coming out.







SUSIE MARTIN IS MAKING A Big Impact on her Little

Susie Martin remembers the positive impact an adult mentor had on her childhood. So, for nearly a decade she's been paying it forward through Big Brothers Big Sisters of the Shoals.

Martin grew up in a single-parent home in New Orleans. A program similar to Big Brothers Big Sisters matched her with a mentor who advised her and helped her with her studies. Once her children left home for college, Martin decided to invest her time in

mentoring a child in the community.

"I had an empty nest, so I decided to go the route of the Big Brothers Big Sisters program," she said. "I just wanted to give back."

Big Brothers Big Sisters volunteers work one-onone with children in singleparent homes who need extra time with an adult role model. Mentors, or "Bigs," help their "Littles" with school work, activities in the community, and more

Martin originally moved to the Shoals area after her mother died when she was twelve. Her father died when she was one.

'I moved to Russellville and my aunt and uncle raised me," she said. "Not many people are willing to raise a twelve-year-old through college, but they were. That made a big impact on my life. They were so kind to take me in."

Martin was excited to jump into her mentoring work with both feet. She was matched with her little sister who was seven years old at the time. For the purposes of this article, we'll call her, Amy. Amy will turn 17 this summer, and she and Martin still

spend a considerable amount of time together. While Big Brothers Big Sisters requires a minimum commitment from its volunteers of just four hours per month, Martin has chosen to go above and beyond the organization's requirements.

'I felt the need to do more, so I spend lots more time with her than that," Martin said. "Once my sixmonth probationary period the day in Montgomery was over, we were together with Big Brothers Big Sisters



every weekend and we continue to be together."

Martin and her Little have cooked together, taken outings in the community, and they even took a day trip to Six Flags. She and her husband also took Amy on her first flight.

"We were excited and wanted her to have several firsts," Martin says. "It was a great experience for both my husband and me.'

Martin was voted Big Sister of the Year for the state of Alabama in 2014. Martin and her Little got to meet former governor Robert Bentley and spend



to my father for nearly 20 years and he died 4 years ago. My mother is disabled and draws a small amount of social security but has been told that she could draw widow's benefits. She is not receiving widow's benefits, how can she draw widow's benefits?

In order to qualify for widow's benefits under the Social Security Administration Rules the first requirement is that the marriage have been for 10 or more years and the deceased spouse having worked and paid in to social security (what you see deducted from your paycheck as FICA) for

those 10 or more years.

Secondly, the widow (or widower) must be 50 or older and the deceased spouse must have died within 7 years of the claim for benefits.

What you are really looking at is a comparison between two earnings records to see who would draw the largest amount per month of social security benefits. The more money you earn the more money you pay into social security and the more money you pay into social security the more money you get back every month up to a maximum amount that changes typically every year. People that make over \$128,400.00 a year do not have to contribute to social security on earnings above that amount. Those people get a raise every year at the point where they have paid their FICA taxes on the first \$128,400.00 they made and do not have to pay any more after that.

If your father's earnings were higher than your mother's and your mother is disabled and 50, an application for widow's benefits should be filed and it should be granted giving your mother the benefit of your dad's payments into the social security system.



A Successful 2018 Session

Editor:

The 2018 session of the Legislature ended a few weeks ago, and I think it

the people of Alabama. The \$6.6 billion education

budget is the largest education budget since the Great Recession. It includes a 2.5% pay raise for teachers. While many factors contribute to a quality education, a smart, driven teacher is essential. I'm glad the Legislature could reward our teachers with a raise. The education budget

was a productive one for for next year includes an additional \$18.5 million for First Class, Alabama's voluntary Pre-K program. First Class is currently available in 941 classrooms. It has been named the best Pre-K program in the nation for eleven years in a row by the National Institute for Early Education Research. The \$18.5 million increase will fund approximately 120 new Pre-K classrooms. This is a responsible

budget that gives school districts local predictability and allows them to plan for the entire year. Unfortunately, that kind of predictability isn't a given. Proration occurred six times between 2001 and 2011. This forced local districts to scramble and cut their budgets in the middle of the year. Under Republican leadership, proration hasn't happened once since 2011.

I am excited to report that the Legislature passed a tax cut by increasing the number of Alabamians who can claim the maximum exemption from state income taxes. Alabama's working families will collectively save \$40 million over the next ten years due to the Legislature's tax cut. The Legislature also


increased state troopers' budget by \$3 million to fund the hiring of 30 new troopers. I was glad to vote for the Parks for Patriots Act which gives Alabama's military members free

access to our state parks. On a personal note, I was privileged to sponsor several bills that became law. One requires home builders to inform home owners whether the builder liability insurance has before any construction begins. I also sponsored a bill that gives county superintendents the right pursue additional to employment outside of their jobs in education if their contracts allow that. This levels the playing field between county and city superintendents who already have the right of additional employment.

Dear Dave,

Why don't you recommend having short-term disability insurance while doing the first three Baby Steps of your plan? It seems like a good time for it, when you're in the beginning stages of getting your finances in order. Bob

Dear Bob,

You could certainly do that if you want, possi-bly even through your place of employment. I'm a big fan of folks having long-term disability insurance when they're in their prime wage-earning years. But short-term disability is something I've always considered to be gimmick insurance, and that's something I don't recommend or

I get the argument, too, that short-term disability coverage usually isn't very expensive. But during the first two Baby Steps — getting a \$1,000 beginner emergency fund set aside, and paying off everything but the house - you're trying to limit expenses as much as possible. Chances are you wouldn't need it in Baby Step 3, because that covers your full emergency fund of three to six months of expenses.

LOW VS. NO

Dear Dave,

My husband and I are trying to buy a house, but we both have low credit scores, so we're having trouble securing a loan. We've heard you talk about getting a mortgage loan with no credit score. Is this the same as a low credit score? Laura

Dear Laura,

No, it is not. No credit score, means you don't have any credit or your credit score is "indeterminable." A low credit score indicates you've had - or still have — debt in your life, and you haven't done a good job of paying creditors on time.

Two things will help solve the problem of having a low credit score. One is time. If you've had instances of late payments from years ago, time will help heal that to a degree. The older late issues become, the less they count against you.

But my guess is you two probably have some bad debt. By bad debt, I mean things that were never paid, or accounts that are in collections. If that's the case, you need to contact those people, and settle those debts in full — and in writing — as quickly as possible. Officially close the accounts, too, before you try to buy a home.

When it comes to buying a home, Laura, I always advise folks to first be debt-free and have an emergency fund of three to six months of expenses set aside. -Dave

sold to Dr. John Emerson. It was under Emerson's service that Scott based his legal fight for free-dom that resulted in the Dred Scott Decision.

Living in the "free state" of Missouri, Dred Scott appealed to the Supreme Court for his freedom. The Court ruled that African-Americans could not be citizens and that Dred Scott was "property" of his owner and not free. This meant that the Northern states had an obligation to return runaway slaves, which further infuriated the North and pushed both sides further toward the Civil War.

It seems like potential cuts to Medicaid are all over the news lately. People who confuse Medicare and Medicaid are obviously concerned. This is easy to do because they both can be related to a person's health insurance. Although they coordinate in many ways, they are two distinctive programs.

Medicare is a federal health insurance program. There are three ways to qualify for Medicare. The first way is to be 65 years of age or older. The second way is to have been on Social Security disability for at least 24 months. The third way to qualify for Medicare is be any age and have either end-stage renal disease or ALS. Medicare is not income based as far as qualifying. As long as you meet one of the three requirements above you will qualify for Medicare. Your income, however, can affect the amount you pay for your Part B premium.

Medicaid is a state health insurance program. Medicaid is income and resource based, meaning you will qualify or not according to how much money you make and/or how much money you have saved. In 2018 if you made less than \$1,032 as an individual or \$1,392 as a couple you could qualify for Medicaid. Whereas Medicare has deductibles and coinsurance, Medicaid will take care of most of your healthcare cost. A person on Medicaid can also get a break on how much they pay on their prescription drugs.

Medicare and Medicaid will coordinate in a couple of ways. In some counties in north Alabama there is a Medicare plan that will coordinate with Medicaid. To qualify for this plan you must be on Medicare and Medicaid. This is referred to as "dual eligible". Also, if you make more than the Medicaid limits but are under \$1,517 as an individual or \$2,057 as a couple you may qualify for "extra help". This would help you on your prescription drug cost.





The first principle of science is: The findings of experimentation are no more accurate than the original premise. or if your premise is wrong, so shall your findings be.

Years ago, some friends took their sick child to a doctor who diagnosed measles and prescribed treatment for measles. It turned out the child had Rocky Mountain Fever and died. The prescription was based on a false premise--that the child had measles.

There is ever-increasing pressure on the church from the world, including the so-called liberal churches, to accept sinful lifestyles as merely alternate lifestyles.

In the name of inclusion and tolerance we are told that we should accept homosexuality and not be judgmental concerning those who are caught up in that lifestyle. A pastor friend told me that another pastor in his denomination accused him of being intolerant because he opposed the ordination of homosexuals into the pastoral ministry. This tells us that the alcoholic does not have to live the rest of his life confessing, "I am an alcoholic and I will always be an alcoholic. Instead, he can be set free and be included in the such were some of you. Neither does the homosexual have to live his life with the guilt of sin in the deception of denial. The other night, I was invited to have dinner with a group of college-aged young ladies and talk about any subject and then answer their questions. I shared about finding a mate who has the same foundation. But their questions had more to do with marriage – best marriage advice, transitioning from dating to marriage, hardest and best part of being married, etc. My answer to that last listed question was: hardest part reining in anger/not having a short fuse/not being so touchy, best part – having a permanent date, when you want to go somewhere or do something, your date is right there. The topic of deal-breakers came up as we continued discussing. One of the married girls there surprised me when she said that pornography addiction had been a dealbreaker for her. She said that she simply wasn't going to have that in her life, which was exactly how I felt about alcohol when I was dating. At that time, pornography wasn't even on my radar. But times have changed.

Pornography addiction is rampant and the assessment of porn is changing. According to Barna.com/ porn-in-the-digital-age, one in three Americans seek out If we could speak truth in pornography at least once a month. "Living in a hyper-sexualized and pornified for marriage and family media culture means could recover. catching sight of explicit images with little or no effort." And I can take interest in the new activities and loves in her life. She has even grown to the point that she now asks me about my well-being.

. Barna says that young people engage in pornography more out of boredom, curiosity, and fun than for arousal. We need to pay attention and offer options, support, and in some cases encouragement toward therapy. But most importantly, we need to create environments of openness. Parents ask. Teachers teach. And loved ones gather genuinely so that isolation is broken and confidences are shared when needed. Love. Create care and connection. Follow hunches.
