# **Local men offer** a human touch to the homeless

"What if we made a difference?"

That's what David Watkins asked his friend, Steve Lam, one day after seeing homeless people living under an overpass.

Their conversation led to the creation of "The Overpassed," named for those passed over by society, as well as where some homeless live. Their purpose is to provide homeless men and women with basic necessities, as well as a human touch.

"When Steve and I first started approaching homeless people in tents, we were both a bit nervous," says Watkins, "but you'd be surprised just how open many of them can be. The poorest man can have the most generous heart."

We see a lot of people here on the brink of giving up hope," says Lam. "Our mission here, in addition to giving them things, is

about rekindling their hope. We say, "It's a beautiful day. You're alive. Let's start from there." Sometimes they pray together, sharlaged, inspired, and motivated,"

Watkins. "Everyone deserves and needs help."

On a monthly basis for four years, the two men have delivered care packages to a homeless encampment at St. James Park and under overpasses downtown along the Guadalupe River. More recently, their friend, Richard Breck has joined their efforts. In addition to interacting with the homeless, he secures corporate donations and created their crowd sourcing webpage at: www.YouCaring.com (search for The Overpassed).

Initially, Watkins brought water bottles, toothpaste and toothbrushes to the encampment. In March, they provided people with water, pita bread, granola bars, first aid kits, razors, scissors, pens and pencils, underwear and cat food. In April, they brought water, socks, shirts and jackets donated by high tech companies. They let the recipients choose which items they want, granting them that dignity.

After speaking with the homeless, they received requests for shoes, peanut butter, bug repellent, hand sanitizer, bungie cords and garbage bags. Diane wants garbage bags so she can clean up the encampment. George, David and Omar fix bicycles and would like bike parts, chain lubricant and tools. Nasia and Ernie hope

# Leland student releases free app to facilitate language learning

# Teenagers helping our world


There are a myriad of different languages that people are using to communicate around the world, making it necessary for people to pick up a second language, even a third.

Addressing the need to learn a new language, Jeff Kim, 16, developed a new state-of-the-art iOS app that makes learning a new language both fun and efficient.

Kim, who is currently taking AP Spanish Language and Culture at Leland High School, learned the unfortunate reality of learning a language.

The vocabulary is endless," Jeff confessed. "Even after four years of learning Spanish, I still cannot say a lot of objects in Spanish without looking them up right

Jeff's problems with languages extend beyond his classroom. "Whenever I try to talk with my relatives in South Korea, my efforts are always futile. I always have to pause and ask my mother to tell me how to say a certain word in Korean. Sometimes, my




mother does not know the answer because she has never heard of the English word before."

That's why Jeff Kim, now a junior at Leland High School, spent several months coding, designing, and testing Worldly, an iOS app that utilizes image recognition and cloud translation services to enable users to learn how to say anything around them in any language.

"Using Worldly is incredibly simple. Select languages to learn in Settings. Then, take a picture with your device's camera or select a photo from your album, receive a classification of the object(s) in the photo, tap on Translate, and select a language from the ones that you chose in Settings," Jeff explains.


"All of these features boil down to Worldly's central mission: to facilitate language learning worldwide," Kim said.

Like one of the kids on the show said, "It's not about winning or losing," but a celebration of great minds."

Apoorva made her Genius Junior TV debut on April 22, a new kid's quiz show that celebrates bright kids in America, with only 36 chosen from across the nation to

Apoorva is known to many of her friends as the "Human Calculator" because she can solve any math problem in her head faster than a calculator. She shares the same IQ (160) with the late Albert's Einstein.

Apoorva was the "Super Brain" for math; this means that she takes on the Number Cruncher round as an individual on the center stage, and has to answer all the math equations in 90 secs. She calculated and correctly answered every question, within seconds. Neil Patrick Harris, the team, and the crowd cheered for her as she completed her round and answered the seventh question when the timer was done. After the show, friends and family sent in tons of messages congratulating her performance.

# Pat Dando was a mentor to me

or those of you not familiar with Pat Dando, she served as the Councilmember from District 10 for ten years and as Vice Mayor during a portion of her time on the San Jose City Council.

Dando later went on to lead the San Jose - Silicon

Valley Chamber of Commerce. Pat was a mentor to me and many others in our community and I considered her a friend. Most importantly, however, Pat was a dedicated public servant and community leader who would find a need in the community and then go about the hard work of bringing together people and resources to fill that need.

Whether it was a need for youth counseling, a place where the Almaden community could gather, educating the public about the signs of stroke, or creating a hospital unit where stroke victims could receive specialized care to improve their chances of recovery, Pat was there to lead and help.

Because of Pat's inspirational and effective leadership, members of the community, led by Rich Crowley, have spearheaded an effort to remember her and inspire in others Pat's spirit of volunteerism and community leadership. I looked up to Pat because she was a doer, not just a talker. It's important that young people - and all of us, young and old, for that matter - have strong servant leaders like Pat to look to as role models, and I am proud to support this initiative.

The first idea that was floated was to add Pat's name to the Almaden Community Center, given her role in ensuring that the new Almaden Library would also have a community center to serve as a focal point for an area of the City that had long lacked a gathering She also place. ensured that the project was accelerated ahead of other projects funded by a voter-

approved bond measure.

I convened a group of community leaders to discuss this first proposal. After a healthy discussion, it became clear that a name change for the center was not something around which people would unify. Because of the strong sense of community identity the Center provides, some felt that naming the Center for a spe-

> cific person may dilute this sense of community or diminish the contributions of other community leaders.

> Rich Crowley took these concerns to heart and went about brainstorming other ideas for honoring Pat that would bring people together, as she would have wanted, and came up with an alternative which he discussed with Pat's family. I convened another meeting of community leaders at which Rich presented his new idea: honoring Pat through improvements to the Almaden Community Center entry area – creating a welcoming space near the outdoor entrance that would incorporate a statue of Pat, so that she would be there to welcome people to the facility, and describing the story of what she did and

why others would do well to follow her example in building the Almaden community. The concept was inspired by a model that exists here in Almaden: the bench and statue of Officer Jeffrey Fontana in Martin Fontana Park, near the dog park entry. Rich provided color photos with this example.

This new idea was warmly embraced by the group as, in the words of Almaden Senior Association President Bill Hubka, "something everyone can be proud of that adds to the community and doesn't detract.'

Bill Baron noted that the welcome plaza improvements would be privately funded and also presented the idea to establish a \$100,000 endowment to set aside money for children's programs at the library. This legacy would benefit children and have Pat's memory honored over the long term. This would also be privately funded, with no City money involved.

I am excited to be a part of this effort to honor a great community leader.



Karen actively volunteers with the local disaster aid response team, ski patrol, Girls on the Run, coaching soccer, and teaching first aid. She adaptively does mar-





# **'District 10 April Cleanup Challenge' brings out dedicated community volunteers**

In honor of Earth Day 2018, the City of San Jose held a city-wide clean up competition among the Council Districts throughout the month of April.

The question is will Almaden District 10 become the winning San Jose City Council District?

The winning district will be determined by the district with the most participating volunteers. If District 10 wins, Councilmember Khamis will host a Volunteer Appreciation Pancake Breakfast and present the community with the winners' trophy.

#### April cleanup activities

Last month, a dedicated group of 27 volunteers showed up for the first Action Plan Workday at Guadalupe Oak Grove Park (GOGP).

They hauled more than five truckloads of green debris, removing invasive weeds from the soft, wet earth. The horehound plants in the driveway circle were removed, as well as the weeds near the restroom. This spot was a focus area due to its proximity to the well-used facilities.

Another group of volunteers went hunting for baby Blue Oaks. The search crew found more than 100 new Blue Oaks that they marked for protection. The Blue Oaks are native to the park and are very slow growing, so they easily get choked out by invasive species.

Volunteers from the community spruced up the Almaden Community Center, pulling weeds, spreading mulch, and trimming plants.

More than 30 volunteers at Jeffrey Fontana Park on April 10th were followed by 23 volunteers at TJ Martin Park on Wednesday April 11th. Middle and high school volunteers were joined by Boy Scouts and Orchard Supply Hardware employees to spread 100 bags of mulch in the gardens facing McAbee, pull lots of weeds and trim huge stacks of green waste from native shrubs and trees along Thorntree Drive. Four hours of hard work resulted in healthy, groomed gardens and a much improved environment for the McAbee end of the park.

Student volunteers took on TJ Martin Park

on Burchell, pulling weeds, trimming trees and shrubs, and spreading mulch that had been placed in the park 18 months ago. The Martin-Fontana Parks Association (MFPA) appreciated all the volunteer help.

Sue Bowling from Adopt-a-Park who made sure the work was completed correctly, tools were kept neat and accounted for, and who kept the volunteers going with her humor. Pat Pizzo showed the youth how to prune and trim and how to tell invasive species from desirable native species.

The group appreciated learning so much about the plants by sending an appreciation letter. Be sure to notice the newly-refreshed areas of TJ Martin and Fontana Parks as you walk through. The MFPA invites you to join them on May 19 for their annual Heart of the Park fundraiser event to see how nice the parks look.


On April 28, 29 volunteers painted the big wall on Branham Lane that runs from Vistapark Drive to near Snell Avenue with the work completed in only four and a half hours!. Once again, Orchard Supply Hardware was out in force working side-by-side with residents to tackle the biggest wall in D10 painted so far – over 16,000 square feet!

The Great American Litter Pickup was held at Pioneer High School on April 21 where tools and supplies were available so that volunteers could pick up litter around the Blossom Hill area. Volunteers picked up 129 bags of litter along Blossom Hill Road from Meridian to Snell, around the VTA stations, and several of the shopping centers, including Oakridge Mall. Other areas in D10 include shopping areas in Almaden and Santa Teresa. Thanks go out to the Chinese Church in Christ South Valley, and the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints who each sent out large groups of volunteers.

There were many other volunteer efforts throughout the month of April that are not included here but officially we had 545 total volunteers for the month! Almaden and District 10 residents regularly pickup trash on their walks, or organize cleanups, without any fanfare. It's this dedication and care for the community that makes this such a great place to live. Thank you everyone!

Addressing food insecurities for older adults

→ tudents from San Jose State University and CommUniverCity came together at the Roosevelt Community Center to bring exposure to several nonprofit programs in San Jose, on April 25.

Of these programs, one standout was the Senior Bites Network.

Senior Bites is a new program in partnership with Catholic Charities of Santa Clara County that seeks to build relationships between the senior community and local restaurants. Senior Bites' objective is to reach out to local restaurants and collaborate with them to create healthier and more affordable meal options that address the nutritional needs of the senior community.

Senior Bite's development originated from the fact that many other senior meal programs in San Jose forces participants into memberships with annual fees and requirements that leave many seniors out of the picture. Senior Bites, on the other hand, not only encourages seniors to foster healthy lifestyles and support local business, but anyone over the age of 60 can walk into a location that has partnered up with Senior Bites and expect affordable options.

According to Kevin Nad, Senior Bites coordinator, the program was created after he surveyed seniors who trekked to the Roosevelt Community Center from all parts of San Jose for a daily, affordable, and nutritious meal.

"The idea behind the program came from Catholic Charities of Santa Clara County," said Nad. "The project was created in order to address the issues of food insecurities for older adults as well as supporting local businesses in San Jose.'

The menu includes mouth-watering options and the satisfaction of supporting San Jose local businesses all for less than \$8 per meal. # THE WISDOM TOOTH **Un-bridging a bridge**

Q: I have a three-tooth bridge on my upper right that was made to replace one missing tooth. One of the support teeth which had a root canal years ago, has now fractured, and needs to be removed due to a severe infection of the bone next to the root of the tooth.

My dentist wants to remove the tooth and then make a four-tooth bridge to replace, my now two missing teeth. I don't like the idea that he said this will require "capping" another tooth by drilling it down and will create four connected teeth in a row with no way to floss. My husband, a retired engineer, says "you can't support such a long span of bridge, with only two supports on either end; you need support in the middle". Doris in Los Gatos

A: Good call by your husband. His principles are correct and your mention of the inability to floss a fourcrown bridge is spot on. A recent case that presented us with the same issue allowed us to remove the cracked tooth, fill the socket and the defect with synthetic bone graft material called Osteogen, place an implant and place three floss-able, permanent single crowns.



# **Overpassed**

Continued from page 1 for hair products.

"I wish there were more tents," says Casey. "There aren't enough and the ones we have are so thin, wind and water gets through them. We had two hospital blankets and put on all the clothes we had, but we were still frozen. We need better tents and sleeping bags. The nights are cold."

"When we finish handing out items and meeting people, there's a great feeling of accomplishment knowing you have brightened someone's day by being there," Watkins says. "It's a great feeling because you're helping people with things that they really need as well as giving them hope. Most just want someone to talk to. When I told one homeless man that we had a shirt and a jacket for him, he was shocked that someone took the time to do this for him."

Through the years, Watkins and Lam have gotten to know many homeless by name. They came to understand that many are regular people who had difficult things happen to them and/or can't make ends meet. Through the city's efforts, some of the people living on the street have found housing, but others are still waiting. Some have mental illnesses and/or prefer living in a community outdoors.

One woman, Valerie, has created a village under the overpass and shares what little she has. She offers a place to rest and some water to anyone walking by. "They're so poor," says Watkins, "but extremely rich with their hearts. Their attitude is whatever I have is yours."

Lam describes George as a gentle soul. "It's a pleasure walking around the neighborhood with him," says Lam. "Wherever he goes, restaurant owners and residents wave at him."

George is well known for repairing bicycles, which he donates to other homeless people. "After a rainstorm, the streets are wet, and water gets in their worn-out shoes giving them foot sores," says Lam, "so bikes are helpful to ride on and for carrying their things. George is amazing. He helps people through sharing his skills and material possessions."

About a month ago, two police officers came to the encampment and asked for George by name. They had heard about him through the community and offered him subsidized housing: even though it's only 500 square feet, George calls it his castle

"George and Valerie are community leaders," says Lam. "They give their time and possessions and influence people in positive ways. When you give out love you receive it in return."

Casey came to San Jose from Mississippi. "Down South, everyone is very hospitable," she says, "but out here, no one cares about the homeless." Interestingly, it was the homeless community that came to her rescue. "When I got off the bus, I had on shorts and a tank top and it was October. Within 10 minutes, people were bringing me sweats and shoes. I was like, 'You're homeless, too,' and they were like, 'No, girl, don't worry about it.' Everyone helps each other down here." When Casey finds work and gets paid, she pays back their kindness. "I come down here, and I'm like, 'Hey bros, you guys take care of me. Let's eat!' The homeless community here is so big and so helping.'

"When I hear the life stories and struggles people face," says Breck, "I think they just need someone to listen. It's an amazing thing to see the support they have for each other. It's a strong, caring community"

Richard, a blind homeless man who hangs out at the minimart, is another generous person. One day, after speaking with Breck, Richard told him that although he'd like to talk with him more, there were others who needed Breck's time as well, and he should talk with them.

One of the Overpassed goals is to change how residents view the homeless. "People pretend they're not even there," says Watkins, "but taking a moment to care might provide the catalyst to someone taking the next step, like checking into an addiction clinic."

Breck sees homelessness as a situation with some people struggling with depression and others with addiction. "The wealthy have ways to deal with addiction," he says. "The homeless need help. We're trying to bring them help and hope."

"People see the homeless holding up signs asking for money and think they're lazy and should be working or that they're addicted to drugs and alcohol," says Lam, "but a lot of the time, mental illness brings people down. George lost his job as a mechanic trying to help a lady who was financially challenged pass a smog check. She reported him for fudging it. He had previously lost his son in a gang shooting (his son wasn't in a gang) which resulted in his wife suffering from depression and

they're getting divorced. After he lost his | job, he found himself on the street. It could have happened to anyone."

"We spend a lot of time under the overpasses," says Breck. "A block away from SAP and Adobe and other high-tech companies, they're sleeping next to the river. It's pretty scary at night: the rats come up from the river and crawl all over them." It also gets rough in St. James Park at night after people have been drinking. "The nights are full of tension," says Breck. "You never know what will happen."

On a recent visit, some of the men remembered them from last time and stopped to say, "Thank you." Sometimes, homeless people approached the bench where the merchandise was placed. Other

times, Lam and Watkins approached them.

"Hi, buddy," Lam to veteran John Anthony, a.k.a. Big John. "How are you doing? What do you need?" He chose a tshirt and a pair of socks and went to sit on the bench with his "broth-

"I'm the real deal down here," says Big John. "I spoke with the mayor. The mayor wants to help this homeless thing. Now I have a home."

After receiving congratulations, Big John turns serious. "We need people to care," he says. "You don't know what it's like 'til you live it. Out of 63 people I said, 'Good morning' to, only four replied or even looked at me.'

The long-term goal of The Overpassed is to raise funding as well as awareness to make a greater impact. They recently created a Facebook page and plan to create a webpage of success stories and eventually become a nonprofit corporation. Lam hopes that once people know about the needs of the homeless, their hearts will go out to them and they'll want to help those who need it most.

"I want to encourage people to get back on their feet and make them feel that they're not alone," says Watkins. "That's what The Overpass is all about."
