

Praying for Unity – National Day of Prayer in Laurel/Jones County

With the theme of "Unity," thousands celebrated the 2018 National Day of Prayer across the nation Thursday, May 3. The day began in the Laurel/Jones County area with a unifying Prayer Breakfast at Southeastern Baptist College, where several leaders of different Christian denomination gathered to pray for our country and our local community. The breakfast was followed at noon by another gathering for prayer at the steps of the Jones County Courthouse.

As guests arrived they were greeted with music by a composite praise band consisting of musicians from several churches. Dr. Scott Carson, president of Southeastern Baptist College, welcomed all to the college, and the "National Anthem" was sung by Emily Taylor followed by the Pledge of Allegiance to the American flag and to the Christian flag. The invocation was given by Dr. Cary Kimbrell with Bethlehem Baptist Church. Major Bert Lind, commanding officer of the Salvation Army, read scriptures from the Bible found in Ephesians 4:3-1 and 4:31-32. Pastor Estuardo Marroquin gave a prayer for our community, Pastor Jeff Reich from St. John's Episcopal Church prayed for our first responders, Pastor James Johnson Hill from Agape Church prayed for our

military, Pastor Leander Bridges of Spring Hill Missionary Baptist Church prayed for our government leaders and Pastor Luke Ponder of First Trinity Presbyterian Church prayed for our country. Following the prayers, special music was performed by

Sheree Ishee from Life Church.

The guest speaker for the breakfast was Representative Donnie Scoggins, who spoke of the importance as Christians to live in unity. After summarizing the story of Daniel being thrown in the Lion's Den for

refusing to stop praying to God, Scoggins said, "What does that have to do with unity and what does that have to do with us? So many times in today's society many people look for the faults of others, perhaps due to jealousy. And, at other times it seems that people are feeling entitled or empowered to say and do things in whatever way they want, even though the words may be hurtful to others. When they do this they create situations where individuals are inappropriately wronged or hurt by their comments and actions. No, it's not necessarily the lion's den but sometimes you may feel that you have been emotionally thrown to the lions." He said too often we as Christians get caught up in tearing each other down rather working together to build each other up. "I think we can all agree that this is a strategy that Satan uses to destroy the church, and we must resist this," stated Scoggins. He continued saying that as Christians we are called to live in unity and by living in unity we glorify God. "On the last night of the life of Jesus, he prayed a prayer that I think Christians should keep in mind and at the forefront. Jesus knowing that it was his last day on earth prayed for his followers. He did not pray for their success, nor their hap-

A pair of Pine Belt area high school teachers have been recognized for their mentorship in materials science as winners of the William Dahlgren Teacher of Excellence Award through the Society for the Advancement of Material and Process Engineering (SAMPE). James Brownlow, polymer science teacher at Hattiesburg High School, and Rebecca Hooper, chemistry teacher at Laurel High School, were presented the honors by representatives from The University of Southern Mississippi's School of Polymer Science and Engineering. Both were part of the school's National Science Foundation Research Experience for Teachers (RET) program.

The William Dahlgren Teacher of Excellence Award recognizes outstanding teachers in kin-

at Laurel High, said that receiving the award was especially humbling since her students were on hand for the presentation.

"Often as teachers we work tirelessly and in the background to give our students valuable learning experiences that lead to their success and to be recognized for that hard work is extremely encouraging," she said. "I am also aware that there are many other very deserving teachers out there, and I am truly blessed to be highlighted by the SAMPE Foundation with the Teacher of Excellence Award."

Brownlow has taught for 31 years in the Mississippi school system with the past 16 being spent at Hattiesburg High. He currently teaches polymers I and polymers II classes. "Second Wind for Travis" – A Fight Against CF

"He works until he can't," exclaimed Jennifer Lindsey in describing her nephew, Travis Roney, who has been living with Cystic Fibrosis since being diagnosed at age five months. But, it's going to be a long time before Travis will be able to go back to work in the oilfield. At age 29, his lungs are so damaged that he is in need of a double lung transplant. Although recent CF drugs helped his sister, Sara, who was diagnosed at 18 months old along with Travis, they didn't work as well for Travis. His lung function has been decreasing significantly in the past year. His latest lung function test at Tulane showed his lungs functioning at only 26 percent.

According to the CF Foundation, Cystic fibrosis is an inherited chronic disease that affects the lungs and digestive system of about 30,000 children and adults in the United States (70,000 worldwide). More than 1,000 new cases are diagnosed each year. In 1989 a team of Foundation-supported scientists discovered the defective CF gene and its protein product CFTR, which produces tenacious, sticky mucus in the lungs that clogs the lungs and leads to life-threatening lung infections and obstructs the pancreas and stops natural enzymes from helping the body breakdown and absorb food.

"It's an invisible disease," said Lindsey. She added people don't see what's going on in their body or what they have to do to fight to stay alive every day. They don't see the hour-long regimen (or longer) of taking medications, doing breathing treatments, and having to take different enzymes to help digest food and absorb nutrients at every meal. They don't see it taking all the energy you can muster just to get out of the bathtub and having a coughing spell halfway out. "Sara has a baby now. Never in a million years did we imagine that would happen."

Sara said she attributes her increased lung function and overall health improvement to the CF drug Orkambi, which was approved by the FDA in 2015, that both she and Travis have been on. "It was a miracle drug for me. Within two weeks my lung function went from 30 to 45. Two weeks ago it was at 47 percent," exclaimed Sara. "Just the fact that I can walk around and hold my baby is the best thing," exclaimed Sara. "Without it (the CF

drug) I wouldn't be able to be with him. I never thought it was possible and now he's here. Now I can be an active mother and not just watch from the sidelines or have him visit me in the hospital. Because that is definitely how it would have been. But, it didn't help Travis like it did me." With tears running down her face she added, "It's not fair," proving how difficult dealing with CF is for the entire family.

"Since January of last year, Travis has been in the hospital seven times and on antibiotics at home nine times," said Travis' and Sara's mom, Becky Pitts Roney. "He should have been in the hospital for all those times, but he refused to go." "Travis is not on the lung transplant list yet," said Becky. She said Ochsner Medical Center in New Orleans, where Travis' transplant team is located, has confirmed Travis' need for a double-lung transplant, and the initial testing and consultation has been done. They are to go back in August for two days of evaluations and testing procedures and expect to be put on the list then. Sara said according to the doctors at Ochsner, at the rate his lungs are declining now, Travis only has two to three years to live without having

the transplant. The latest CF drug, Symdeko, which was released in February, has given them a glimmer of hope and is slowing the lung decline a bit, but doctors say the damage is already done and the double-lung transplant is inevitable.

A benefit co-ed softball tournament was held in Sandersville Saturday, April 28 to help raise money for the long road ahead for the Roney family. The tournament was organized by Michael and Faye Hiatt. Faye is Travis' half-sister. Travis coached the Wannabes team during their first couple games. He also raffled off a Shetland pony, which was won by Stormy Riels.

Although very appreciative of the help he's getting from people he doesn't even know, his mother said Travis doesn't like all the attention and tries to downplay the seriousness of the situation. "All he wants to do is go back to work. He loves working in the oilfield," said Becky.

One of Travis' CF friends from Waynesboro made a special trip to the softball tournament Saturday to show her support to Travis. Erin Knight, 21, received a doublelung transplant over seven years ago and is doing fine. She and her mother, Stephanie Knight, came to give the Roneys support and

help answer any questions they may have. "We wanted to let them know it's going to be okay," said Stephanie. She told them of several people of different ages who have survived the double-lung transplant.

Because people with CF have a higher risk of attracting infection from other people, especially each other, when Travis and Erin had their picture taken together, they were standing at least six feet apart. "Even with the lung transplant, Erin still must practice the six-foot rule," exclaimed Stephanie.

"Another fear is with your lung function being so low like Travis', especially during flu season, your immune system has been obliterated with all the antibiotics you have to take that if he were to get the flu, it would probably kill him," said Sara. She added, "He's going to be limited after the lung transplant, too. He won't be able to go back to work in the oilfield because you can't be in the public for fear of getting any kind of infection."

"We're more dangerous to them than they are to us," added Jennifer. "Even though they cough often, they are not contagious. They're just trying to clear their lungs of the mucus build up."

To help the family handle the upcoming expenses, Jennifer has set up a "Second Wind" Facebook page @2ndwind4travis. Another benefit, Second Wind Sporting Clay Shoot, is scheduled for June 15 and will take place in Meridian at Camp Binachi. T-Shirt Sponsors are needed by May 18 for the clay shoot. A GoFundMe account has also been set up at www.gofundme.com/2ndwind4travis. Also. there is a "Benefit Account Travis Roney" set up for Travis at Community Bank in Laurel as well.



Effective treatment enables those individuals with mental health conditions to recover and lead full, productive lives. Each business, school, government agency, healthcare provider, organization and citizen shares the burden of mental health problems and has a responsibility to promote mental wellness and support prevention efforts."

In signing the proclamation, Magee calls upon the citizens, government agencies, public and private institutions, businesses and schools in Laurel/Jones County to recommit our community to increasing awareness and understanding of mental health.

South Central Behavioral Health Services provide numerous services to the community, which steps members of the community can take to protect their mental health. These services include individual and family counseling through providers Dr. Amandeep Singh, Carrie Foxworth (PMHNP), Brett Cutrer (LPC), and Rhonda Smith (LCSW) at the South Central Behavioral Health Clinic. You can contact that clinic at 601-426-9614.

Other services available include an inpatient program at the Recovery Center at South Central, which provides a 5-7 day alcohol and drug detoxification to secure support through the withdrawal phase for those 18 years and older. For more information about this program, call 601-426-4381.

Progressions is an outpatient service that allows individuals to receive mental healthcare through intensive services. It is located on Highway 15 North and allows those 18 years and older to participate in psychosocial group therapy with supportive counseling under the psychiatric care of Dr. Singh. 


