



'Extra Help' Program **Helps Seniors With Their Medication Costs**

Dear Savvy Senior,

Are there any special Medicare programs that help seniors with their medication costs? My 74-year-old mother, who lives primarily on her Social Security, takes several high-priced drugs that sap her income even with her Medicare drug plan.

Looking for Assistance

Dear Looking,

Yes, there's a low-income subsidy program called Extra Help that can assist seniors on a tight budget with paying for their premiums, deductible and co-payments in their Medicare (Part D) prescription drug plan.

Currently around 10 million people are receiving this subsidy, but another two million may qualify for it and don't even realize it. They're missing out on hundreds, maybe thousands, of dollars in savings each year.

Changes in the law make it easier than ever to qualify for the Extra Help program. Even if your mom applied and didn't qualify before, she may be eligible now. The amount of additional assistance she would receive depends on her income and assets. If she qualifies for help, she'll pay no more than \$3.35 for a generic drug and \$8.35 for a brand-name drug in 2018.

To get the subsidy, your mom's assets can't be more than \$14,100 (or \$28,150 for married couples living together). Bank accounts, stocks and bonds count as assets, but her home, vehicle, personal belongings, life insurance and burial plots do not.

Also, your mom's monthly income can't be more than \$1,538 (or \$2,078 for married couples). If your mom supports a family member who lives with her, or lives in Alaska or Hawaii, her income can be higher.

In addition, the government won't count any money if your mom receives help for household expenses like food, rent, mortgage payments, utilities and property

How To Apply

There are three ways to apply for Extra Help: online at SSA.gov/prescriptionhelp; by calling Social Security at 800-772-1213; or by visiting her local Social Security office.

The application form is easy to complete, but you'll need your mom's Social Security number and information about her bank balances, pensions and investments. Social Security will review her application and send her a letter within a few weeks letting you know whether she qualifies.

If your mom doesn't qualify for Extra Help, she may still be able to get help from a state pharmacy assistance program or a patient assistance program. Visit BenefitsCheckUp.org and click on "Medications" to search for these programs.

Other Medicare Assistance

If your mom is eligible for Extra Help, she may also qualify for help with her other Medicare expenses through her state's Medicare Savings Program.

State Medicaid programs partner with the federal government, so income and asset qualifications vary depending on where she lives. Medicare Savings Programs will pay her entire Medicare Part B premium each month. Some also pay for Part B coinsurance and copayments, depending on her income. Contact your mom's state Medicaid office to determine if she qualifies for benefits in her state.

You can also get help through her State Health Insurance Assistance Program (SHIP), which provides free one-on-one Medicare counseling in person or over the phone. To locate a SHIP counselor in your area, visit ShiptaCenter.org or call the eldercare locator at 800-677-1116.





I lost my wallet and it had my license, social security card and insurance card in it. I am very concerned that someone will "steal my identity" and ruin my credit. If someone opens accounts in my name do I have to pay those bills? What do I do?

Sherry Tuscumbia, AL

First, get your credit report. You can get one free credit report a year through AnnualCreditReport.com and make sure that no one has established any

accounts that do not belong to you.

Remember that banks are required to recognize your signature and not pay a check that has been forged. BUT, you are required to go over your monthly statement and notify the bank quickly for them to be required to put the money back in your account. You also have to

promise to prosecute the person who stole the money and you really only get to invoke this protection one time. If someone you allow in your house on a regular basis has stolen a check, the law is that the bank is only liable the first time. After you know that someone who comes in your house that has stolen a check, it is your responsibility to make sure they do not steal checks and it is also your responsibility to pay for the checks if they do steal them.

Look over your credit card statements carefully to make sure no unauthorized charges have been made.

I like the idea of a company like Lifelock that monitors your credit. They have different programs at different costs that monitor your credit and notify you if someone opens a new account in your name. I recently looked into this for a client and the top level of service was \$349.00 a year and it was payable monthly if you so chose.

My advice would be to hire a company such as Lifelock to monitor your credit and help you if you had a problem. That may be expensive but it sure would help you get a good night's sleep.

Obviously, if a credit card was stolen you would notify the credit card company immediately to freeze the credit card and hopefully help in tracking down anyone who had been using it.



our in-home wireless networks which may eliminate the need for your own wireless network in your home. It will also offer super-low latency ("latency" is the time it takes to send a request from your computer to a website, then have the website send you packets of information) which will become super-important when our cars all talk to each other and surgeons operate on our brains from thousands of miles away. 5G will also have ultra-high capacity which means unlimited data for evervone.

One of the hurdles of 5G is that it operates in the millimeter wave spectrum (frequencies that fall roughly between microwaves and visible light). This spectrum can carry a lot more information than our current microwave technology. However, it can't travel as far and doesn't penetrate walls

and buildings very well. As a result, we will need lots more "towers" that will probably be in the form of little antennas on every light pole or mounted on buildings everywhere.

Carriers in the US are targeting 2020 for widespread launch but it's going to take up to 10 years before 5G actually matures. 5G is said to be the last generation since it has built-in expansion technologies that will offer incremental upgrades over the next few

Iran Deal End Sends the Right Message

n leaving the Iran nuclear deal after Tehran failed to fully account for its nuclear weapons program at the outset of the agreement, President Donald Trump has sent exactly the right message to North Korea. If Kim Jong-un desires peace, he must come clean on all of his

country's nuclear weapons. Otherwise, no deal.

In Trump's mind, no deal is better than a bad deal. In his book, "The Art of the Deal," he wrote, "The best thing you can do is deal from strength, and leverage is the biggest strength you can have. Leverage is having something the other guy wants. Or better yet, needs. Or best of all, simply can't do without." Trump adds, "Leverage: don't make deals without it."

Well, when it comes to foreign policy, President Donald Trump is quickly learning that the best leverage in negotiations is the possibility that the negotiations might fail, and there won't be a deal.

With a sure path to further sanctions or worse for North Korea, Trump is easing the alternate path for North Korea. Going after Iran helps.

Medicare Minute

"New Medicare Cards Coming 2"

Last week we discussed various aspects of the new Medicare cards CMS will be issuing. Some of the things we discussed were; what will be on the card, the removal of Social Security numbers and to beware of scams. This week we will give you "10 things to know about your new Medicare card". This information comes directly from a document produced by Medicare.gov.

1. Your card may arrive at a different time than your neighbor's. The cards for Alabama have not been mailed.

2. Once you get your new Medicare card, destroy your old card and start using your new card right away.

3. Only give your new Medicare number to your health care providers, pharmacists, your insurers, or people you trust to work with Medicare on your behalf.

4. Your card has a new number instead of your Social Security Number. This new number is unique to you.

5. Your new card will be paper.

6. Carry your new card with you and show it to your health care providers when you need care.

7. Your doctor knows new cards are coming and may ask vou for it when you need care.

8. If you forget your new card, you, your doctor or health care provider may be able to look up you Medicare Number online.

9. If you are in a Medicare Advantage Plan, your Medicare Advantage Plan ID card is your main card for Medicare, so you should still keep and use it when you need care. However, you may be asked to show your new Medicare card, so you should carry this card too.

10. If you don't get your new Medicare card by April 2019, call 1-800-MEDICARE.

Hopefully, the information we have provided the past 2 weeks will help clear up any confusion you may have about your new card. If you have any questions just give us a call.



Dear Dave,



They found another place to live, and they both work, but since the foreclosure my dad has been asking me for money on a regular basis. He tries to make me feel guilty, and he calls or asks me to come over to talk about it when my mom isn't home. He even asked for half of the bonus I received at work the other day. I know they need help, but I'm not sure what to do.

Dear Eli,

I can tell you love your parents, because you're looking for the best way to help them. I think your brain knows what to do, but your heart is having a hard time doing it.

The first thing you're going to have to accept is your father is being very manipulative right now. Put an end to these private meetings and phone calls once and for all. If he wants to talk, make sure he understands it will only happen with your mom in the room.

Second, understand there's nothing wrong with helping your folks get back on their feet. However, any financial help you give them should be temporary



in nature, and it should be a gift. Don't get involved in giving them money every month just because they raised you. That's not how this works. When you permanently subsidize someone, you take away their dignity. You also change their status, and compromise their ability to stand on their own two feet.

It's often difficult for parents to accept advice and suggestions from their own children, but it's for their own good. It is not unusual while driving down the highway to pass by a marker that is a memorial to someone who has lost his or her life at that location. I know that you have seen them, too. Most of the time it is a little cross-- often draped with a wreath or bow accompanied by a picture of the victim and date the accident happened.

Every time I see one of these there are certain thoughts that come to mind. First, I am reminded of the pain and emptiness that fill the hearts of those who

lost this person. There is nothing that cuts us quite as sharply nor as deeply as having to say good-bye to a loved one. All of us who have gone through this experience have no problem understanding the importance of these memorials to preserve the memories of those we love so much.

Secondly, I am reminded of the uncertainty of life. There is not a person on earth, regardless of age or anything else, who has a promise of tomorrow. The Bible teaches: "Come now, you who say, 'Today or tomorrow we will go to such and such a city, spend a year there, buy and sell, and make a profit'; whereas you do not know what will happen tomorrow. For what is your life? It is even a vapor that appears for a little time and then vanishes away. Instead you ought to say, 'If the Lord wills, we shall live and do this or that" (James 4:13-15). No one knows how he will leave this life or when, but with absolute certainty we all know that

Thirdly, I am reminded of how one event like this can change the lives of so many. Be it parent, child, sibling, spouse or friend, those who are left behind are never exactly the same again. In short, death is a life changing event. These little crosses continually remind us of that.

Finally, every time I see one of these little crosses, I cannot help but think of the larger one, namely, the one on which Jesus died. It memorializes a change in the history of the world! Jesus said of Himself, "And I, if I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all peoples to Myself. This He said, signifying by what death He would die" (John 12:32, 33).

Truly, the lives of all who are drawn to Him, will never be the same again! What a life-changer - - for the better!







We're pleased to present to you this year's Annual Quality Water Report. This report is designed to inform you about the quality water and services we deliver to you every day. Our constant goal is to provide you with a safe and dependable supply of drinking water. We want you to understand the efforts we make to continually improve the water treatment process and protect our water resources. We are committed to ensuring the quality of your water. Greenhill's water sources are two groundwater wells which draw from the Tuscumbia/Fort Payne Aquifer and purchased water from Florence Water & Sewer Department (50%). Florence water is supplied by surface water from the Tennessee River and the Cypress Creek. In addition, Florence Water Department pumps ground water from two wells in the Killen and Center Star areas in Lauderdale County, which is blended with the treated surface water sources. In the water provided to our customers (from Greenhill), Chlorine is added for disinfection purposes, Caustic Soda is added to raise pH levels of the water that will prevent it from being corrosive and Aqua Gold to produce a desirable water quality by raising the pH level to reduce corrosion and acidic conditions. In the water provided to our customers (from Florence), Chlorine is added for disinfection purposes, Fluoride for the prevention of tooth decay, lime to produce a desirable water quality by raising the pH level to reduce corrosion and acidic conditions, Potassium Permanganate to oxidize iron, and aid in taste and odor control, Poly Aluminum Chloride for turbidity removal and Alum for coagulation. Also Florence has added a new treatment process called the MIEX system as a simple solution for meeting U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) disinfection by-product (DBP) removal by employing a continuous ion exchange process. The Process removes dissolved organic carbon (DOC) allowing for improved drinking water quality and regulatory compliance. Greenhill Water & FPA and Florence Water & Sewer Department have implemented a Source Water Protection Plans. These plans provide more information such as potential sources of contaminations, which may affect our water source.

Cryptosporidium

Cryptosporidium is a microbial pathogen found in surface water throughout the U.S. Although filtration removes Cryptosporidium, the most commonly-used filtration methods cannot guarantee 100 percent removal. Ingestion of Cryptosporidium may cause cryptosporidiosis, an abdominal infection. Symptoms of infection include nausea, diarrhea and abdominal cramps. Most healthy individuals can overcome the disease within a few weeks. However, immune-compromised individuals, infants and small children, and the elderly are at greater risk of developing lifethreatening illness. We encourage immune-compromised individuals to consult their doctor regarding appropriate precautions to take to avoid infection. Cryptosporidium must be ingested to cause disease, and it may be spread through means other than drinking water. We currently monitor for Cryptosporidium and have had none detected

GENERAL INFORMATION

The sources of drinking water (both tap water and bottled water) include rivers, lakes, streams, ponds, reservoirs, springs, and wells. As water travels over the surface of the land or through the ground, it dissolves naturally-occurring minerals and in some cases, radioactive material, and can pick up substances resulting from the presence of animals or from human activity.

If present, elevated levels of lead can cause serious health problems, especially for pregnant women and young children. Lead in drinking water is primarily from materials and components associated with service lines and home plumbing. The Greenhill water & Fire Protection Authority is responsible for providing high quality drinking water, but cannot control the variety of materials used in plumbing components. When your water has been sitting for several hours, you can minimize the potential for lead exposure by flushing your tap for 30 seconds to 2 minutes before using water for drinking or cooking. If you are concerned about lead in your water, you may wish to have your water tested. Unregulated contaminants are those for which EPA has not established drinking water standards. The purpose of unregulated contaminant monitoring is to assist EPA in determining the occurrence of unregulated contaminants in drinking water and whether future regulation is warranted. Based on a study conducted by the ADEM with the approval of the EPA, a statewide waiver for the monitoring of Asbestos and Dioxin was issued. Thus, monitoring for these contaminants was not required.

Pyongyang has been driven to the table and now big concessions are being seen. During the historic

During the historic meeting last month between North Korean leader Kim Jong-un and South Korean President Moon Jae-in, the two agreed in principle to finally end the Korean War after 68 years and to pursue denuclearization of the peninsula.

Secretary of State, Mike Pompeo, has returned to the U.S. with three American hostages that had been held by North Korea.

Additionally, a date and location have now been set for Trump and Kim to meet to discuss matters further.

All the while, Trump has reminded the world that if it looks like there's a bad deal or North Korea is unwilling to move forward with disarmament, he'll walk away from the table.

Trump's positioning appears to be working so far. Thanks to withdrawing from the Iran nuclear deal, North Korea can observe what will happen if it does not deal honestly with the U.S. Upon exiting the deal, Trump used his legal authority granted by Congress to enact severe sanctions on Iran.

Other examples can be seen with Trump withdrawing from the Paris climate accords and the Trans-Pacific Partnership. Or using the threat of his steel and aluminum tariffs to achieve big concessions from trade partners including South Korea, Canada, and Mexico.

When President Trump ran for office in 2016, he promised that he would bring his skills as a shrewd business negotiator to the table. Now he's proving it. This is a President who understands how to use American power in an effective manner to protect national security and U.S. interests.

After it was revealed that Iran had lied about the extent of its nuclear weapons program, Trump had little choice but to terminate the agreement.

President Trump is right to be cautious. North Korea has made false signals before to get sanctions lifted only to return to its saber rattling. However, this time can be different because now there's a predictable set of rules Trump has put in place for Kim to follow. Kim can take the path of Iran, and there will be more sanctions or worse. Or he can follow the path of peace, which will surely lead to prosperity

surely lead to prosperity.

The choice is Kim's.

However, with Trump there reminding him of the very fearsome consequences of insisting on keeping his nuclear weapons program, the odds he will make the right one are rising. Peace could be at hand.



Too Late For Our Nation?

On 17 July 1951 I enlisted in the army as a 17-yearold, knowing that the nation was at war in Korea and I would probably be sent there. As it turned out I did not go to Korea during the war there but did three tours in Vietnam later.

The Army I served in for 20 plus years, 10 as a noncommissioned officer and 10 as a commissioned officer, in the combat branches of Infantry, Armor and Special Forces, was always fighting communism or training for war against communist nations, primarily the Soviet Union.

When I led a tank platoon in Germany in the midfifties, we studied the Russian battle tank. I knew where to hit the T-34 tank to put its main gun out of action. Back then I would not have believed that in a few decades our national government would be under the control of those whose aim was to destroy our Republic as was the case under the Obama regime. I would not have believed that a man who boasted of voting for the head of the Communist Party USA for president of the nation would be the director of our Central Intelligence Agency.

I would not have believed that the God-given freedoms that our forefathers fought and sacrificed to secure, and many others in later wars gave their lives to defend, would be taken away--not by foreign nations, but by the three branches of our own government, ignoring or perverting the meaning of the Constitution.

My parents who have long been deceased would have labeled anyone who predicted that homosexuality would not only be accepted but celebrated with the blessing of our government as

As late as my retirement from the Army in 1972 no one could have convinced me that there would be a day when the military would designate days and months to celebrate homosexuality and other sexual perversions, and that anyone who expressed disagreement with the homosexual lifestyle and marriage would be punished. Neither would I have believed that Christian chaplains would be punished for speaking of the Lord Jesus Christ.

Although president Trump favors the support of religious freedom, holdovers in the Departments of Defense, Army, Navy and Air Force from the Obama anti-religious freedom regime, are still punishing Christians for their beliefs and practices.

As recently as 20 years ago I would not have believed that our federal Department of Education would approve homosexuals indoctrinating schoolchildren, even in elementary schools, into the homosexual lifestyle and encourage them to change their sexual orientation, while severely restricting their diets in school lunches to protect their health. "For the past 16 years, we've had a perfect USDA inspection every year," Jackson said. "They can come unannounced, and when they come, they typically say, 'Can we take pictures of your facilities and your lions to show other clients how to do this right?' We have a good legacy and history here of taking care of the habitat and the lions."

The campus enclosure is designed to facilitate a strict set of safety rules for both the Lion Crew and the lions.

"There's always a fence between the lions and the volunteers," saidJackson. "If we're working out here or inside, there are always two doors between us and the lions. The design is very safety-conscious.

The high-security night house is equipped with an alarm system that is not only connected to a thirdparty security company, but also to campus security. When the alarm sounds, officers are dispatched to the enclosure immediately to ensure that everything is as it should be.

The building is also equipped with specially-designed security features, concave mirrors, and extra locks.

"We have a number of redundant locks in the redundant locks in the building. We also have a tranquilizer rifle that the UNA police keep, and we periodically do taser training."

Volunteers must help the university ensure that USDA regulations are followed. All water inside the enclosure and the night

the enclosure and the night house is filtered and fresh. All plants inside the enclosure must be ensured to be safe for ingestion. Cleaning products the Lion Crew uses inside the night house must also be non-irritating and safe for animal consumption.

Every morning before the lions enter the enclosure, volunteers sweep the area to remove any debris or trash that may have been thrown over or pushed under the fencing overnight.

"We have to make sure everything is gone that the lions could choke on or get hurt on," Jackson said. "The volunteers are very diligent to make sure the grounds are good enough for the

lions to come out."
Following the example of zoos around the country, the Lion Crew provides enrichment for Leo III and Una through the purchase of toys made of heavy, the enclosure to play with their new presents. And just like human siblings, they engage in a yearly scuffle.

"They go straight for the toys," Jackson said. "Una will always start playing-she bats her toys around and will play and play. And it never fails that Leo will decide he wants what she

"They'll always put on a show. He goes after her toy and she lets him know he can't have it. Then he'll go over into the corner and pout for a while.'

Volunteers are also responsible for transporting the lions in the university's

games. Jackson says Leo III and Una enjoy the crowds.

"They love to go, ride, and watch people," she

For those interested in volunteering on the Lion Crew, it's important to understand the extensive education, vigilance, and safety precautions required for the job—not to mention the time. Still, Jackson said the volunteers who have cared for the lions over the years have done incredible work in spite of the job's

"It is truly a labor of love. We love what we do!

SOURCE WATER ASSESSMENT

In compliance with the Alabama Department of Environmental Management (ADEM), Source Water Assessment plans have been developed to help protect our water sources. The assessments include a susceptibility analysis, which classifies potential contaminants as high, moderate, or non-susceptible to contaminating the water source. The plans are available for review upon advance request.

Please help us make these efforts worthwhile by protecting our source water. Carefully follow instructions on pesticides and herbicides you use for your lawn and garden, and properly dispose of household chemicals, paints, and waste oil. We ask that all our customers help us protect our valuable water sources, which are the heart of our community, our way of life, and our children's futures.

MONITORING SCHEDULE

We routinely monitor for contaminants in your drinking water according to Federal and State regulations, using EPA approved methods and a State certified laboratory. The Alabama Department of

Environmental Management (ADEM) allows us to monitor for some contaminants less than once per year because the concentrations of these contaminants do not change frequently. The following table shows the most recent year of monitoring for these contaminant groups.

GENERAL INFORMATION

All drinking water, including bottled drinking water, may be reasonably expected to contain at least small amounts of some contaminants. The presence of contaminants does not necessarily indicate that water poses a health risk. MCL's, defined in a List of Definitions in this report, are set at very stringent levels. To understand the possible health effects described for many regulated constituents, a person would have to drink 2 liters of water every day at the MCL level for a lifetime to have a one-in-a-million chance of having the described health effect.

The sources of drinking water (both tap water and bottled water) include rivers, lakes, streams, ponds, reservoirs, springs, and wells. As water travels over the surface of the land or through the ground, it dissolves naturally occurring minerals and radioactive material, and it can pick up substances resulting from the presence of animals or from human activity. Contaminants that may be present in source water include:

- · Microbial contaminants, such as viruses and bacteria, which may come from sewage treatment plants, septic systems, agricultural livestock operations, and wildlife.
- · Inorganic contaminants, such as salts and metals, which can be naturally-occurring or result from urban storm water runoff, industrial or domestic wastewater discharges, oil and gas production, mining, or farming.
- · Pesticides and herbicides, which may come from a variety of sources such as agriculture, storm water run-off, and residential uses.
- Organic chemical contaminants, including synthetic and volatile organic chemicals, which are by-products of industrial processes and petroleum production, and can also come from gas stations, urban storm water runoff, and septic systems.
- Radioactive contaminants, which can be naturally occurring or be the result of oil and gas production and mining activities.

In order to ensure that tap water is safe to drink, EPA prescribes regulations which limit the amount of certain contaminants in water provided by public water systems. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) regulations establish limits for contaminants in bottled water.

Some people may be more vulnerable to contaminants in drinking water than the general population. Immuno-compromised persons such as persons with cancer undergoing chemotherapy, persons who have undergone organ transplants, people with HIV/AIDS or other immune system disorders, some elderly, and infants can be particularly at risk from infections. People at risk should seek advice about drinking water from their health care

Based on a study conducted by ADEM with the approval of the EPA a statewide waiver for the monitoring of asbestos and dioxin was issued. Thus, monitoring for these contaminants

Your source water is also tested for pathogens, such as Cryptosporidium and Giardia. These pathogens can enter the water from animal or human waste. Lead in drinking water is rarely found in source water but is primarily from materials and components associated with service lines and home plumbing. Your water system is responsible for providing high quality drinking water but cannot control the variety of materials used in plumbing components.

If present, elevated levels of lead can cause serious health problems, especially for pregnant women and young children. Use only water from the cold-water tap for drinking, cooking, and especially for making baby formula. Hot water is more likely to cause leaching of lead from plumbing materials. When your water has been sitting for several hours, you can minimize the potential for lead exposure by flushing your tap for 30 seconds to 2 minutes before using water for drinking or cooking. These recommended actions are very important to the health of your family.

Lead levels in your drinking water are likely to be higher if:

- Your home or water system has lead pipes, or
- Your home has faucets or fittings made of brass which contains some lead, or Your home has copper pipes with lead solder and you have naturally soft water, and
- Water often sits in the pipes for several hours.

If you are concerned about lead in your water, you may wish to have your water tested. Information on lead in drinking water, testing methods, and steps you can take to minimize exposure is available from the Safe Drinking Water hotline or at www.epa.gov/safewater/lead.

Coliform Absent (ca)- Laboratory analysis indicates that the contaminant is not present.

Disinfection byproducts (DBPs)- are formed when disinfectants used in water treatment plants react with bromide and/or natural organic matter (i.e., decaying vegetation) present in the source water. Different disinfectants produce different types or amounts of disinfection byproducts for disinfection byproducts. Maximum Contaminant Level Goal-(mandatory language) The Goal (MCLG) is the level of a contaminant in drinking water below which there is no known or expected risk to health. MCLGs allow for a margin of safety

Maximum Residual Disinfectant Level (MRDL)-the highest level of a disinfectant allowed in drinking water Millirems per year (mrem/yr)-measure of radiation absorbed by the body.

Nephelometric Turbidity Unit (NTU)-a measure of the clarity of water. Turbidity in excess of 5 NTU is just noticeable to the average person.

Non-Detects (ND)- laboratory analysis indicates that the constituent is not present above detection limits of

lab equipment.

Not Reported (NR)-laboratory analysis, usually Secondary Contaminants, not reported by water system. EPA recommends secondary standards to

water systems but does not require systems to water systems but does not require systems to comply.

Parts per billion (ppb) or Micrograms per liter (µg/l)-one part per billion corresponds to one minute in 2,000 years, or a single penny in \$10,000,000.

Parts per million (ppm) or Milligrams per liter (mg/l)-one part per million corresponds to one minute in two years or a single penny in \$10,000.

Parts per quadrillion (ppq) or Picograms per liter (ppq) and per quadrillion corresponds to

(picograms/l)-one part per quadrillion corresponds to one minute in 2,000,000,000 years, or a single penny

one finition in \$10,000,000,000,000.

Parts per trillion (ppt) or Nanograms per liter (nanograms/l)-one part per trillion corresponds to one minute in 2,000,000 years, or a single penny in

\$10,000,000,000.

Picocuries per liter (pCi/L)-picocuries per liter is a measure of the radioactivity in water.

RAA-Running annual average Standard Units (S.U.)-pH of water measures the water's balances of acids and bases and is affected by temperature and carbon dioxide gas. Water with less than 6.5 could be acidic, soft, and corrosive. A pH greater than 8.5 could indicate that the water is hard.
Treatment Technique (TT)- a required process intended to reduce the level of a contaminant in

drinking water.

Variances & Exemptions (V&E)-State or EPA permission not to meet an MCL or a treatment technique under certain conditions.
