


Donna Jones named 2017 REALTOR of the Year

JCJC Lady Bobcats claim national softball championship

CLINTON - Jones County Junior College had finished runnerup three times in the NJCAA Division II National Tournament.

But the fourth time was the charm for the Lady Bobcats. JCJC crushed Phoenix College (Arizona) 18-2 in the championship game here Saturday afternoon at Traceway Park.

Not only was it JCJC's first national title in fast-pitch softball, it was also the first national title in the sport for an MACJC school.

"I'm so happy for our kids, our program, our school and our administration," said ninth-year head coach Chris Robinson, who has guided JCJC to six national tournament appearances in seven years. "When we started back in August, I said if they bought in, we would have a chance to play on the third Saturday in May and they lived up to it.

"I'm very thankful for those 18 kids and our three coaches."

JCJC was oh so close winning it all last year, but they dropped an 8-7 heartbreaker to LSU-Eunice in the championship game.

Robinson said the sophomores on this year's team remembered that.

"They were here last year in this game and got beat on a walk-off squeeze bunt," he said. "For them to come in there this week and seize this moment – it's all them. Just a fantastic job by our players and coaches."

JCJC started off the season 33-1 but hit a bump in the road when they were swept at home by Itawamba on April 8.

They would not lose again, running off 21 straight victories, claiming their third straight MACJC and Region 23 titles, a national championship and ending up with a 54-3 record.

They dominated the national tournament, outscoring their opponents, 69-12, and belting 15 home runs in five games.

"What was strange about this year was that we started out really good in February and March," Robinson said. "After spring break, we struggled offensively. We could not find our rhythm.

"But when we started postseason, we started pitching and playing great defense and we really swung the sticks well. I don't know what it was, but they were really jacked up this week."

Sophomore centerfielder Kelsha Loftin (Mendenhall) had quite a week, capped off by a tremendous performance in the title game where she was 4-for-4 with two home runs, a double, a single and six RBIs and was named the tournament's Most Valuable Player.

"To finally do it, it just feels amazing because we work so hard each and every day," she said. "I'm just overwhelmed. It was a whole team effort. We just feed off of each other and when one person gets a hit, the next one wants to."

Loftin is also pleased to be a member of the first national championship team led by Robinson.

"It means the world to him," she said. "He has worked hard and for him to finally win it I am so happy and proud that I could be on the first team for him to do it."

Winning pitcher Karli Perque (Westwego, Louisiana) said being runnerup last year was a motivating factor.

"The amount of time and all of the hard work we put in to get here finally paid off," she said. "We got here last year and we got short, but we came through this year. We did this for everybody back home.

"We did not want to feel bad again and we wanted to go all the way this year. We came out this year and did what we had to do.It was an all-team effort."

Perque and Madison Burge (Harrison Central) were named to the All-Battery Team for the tournament, while shortstop Taylor Murray (Parklane Academy) was named Most Valuable Defensive Player. Third baseman Emily Robinson (Lafayette) was named All-Tournament Infield and Loftin was named All-Tournament Outfield. Chris Robinson was named Coach of the Tournament.

As far as the game itself, the suspense was over early.

JCJC sent 11 batters to the plate and scored seven runs in the bottom of the first inning.

Loftin led off with a bunt single and consecutive walks were issued to Murray, Robinson and Callie Venable (Clinton, Louisiana) to force in a run. Hallie Donald (Mooreville) followed with a two-run double. McKennah Sikes (Van Buren, Arkansas) walked and Gracie McCleskey (Caledonia) was hit by a pitch to load the bases.

Lofton then doubled to center to clear the bases and give Jones a 7-0 lead.

The Lady Bobcats went up 10-0 in the second.

Robinson led off with a double and Donald walked. Robinson stole third and scored on a throwing error. Sikes then blasted a two-run home run.

Loftin led off the bottom of the third with a home run into a grill beyond the leftfield fence to make it 11-0.

The Bears got on the board in the fourth when Tylor Gil walked and Cherish Paolinelli doubled her home.

The Lady Bobcats then ran the lead to 17-1 in the bottom of the fourth.

Donald walked to start the inning and Sikes blasted her fourth home run of the tournament to make it 13-1. Faith Denton (Northwest Rankin) was then hit by a pitch, McCleskey doubled and Simone McKinney (Harrison Central) followed with an RBI single. McCleskey would score on an error and Loftin followed with a two-run home run to right into a tent.

Phoenix scored its final run in the fifth when Kara Golden was hit by a pitch, McKenzie Whitten singled and Heather O'Kelly reached on a bunt single. Kaitlyn Dennis would hit into a fielder's choice, which scored Whitten.

The Lady Bobcats final run came in the sixth when Murray singled and Venable doubled her home.

Perque went the first four innings, gave up an unearned run, three hits, walked two and struck out three. She got the win to end the year at 24-2.

Donald pitched two innings, allowed one run and two hits. Burge pitched the final inning and retired all three batters she faced.

After Loftin's performance, Jones got two home runs and four RBIs from Sikes, a double and a single from Emily Robinson, doubles from Venable, Donald and McCleskey and singles from Murray and McKinney.

O'Kelly had two singles for the Bears with Paolinelli getting a double. Whitten and Haley Johnston added singles.

Hanna Krosky started and took the loss. She faced six batters and did not retire a Lady Bobcat. She allowed six runs, two hits and walked four. Kiana Carr pitched six innings, allowed 12 runs, 11 hits, walked six and struck out seven.

Phoenix ends the year at 52-9.

JCJC's SkillsUSA students headed to national competition

Twenty-four Jones County Junior College students went to Jackson to compete in the SkillsUSA state competition with eighteen students coming home with top honors. In June, the seven first-place winners will be headed to Louisville, Kentucky, for the National SkillsUSA competition. Among the winners, JCJC SkillsUSA Advisor, Ryan Hearn said is a group of students who boldly accepted the challenge to create a product in a new category, Engineering Design and Technology.

"This was a very challenging competition because students were required to develop an out-of-the-box solution to an everyday problem. They were responsible for the initial concept, design, modifications and preparation for state competition. I was very impressed with our group from JCJC taking first place in this new category," said Hearn.

JCJC students Justin Aultman of Saginaw, Michigan, McKenna Pippen of Seminary, and Derek Holder of Lucedale had to present their creation to a panel of judges that was made up a group of head engineers from the Nissan Plant in Canton, Mississippi. With their first place win, these young entrepreneurs hope to sell their hand-powered trash compactor and are working towards marketing the product.

"I think the judges liked the idea because there is nothing like it now on the market and it solves a problem that many can relate to," said Aultman, who came up with the idea. "I had an overflowing trashcan and I stuck my foot in the garbage can with baby diapers and all. Yeah, it was pretty gross. Our idea will solve that problem in the future."

The team believes they have set a high standard for future competitors in this cat-

egory, partly because they came prepared to the competition with a 3-D model of their invention.

"Aultman's team set the bar high and I look forward to future inventions by JCJC students. Overall, JCJC was well represented and trained for the state competition. The students handled themselves professionally and are excited to see what the next

level of competition will be like with students from across the nation," said Hearn.

Also headed to the national competition is Mayson Norton of Mobile, Alabama, after winning the Related Technical Math competition. Sarena Evans of Heidelberg earned first place honors in Commercial Baking, and Christopher Dukes of Stringer took home first place in Culinary Arts. Ben Smith of Quitman won first place honors in the Sheet Metal category at the state SkillsUSA contest. His instructor at JCJC, Thomas Johnson, is excited about Smith carrying on a winning tradition.

"In 2016 JCJC brought home the gold in the Sheet Metal category; in 2017 we earned third place; and we got first place honors this year. We are looking forward to continuing the winning streak and giving students the opportunity to excel in their careers. When the students win, I feel like I won too because, when I see students accomplish their goals it brings me great joy," said Johnson.

After only four months of training, Smith managed to build a three-foot transition elbow with a 90-degree angle for ductwork to precise measurements within seven hours. Johnson said Smith's skills are in high demand for those who can accept the challenge. "You have to practice measuring and pounding the sheet metal to the exact dimensions. It's all done by hand but I really enjoy the challenge. After graduation, it's nice to know I have a job waiting for me," said Smith.

The second and third place winners at the SkillsUSA State competition include Richard West of Petal who received second place in Welding Sculpture. Heather Williams of Petal earned second place in Power Equipment with David Jones of Sumrall and Cassandra Musgrove of Purvis earning second place in Esthetics. The JCJC Quiz Bowl team of Kevin Parkin of Petal, Warren Blackwell of Mt. Olive, Mason Wells of Raleigh, Jason Craven of Ellisville and Jaylon Hathorne of Bassfield earned second place. Third place honors were awarded to Austin Mullins of Ellisville in CNC Turning and Heidelberg's Halcyon Morgan took third place in the CNC Technician category.

The SkillsUSA National Competition will be held June 25 through 29, where Hearn said hundreds of student competitors are getting real-world experience and recognition for their skills.

Does God really expect me to love those that hate and gossip about me behind my back? Jesus said to him, "Love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind.' This is the first and great commandment. And thesecond is like it: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' On these two commandments hang all the Law and the Prophets." (Matthew 22: 37-40)

If someone slaps you on one cheek, turn to them the other also. If someone takes your coat, do not withhold your shirt from them. Give to everyone who asks you, and if anyone takes what belongs to you, do not demand it back. Do to others as you would have them do to you."

"If you love those who love you, what credit is that to you? Even sinners love those who love them. And if you do good to those who are good to you, what credit is that to you? Even sinners do that. And if you lend to those from whom you expect repayment, what credit is that to you? Even sinners lend to sinners, expecting to be repaid in full. But love your enemies, do good to them, and lend to them without expecting to get anything back. Then your reward will be great, and you will be children of the Most High, because he is kind to the ungrateful and wicked. Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful." 
