# School district seeks input

In the May edition of the Depot Dispatch my article outlined what the District has done since the passage of the last referendum in 2015. This referendum was for \$725,000 annually for four years, or through the 2018-19 school year. Updates were given on educational/curricular enhancements, increased student offerings, technological upgrades, staffing and many building/maintenance projects and improvements-including the new HVAC system in the high school and elementary buildings. The District was very pleased and proud that it not only met, but exceeded the goals outlined in the 2015 referendum. And as promised, in 2019, EL-GS will again be included in the very small minority of debt-free school districts.

The article also explained that due to the way the State's Revenue Limit formula works, the district will not be able to continue to do many improvements in the upcoming school year, the final year of the 2015 referendum. In fact, for the first time in the referendum period, we will need to use the revenue limit flexibility provided to help meet the District's annual regular budget expenses.

Overall, this is not due to increased spending, but rather it offsets the amount of revenue lost under the revenue limit formula the past years. This was exactly what the District had anticipated and planned for when the District prepared the 2015 referendum.

Next year (2018-19) will see an estimated \$525,000 decrease in revenue (approximately 10%), and it is projected to decrease another \$160,000 by 2019-20. This financial forecast has a major impact on the District's planning going forward. One positive effect to taxpayers from the District's decreased ability to raise revenue under the state funding formula is, even while supporting the \$725,000 referendum amount passed in 2015, the District's tax rate has decreased. As a school district, EL-G has the lowest tax mill rate in the county (\$7.19) and consistently ranks in

## Speed it up

(NOTE: This column is written by my husband, Richard since it is his story.)

In Carol's February column 'In A Quandary About Winter' she wrote about winter vacations but concluded we would just stay in Wisconsin and tolerate any snow or cold. But then we had an unexpected opportunity to rent a house in Green Valley (Tucson) Arizona.

# Art, work and life fused together

## Two Fish Gallery melds the best of all worlds for Elkhart's Robison

Imagine a space where a dream could come true.

A living space, an art gallery, a classroom to teach and a workspace—those were the things Patrick Robison was looking for just over 20 years ago.

His ability to imagine led to the realization of his goal right in downtown Elkhart Lake at Two Fish Gallery.

Back in 1997, when Robison's first marriage ended in divorce, he made a little list of the things he most would like to do with his life. "I knew that if I would ever own a property again, I would want to be a place where I could live, have a gallery, a space to teach and a workspace for my own studio....."

He continued, "It would have to be a destination where people already come to."

In the back of his mind, he knew meeting those criteria would be a stretch. Yet, it all came to pass in a period of just six months.

Fast forward to 2018, and Two Fish Gallery finds itself in the midst of a 20th anniversary, as Robison and his wife, Karen celebrate the success of both the Gallery and the lifestyle they have carved out at their Rhine Street location.

#### What's in a name?

In its name, Two Fish Gallery also has several connotations.

Some might drift to the Dr. Suessian connotation inspired by the book, but that would be an incorrect assumption.

Robison said the fish in the title is a connection to Chinese culture, where the carp is a symbol of strength and perseverance. "In this kind of business, those are good qualities to embrace," he noted.

In the English language, several forms of the word two are commonly used. The numeric TWO refers to the partnership, companionship and joint entrepreneurship between Robison and his wife, Karen.


He also likes the image conjured by teaching people "to fish." Both Pat and Karen are life long teachers, and they treasure the opportunity to teach somoene to fish, rather than just giving them fish—or teaching art, beyond simply offering it for sale.

Finally, Two Fish might also be thought of as TOO Fish. Too can be loosely interpreted as abundance, an opportunity to enrich, homes gardens and lives through art connections.

"We have had people stop in for a lot of reasons over our 20 years here. One came looking for bait. Another came looking for coffee. I even offered to make a cup, but was politely refused," he chuckled.

#### Featured art

Two Fish Gallery features creations from both near and far. From what started as a gallery offering the work of 12 artists, Two Fish Gallery has expanded its art selections to include jewelry, sculpture, glass, wood and leather—creations that







span a wide range of media.

The artists also hail from a wide ranging geographical base—glass from Boston, weavers and knitters from the West Coast and artists from nine different fair trade organizations, representing creations from places like Bali, Haiti and Ghana.

"We wanted to offer things not made here stateside to complement the work we do," Robison said. "But it was also important to us to work through the fair trade groups to make sure the artistans are getting paid fairly to do the work."

#### **Exhibitions change**

At Two Fish Gallery, the Main Gallery houses most of the art, while the East Gallery is used for an Exhibition Gallery.

Exhibitions change four times throughout the year. "We try to keep the themes broad enough so that artists can interpret them in their own specific way," Robison said. "Normally, we have 25 or so participants, but our current one, has 43," he noted.

The current theme is "Opening." Robison enjoys putting together shows, something he has extensive experience helping at other arts centers. "I love to

helping at other arts centers. "I love to critique art work in the classroom. It's always been one of my short lists of talents.

#### **Outside sculptures**

Robison's wife, Karen, a botanist and science teacher, also brings a knack for creating garden spaces from a prior career.

"She designed the gardens at the Kohler Arts Center. She had the background because she and her former husband ran a landscaping business," he said.

With that background, Karen has redesigned the entire outdoor space at Two Fish Gallery into a complex of intertwined gardens over the past 20 year.

Robison also considers his wife a tre-

mendous artist, with an amazing sense of composition.

#### **Classes abound**

At Two Fish Gallery, Robison continues his teaching, offering six-week pottery sessions in the carriage house classroom behind the gallery.

Classes run back-to-back from January to June, and the fall course regimen begins again in September. Two Fish Gallery actually has classes running 30 weeks out of the year.

#### Utilitarian approach

Robison's own art takes on a utilitarian flare. He creates pieces that serve useful purposes—cups, plates, bowls and special items to assist in serving food. One of his most "fun" projects has been to create

serving pieces for the Paddock Club, a local Elkhart Lake restaurant.

In addition to saucers, he has also create a uniquely designed small butter dish. "I make them with different shapes that make it easy for the server to hold onto," he said, stressing functionality and ease of use.

"Symmetry doesn't interest me," he said, noting that his idea of pottery doesn't reflect the traditional image of wheel thrown creations.

#### Work and play alike

Robison says that his efforts at Two Fish Gallery are a great combination of work and enjoyment.

"Work and play are the same thing for me. I have realized that over the last 5-10 years, and I truly enjoy all aspects of this business. I am also fortunate that my wife has been tremendously supportive," Robsion noted.

"I came up to the area in 1976 to teach a class, and last year, I officially retired from formal education after 40 years of teaching a class," Robison said.

Still, he maintains his connections to the classroom, teaching pottery classes at The Two Fish School, located behind the gallery in the Carriage House. The classes specialize in high fire stoneware.

Robison traces his Elkhart Lake con-

nection back to one of his students, Jess Gunther. While taking one of his classes at the John Michael Kohler Arts Center, Jess, then an Elkhart Lake Chamber employee, coaxed him into considering Elkhart Lake.

It's a decision that he looks back on with great favor.

"When I first came here I was an outsider, but I can't say enough about how I felt welcomed here in the community," he said.

For Robison, the opening of Two Fish Gallery was quite a leap of faith from his previous career in marketing with DuFour Advertising. Yet, he credits the late Tim DuFour with a great mentoring presence. It was DuFour that encouraged him to take that leap into the gallery setting.

Robison said there is something magical about the lake, and the draw it has for people. "People say it's very relaxing here. In some ways I feel like I am on vacation all the time. This place lets you slow down and relax," he said.

Two Fish Gallery is located at 244 East Rhine Street.



# Sheboygan Symphony celebrates 100 years

The Sheboygan Symphony Orchestra, the state's longest continuously active orchestra, today announced plans for its 100th anniversary season.

Founded in 1918, the SSO has planned a variety of special music and other opportunities for the community to celebrate its centennial.

"Centennials are always special, and when you consider that we are the first orchestra in the state to reach this milestone, it's an extra-special reason to celebrate," said SSO Board of Directors President Roberta Filicky-Peneski.

"We are so fortunate in this community to have musicians willing to share their talents and perform this great music. The SSO also has a long history of educational programming as we prepare the next generations of performers and listeners. We are very excited for the concerts and other events we have planned for this memorable season."

Musically, SSO Music Director of Conductor Kevin McMahon has assembled an a celebratory series of concerts that tie to the orchestra's long history and include some special surprises.

The 100th season will begin with a gala concert on Oct. 6 at the SSO's home, The Stefanie H. Weill Center for the Performing Arts in downtown Sheboygan. The program will feature popular violinist Frank Almond, concertmaster of the Milwaukee Symphony Orchestra, in a performance of the Brahms Violin Concerto.

The season will close on May 11, 2019, with a concert that features a number of special treats, including the world premiere of "Music at Night," a piece by Michael Torke commissioned by the SSO for its 100th season. The work will feature the SSO and the Sheboygan Symphony Chorus, which is celebrating its 25th anniversary during the 2018-19 season.

The May program will also the return of Chorus Director Emeritus Janet Herrick, the founding conductor of the Sheboygan Symphony Chorus and Symphony Singers, to conduct a piece from Handel's "Messiah."

And, the season will close with the ensemble's inaugural performance of Mahler's landmark Second Symphony.

Other music highlights of the 100th season include, some of the repertoire's most important works for a larger orchestra, including pieces by Respighi, Beethoven and Gershwin; an unexpected version of happy birthday; special music in November to salute Veteran's Day; a holiday concert that includes favorite music from past Decembers, including excerpts from Handel's "Messiah," a sing-a-long and new music from "A Polar Express" and "Elf."; and a slide show of historic images of the SSO and its previous venues, as well as historical photos of Sheboygan and Sheboygan County.

In addition to the music, the SSO has a number of other plans to celebrate its centennial.

- SSO clarinetist and retired UW-Sheboygan faculty member Joseph Milicia has written a book chronicling the SSO's history. It will be available online through sheboygansymphony.org, at the SSO office and at each concert. Patrons can also order the book as part of their season ticket renewal/new order.

- The organization unveiled a special 100th anniversary logo, designed by Du-Four Advertising co-owner and creative director Roman Draughon, at its May 12 concert, the final performance of the 99th season.

- The SSO has partnered with the City of Sheboygan, Sheboygan Squared and Lakeshore Technical College to create some colorful music notes celebrating the 100th that will begin to appear throughout downtown Sheboygan early this summer.

the bottom 20% of districts in the state.

The District has shared how it's doing, from their perspective. Now it's your turn to tell us how we're doing. Parents and community members of the Elkhart Lake-Glenbeulah School District, we need and want you to become involved. Your input is critical for helping us plan for the future of our District and especially for our students. While we're incredibly proud of our successes, we know the future presents new challenges, including: 1) Renewing our operational referendum that will expire next year and 2) Developing a plan to address facility projects that are too large to be covered in our annual budget. Ultimately our plans must reflect the priorities of our community. To collect this feedback, the District is working with School Perceptions LLC, an independent firm with expertise in conducting community surveys. They have done surveys throughout the state, and in recent years, have been involved with surveying and planning for our neighboring districts of Plymouth, Sheboygan Falls, Sheboygan, Howards Grove, Random Lake and Oostburg.

The survey will get the parents and community perspective on the following:

Identifying how well EL-GS is doing in specific areas, such as building community pride, partnering with the community, delivering a high-quality education, etc.

Prioritizing Educational Initiatives on which EL-GS should focus efforts over the next five years to improve student learning Providing feedback on recently imple-

mented District initiatives

Assessing funding support as the District looks to renew the operational referendum that will expire next year. The survey question will gauge respondent's support for an operational referendum that would allow the District to maintain and/or expand current programs and services (focusing on the direction given through the survey results) as well as, address technology and maintenance needs while keeping the tax mill rate of \$7.91. The District's plan is not to ask for additional money under this part of the proposal, but to assess whether there is support to maintain the taxpayers' financial support at the current (2018) level.

Examples of the type of maintenance needs included: renovate elementary gym bathroom, replace (and abate as needed) the tile flooring throughout the entire high school and in the middle school hallways, replace windows on the 4th grade classroom level, update the elem./m.s. fire alarm system, replace the h.s. water heating equipment, install ADA compliant locker room showers, and replace elementary school exterior doors where needed.

Gauging the support for an expanded operational referendum to address facility projects that are too large to be covered in our annual budget. The projects include: 1) Update lighting and bleachers at the football/soccer field; 2) Update h.s. auditorium; and 3) Renovate the h.s. culinary arts classroom and lab. More specifics for each of these projects are included in the survey. Support for the inclusion of these three projects would increase the mill rate by \$.30 or raise it to a level of \$8.21. This equates to an additional \$30 per \$100,000 of property value annually from 2020 to 2024.

# Vintage of Ada brings life to treasures

If you take a peek inside the newly expanded country space at Vintage of Ada, the term "antique" might start to tickle your fancy.

Yet, there is little inside this charming space that can be called "antique" according to owner Susan Puls.

By design, Vintage of Ada's retro and repurposed offerings for home and garden don't qualify for antique designation. They simply don't have enough seniority. "Antiques are 100 years old and older. Vintage applies to items only 40 years old and older," Puls said.

In its cottage style space, Vintage of Ada offers vintage items that have been resurrected from life's dead end spaces. From painted furniture to a chicken roost filled with a Pyrex collection, Vintage of Ada gives new life to items that could add charm and usefulness to the home.

"We have an inventory that changes often, and carries seasonal items throughout the year," Puls said. "We have a garden focus in the spring, with plants in vintage containers, outdoor furniture, and various garden accents."

Puls hosts a Spring Garden Market in early May, featuring a wealth of plants, some in traditional containers, others in eclectic vintage settings.

"We offer a lot of nice things that were originally made in this country. Many of them have been given new life with a fresh coat of paint, or simply cleaned up and offered for a new purpose."

#### **Giving new life**

Giving new life to aging items isn't a simple or quick process.

"Finding all these things takes a lot of time," Puls said. "We beat the bushes pretty hard and much of what we find is in poor repair or quite dirty. It's a lot of work to get these items ready for resale."

Part of the seriousness of that effort stems from Puls' desire that customers find items that are ready to pick up and use for their home or decorating purposes.

"I do the scrubbing and the fixing," she said.

"We have so many wonderfully, beautifully made things that weren't mass produced overseas. These are well made goods—items made in this country—and I love to take them and put them back into service."

#### Helpful hand

Puls runs the business with a great deal of help from her husband, Ric, who spent

the last year building a beautiful new addition to the shop.

The intent of all the upgrades is to make shopping a more pleasant experience for customers.

"The new shop just opened, and the result is lovelier than I could have imagined. We now have a building that can be open year round, and it will be a wonderful spot for classes or evening gatherings—so many options for the future.

"People walk in and love the charm and the ambience of this space," she said. "They love the relaxed feeling. Their only struggle may be finding a place to park."

Puls wants her customers to feel comfortable and welcome. They might even feel like they are being transported back to a different time.

"We hear lots of comments like, 'my grandma had one of these.' The best comments we hear are when people walk in, look around, and say, 'It's magical!' When I hear that, I know I've done my job."

#### Prior teaching career

In what Puls calls "another lifetime" she operated a business called "Herbiforous" at the same Ada location. Vintage of Ada has been in business for four years, but operating out of a small building that was challenged for space.

A retired English language learner teacher, Puls had been doing vintage events and shows on a part-time basis. After retirement she began to focus on Vintage of Ada on a more full-time basis. "It now happily consumes our lives," she said.

#### Peaceful location

Vintage of Ada is located at W4024 State Road 32, on the north side of the highway that splits the small Sheboygan County hamlet.

Ada itself is quiet and quaint these days, barely a speed bump on the north side of a state highway—no post office, no taverns, no other businesses, except for the family orchard up the road.

Still, the store is located on a well-travelled path that traverses northern Sheboygan County.

"A lot of people stop in and remind us, that they drive by our place twice a day," Puls said.

Vintage of Ada is open to the public on a pre-determined basis, just the first and third weekends of each month from May to December.

On those weekends, the store holds hours from 9-4 Fridays and Saturdays and on Sundays from noon to 4.

# EL Triathlon reaches its 20th anniversary

The Elkhart Lake Triathlon, produced by Elkhart Lake MultiSports, Inc., turns 20 years old on June 9, 2018. The Elkhart Lake Triathlon is sponsored by the Elkhart Lake Tourism Commission and The Osthoff Resort.

"We are thrilled to have an event that has endured and thrived for 20 years," said Jeff Grady, the race's founder and director. "When we started this race, I don't think we considered how long it would last or how popular it would become." In fact, Jeff notes that five participants have raced the previous 19 races and are expected to enter the 20th running of the event.

Over the years the Elkhart Lake Triathlon has had many memorable moments. Some of those were serving as host of USA Triathlon's regional championship and special qualifier races. Regional championship and special qualifier events provide participants greater recognition and more slots to qualify for the USA Triathlon Age Group National Championships. Grady adds that, "Most of the memorable moments however, just come from our interactions with the athletes themselves."

Established in 1999, the Elkhart Lake Triathlon has become a mainstay on the Midwest triathlon circuit. The event which includes an Olympic distance race, an Elite Olympic event that offers \$2,600 in prize money and a shorter Sprint triathlon typically draws about 800-900 participants.

Grady notes, "The course is well established, the staff is very experienced and the race venue and surrounding area are very family friendly."

The vision for the race came about after Grady and his wife, Mariann, purchased a condominium at The Osthoff Resort in 1997. As Jeff tells it, "I stood on our balcony overlooking the lake and said to my wife 'It's so beautiful here, we really should put on an event.' The rest, as they say, is history," With that, Jeff began talking with his own running and triathlon training partners about putting on the race. This approach lead to Jeff's initial motto of a "Triathlon for Athletes, Put On By Athletes." The initial planning with the Village of Elkhart Lake, The Osthoff Resort, and local communities occurred over the next year.

"We have been fortunate to have developed great, long lasting relationships with very willing partners," explains Grady, "Coordinating and staffing the event is a complex endeavor." Jeff draws on the support of the Village of Elkhart Lake, Town of Rhine, Town of Russell, Town of New Holstein, Sheboygan County Highway Department, Calumet County Sheriff's Department, and the Sheboygan County Sheriff's Department which the event's racecourses pass through. The event also works with many local entities and

# Schools announce summer schedule


Summertime is a super time to engage in fun activities that encourage creativity, team building with friends, enrichment, and academic growth.



**Boating Safety on Elkhart Lake** The "No Wake" buoys are now in place for the summer of 2018. Along with this, the "No Motors on Sunday" will begin June 10, the second Sunday of June.

A new state regulation (Act 163) will be in effect starting this summer. As long as you have a wide-angle rear view mirror, you are no longer required to have a spotter in the boat while towing a skier.

While this may make sense on low traffic lakes and for some professional businesses, the Elkhart Lake Improvement Association strongly recommends that spotters continue to be used on Elkhart. The ELIA Board has passed a resolution stating our continued support for the use and need for spotters, and we are sharing this with our local legislators.

#### Memorial Day Event May 26

#### **Boating Regulations**

1. A Coast Guard approved Personal Flotation Device (PFD) in serviceable condition is required to be in the boat and accessible for each person in the boat. 2. A speed of "SLOW NO WAKE" is in effect all year long from 7:30 pm-10 am each day. "SLOW NO WAKE" is defined as the slowest possible speed at which a boat can operate while still maintaining steerage.

3. Maintain a speed of "SLOW NO WAKE" at all times when operating a motor boat between the shoreline and the NO WAKE buoys and within 100 feet of any craft at anchor, adrift or not operating under engine power.

4. No boat towing persons skiing, tubing or the like can come within 100 feet of swimmers, divers, rafts, other boats or restricted areas.

5. All boats engaged in towing skiers, tubers or persons in similar activities must have a competent person, other than the pilot, observing the towed person(s).

6. NO SUNDAY operation of motor driven boats, beginning the 2nd Sunday of June and ending the 3rd Sunday of September. Note: Only electric trolling motors allowed.

7. There is a radar-enforced speed limit of 35 m.p.h. on the water.

8. A counter-clockwise course should be maintained while water-skiing, jet skiing, etc., and during the times of high-volume boat activity.



## Penwern story shared at Wade House in May


In 2018, Wade House Historic Site will celebrate famed architect Frank Lloyd Wright with a series of lectures and an exhibit focusing on Wright's life and work in Wisconsin and his relationship with Sheboygan carriage collector and restoration expert Wesley W. Jung.

The first event in Wade House's 2018 celebration of Frank Lloyd Wright was May 10. With a rich collection of historic and contemporary photos, Mark Hertzberg, photographer and expert on Wright's work in southeastern Wisconsin, presented a lecture titled "Penwern: A Frank Lloyd Wright Summer Place" at the Wade House Visitor Center. During the presentation, guests discovered the story of Penwern, a summer cottage on Delavan Lake, designed by Frank Lloyd Wright for Fred B. Jones. Frank Lloyd Wright designed summer cottages for five Chicago businessmen on Delavan Lake, Wisconsin, between 1900 and 1905, including Penwern. The Jones commission was part of an estate, with a gate lodge, stable, and boathouse, all designed by Wright. The summer cottages that Wright designed in Wisconsin, Michigan, New York, and Ontario, among other sites, have been largely glossed over in the literature. Hertzberg's "Penwern" presentation also touched on Wright clients Ward W. Willits and Henry H. Wallis, among others.

Mark Hertzberg is the author and photographer of three books about Frank Lloyd Wright's work in Racine. His next book, a commission to write about Wright's Penwern estate on Delavan Lake, will be published by the Wisconsin Historical Society Press in the fall of 2018. Hertzberg chronicled daily life in Racine for The Journal Times for 33 years, first as a staff photographer and then as Director of Photography.

Wade House's second "Frank Lloyd Wright: A Wisconsin Original" program will take place on Thursday, June 14 at 6:30 p.m. and will feature Bob Kann, author of "Frank Lloyd Wright and His New American Architecture." Join the fun during this family program as Bob Kann uses storytelling, juggling, and magic in a presentation about the life and architecture of Frank Lloyd Wright.

The Wade House lecture series will take place at the Wade House Visitor Center located at W7965 Hwy. 23 in Greenbush, WI, halfway between Sheboygan and Fond du Lac.
