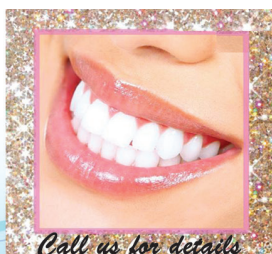

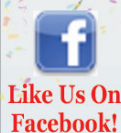

Memorial Day

SALUTE

Let's take time to remember all of the soldiers who have valiantly defended our freedom in all wars and conflicts, suffered injuries and made the ultimate sacrifice for the cause of democracy. May we treasure the rich heritage of freedom they have fought so bravely for.



Memorial Day was originally known as Decoration Day because it was a time set aside to honor the nation's Civil War dead by decorating their graves. It was first widely observed on May 30, 1868, to commemorate the sacrifices of Civil War soldiers, by proclamation of General John A. Logan of the Grand Army of the Republic, an organization of former sailors and soldiers.

By the late 1800s, many communities across the country had begun to celebrate Memorial Day and, after World War 1, observances also began to honor those who had died in all of America's wars. In 1971, Congress declared Memorial Day a national holiday to be celebrated the last Monday in May.

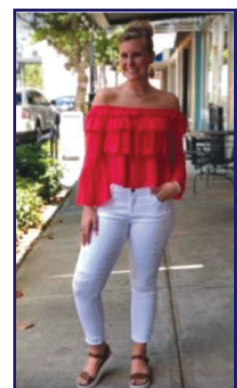

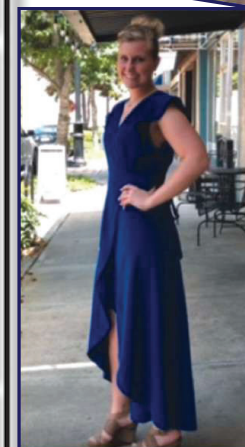

GW served in Viet Nam in 1967 and 68. His military experience inspired him to write a poem entitled A SOLDIER’S BATTLEFIELD. As I sit alone on this battlefield, my will is to live and not to kill. The sun is setting and the evening shadows come alive. I must try to live. I must survive.

With a hiss and a pop of a parachute flare I strain my eyes to see what’s there.

Then I’m awakened with a blast and a scream.

It’s the nurse waking me to say it was just a dream.

She might be right but I lived another day and survived last night.
