

# Lenora Dexter celebrates 51 years of service at SCRMC

In the last 50 years, the world has seen much change. The creation of the computer, the methods of communication, new healthcare discoveries, transportation and social interactions are a few ways of how

society has evolved. During those 50 years, South Central Regional Medical Center (SCRMC) has had the privilege of an employee experiencing those changes and more during her tenure. Lenora Dexter, Food Services Call Center associate, began her service at Jones County Community Hospital (JCCH) on May 15, 1967, and continues to provide service at SCRMC 51 years later.

Dexter began her time at JCCH under the direction of Helen Wilson, director of Dietary. Dexter stated, "Ms. Wilson hired me in May of 1967. During that time, she was our director, the department secretary, handled our payroll and served as the dietitian for the hospital. She provided guidance and education for my career. Our department was less than 20 people at the time, and I began on the tray line."

Along with assisting on the tray line for distribution of patient room trays, Dexter

assisted with the small cafeteria and catering within the hospital. She said, "It was a much smaller team, but we worked together to assist each other. I enjoyed visiting with patients, learning from my co-workers and lending a helping hand. When we finished

in one area, we never stood around. We went and helped the next area.'

After 10 years of service on the tray line, Dexter transitioned into diet clerk. During the 1970s, there were no computers, typewriters, or even pens to use for

patients' orders. "I started with a pencil, paper and diet order card for patients. I would work with our dietitian to help sort the nutrition needs for patients' food based off what the physician ordered. Once

the order was ready, we would use a pulley system to send food from the kitchen to the nursing floor and ring a bell. Years later, we would transport food trays in giant buggies."

During that time, JCCH served approximately 40 patient meals, three times a day. Years later, that changed to approximately 200 patient meals, three times a day. Today, with implementation of Hotel Style Room Service, SCRMC serves approximately 140 patient meals throughout the day based on patient requests and physicians' orders. Today, the Food Services department at SCRMC is almost completely paperless.

In 2011, SCRMC implemented Hotel-Style Room Service, which allows patients to order their meals when they would like it. Along with ordering at their own time frame, patients can select items from an expansive menu based on their dietary needs. Dexter serves as a call center associate within Food Services, so she assists patients with placing their orders and making sure their dietary needs are implemented. In her 51 years at SCRMC, Dexter has served under nine directors in Food Services. She became known as more of an advisor and would frequently be referred to as a "Mama Hen or Grandma" of the department. "It was important that our team knew we were a family," noted Lenora. "We pulled together to complete whatever work we had to do, and then moved to the next task."

Dexter has thoroughly enjoyed her time at SCRMC. "I enjoy being here. Often, I would give up my off days to come work. I learned many different roles in the department and it helped me grow a lot. I also learned how to make yeast rolls, cinnamon rolls and cakes from our bakers, so I really enjoyed that part."

Today, Dexter serves under Glenda McCraw, director of Food Services, at SCRMC. "To say Lenora is an asset is an understatement," said McCraw. "Lenora can do any job in this department and can do it well. She started from scratch in this department and has completely evolved into an essential member of our team. She treats her co-workers like family, and they respect her. Along with co-workers, the patients enjoy Lenora."

# Jones and Wayne counties awarded federal funds for food and shelter programs



Several Pine Belt Counties have been awarded Federal Funds made available through the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's Federal Emergency Management Agency under the Emergency Food & Shelter Program, to help support and expand the capacity of food and shelter programs in these counties. The amounts to be awarded include the following:

\*Jones County - \$27,825.00

\*Wayne County - \$9,855.00 A Local Board is responsible for distributing these funds in each community. The Local Board is responsible for recommending agencies to receive these funds and any additional funds made available under this phase of the program.

Under the terms of the grant from the National Board, local agencies chosen to receive funds must: 1) be private voluntary nonprofits or units of government, 2) be eligible to receive Federal funds, 3) have an accounting system, 4) practice nondiscrimination, 5) have demonstrated the capability to deliver emergency food and/



or shelter programs, and 6) if they are a private voluntary organization, have a voluntary board. Qualifying agencies are urged to apply.

Public or private agencies interested in applying for funds must contact Local Board Chairman Jennifer Pippen at Domestic Abuse Family Shelter, Inc. (601-428-1707) or jennifer.pippen83@gmail.com for more information. To be considered for funding, agencies must meet certain specific requirements and applications must be completed and returned no later than 5:00 p.m. on Friday, June 22, 2018.

### MSWCC Soil Tunne travels to SBA

The Mississippi Soil and Water Conservation Commission (MSWCC) Soil Tunnel has made several destination stops in Mississippi since January and has made more visits to schools, conservation carnivals and communities. The tunnel made a stop at Sylva-Bay Academy recently with assistance from Jasper County Soil and Water Conservation District (SWCD), Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS), and Lance Middleton, Area 2 MSWCC field representative.

The program is to teach 3rd - 6th graders conservation. Visitors to the soil tunnel have the opportunity to: View the world under the top soil by walking inside of the tunnel; see where organisms such as bacteria and fungi thrive; and visit the homes of earth-dwelling creatures such as worms and moles. Visual images on the outside of the tunnel explain: Functions of Soil; Urban Soil Profile; Agricultural Soil Profile; Wetlands Soil Profile and; Storm Water Pollution and Prevention. Concepts explained include: soil layers, drainage and function; storm water pollution prevention; the impact of land use on soil, soil organisms and conservation.

The tunnel is a 16-feet x 16-feet x 10-feet high inflatable educational aid and is sponsored by MSWCC. If you are interested in reserving the soil tunnel, please contact your local SWCD. 



• Relocate medical supplies to an area that isn't high in humidity, as steam from showers can speed up the expiration of medication. Storing medicines in the refrigerator won't help, as that is a high-humidity area, too.

Checking medications and removing expired products from the house can prevent accidents related to medications and ensure that all medicines in the house are as effective as possible.

Some old medications, such as children's cough and cold products, may no longer be recommended for certain ages. Having such medications in the house could prove harmful.

Taking inventory and cleaning out medicine cabinets frees up space and creates a safe home environment.

• Toss away any expired products, whether they are prescription or over-the-counter medicines. The best way to do so is to bring the medication to a pharmacy for disposal rather than throwing it in the garbage or flushing medicines down the toilet.

• Discard any unmarked containers or pill foils that are not in their original packaging.



# MSU launches #MoorCowbell season ticket campaign

STARKVILLE, Miss. – One of the most anticipated seasons in Mississippi State football history kicks off in 100 days. To coincide with the excitement of the first year of the Joe Moorhead era, MSU has launched the #MoorCowbell season ticket campaign at HailState.com/MoorCowbell.

Season tickets for the 2018 Bulldog season start at \$200 and can be purchased at HailState.com/MoorCowbell, by calling 1-888-GO-DAWGS or in person at the MSU Athletic Ticket Office on the first floor of the Bryan Athletic Administration Building (288 Lakeview Drive), Monday through Friday, 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. The #MoorCowbell season ticket campaign will feature frequent digital content on MSU platforms focused on the pageantry and tradition of Bulldog football. In February, MSU announced a season ticket price decrease in several sections of Davis Wade Stadium, including some lower east side sections as well as much of the upper levels. A map of the complete 2018 MSU football season ticket pricing is available here.

Moorhead, the 2016 and 2017 National Offensive Coordinator of the Year, takes the reins of one of the Southeastern Conference's most successful programs this decade. State has reached a bowl game a school-record eight consecutive years, won three straight bowls and is the SEC West's second-winningest team since 2014 (34 victories). The 33rd head football coach in Bulldog history, Moorhead just completed a speaking tour across the Southeast, generating excitement on his "championship standard" mantra centered on winning the SEC Championship and competing for a national championship.

"Mississippi State is no longer 'The Little Engine That Could'," Moorhead told the packed crowds. "Don't be scared to talk about it. We talk about it with our team every day. Attitude reflects leadership. If we want them to believe it, we have to believe it, too."

The Bulldogs have been ranked as high as No. 11 nationally by some preseason publications. State returns 17 starters, its entire starting defensive line, four of five starters on the offensive line and a veteran backfield led by senior quarterback Nick Fitzgerald. Fitzgerald, a National Player of the Year candidate, is one of only four quarterbacks in SEC history to throw for over 4,400 yards and rush for over 2,400 yards in a career.

Summer workouts begin next week, and MSU will officially report for preseason camp on Thursday, Aug. 2 before beginning practice the following day. The Moorhead era officially kicks off on Sept. 1 against Stephen F. Austin in Davis Wade Stadium. Southern Miss bumped out of NCAA baseball regional with losses to Arkansas, Dallas Baptist

The long ball was not entirely kind to Southern Miss on Sunday. Behind five home runs, Dallas Baptist outslugged the Golden Eagles and sent them packing in the Fayetteville Regional with a 9-4 drubbing. Southern Miss finishes its season with a record of 44-18, while Dallas Baptist moved to 42-20 and advanced to face top-seeded Arkansas for a chance at the region title. The Golden Eagles played Dallas Baptist in Friday's opening round Friday and handed the Patriots a 9-0 loss.

"Today was a tough day. Certainly we didn't want to end it like we did," Golden Eagle head coach Scott Berry said. "It's always tough whenever that last one ends your season. We just didn't come out and do the things we needed to do this time of the year to play, especially in a do-or-die game.

"Hats off to Dallas Baptist, who was faced with the same situation. They responded to it pretty well."

With a pair of solo shots through two innings of play, Dallas Baptist started fast with a 2-0 lead. Southern Miss answered in the third with a two-run homer from Matthew Guidry, which tied the game at two apiece.

The Patriots proceeded to score seven straight runs, including a four spot in the fifth inning. Garrett Wolforth highlighted the outburst with a three-run homer.

Southern Miss had fallen into the losers bracket Saturday when they encountered host Arkansas. Coming into Saturday night, Arkansas had lost only three of the 34 base-

ball games it had played on its home turf at Baum Stadium. By the end of Saturday night, the Razorbacks had shown the Golden Eagles the kind of baseball that produced that record.

Left-handed starter Kacey Murphy allowed just two singles over eight, scoreless innings and Arkansas sent 11 batters to the plate in the second inning to build an early seven-run lead on its way to a 10-2 victory in winner's bracket contest at the Fayetteville Regional. "He mixed his pitches, used both sides of the plate and really was in control," USM coach Scott Berry said of Murphy. "Offensively, we haven't been held down like that in a long time. But that's how good I felt he really pitched." The Razorbacks, who are 32-3 at Baum Stadium this season, are expected to start sophomore right-hander Isaiah Campbell (4-6, 4.01 ERA) against the USM-DBU winner. Saturday night, USM starter Stevie Powers (5-2) was battered for seven runs on five hits in 1 2/3 innings. He walked three and struck out two.

second inning, the Razorbacks got two-run home runs from first baseman Jared Gates and right fielder Eric Cole, a two-run triple from second baseman Carson Shaddy and a run-scoring single from center fielder Dominic Fletcher.

"It was big," said Murphy, who did not allow a hit through 4 1/3 innings. "A seven-run inning like that, it allows you to relax a little bit."

Arkansas tacked on two runs in the fifth inning and another in the ninth to lead 10-0 before USM got two runs in its final at-bats.

Second baseman Matthew Guidry led off the inning against Arkansas reliever Caleb Bolden with his fourth home run of the season, and after a single up the middle by third baseman Luke Reynolds, center fielder Matt Wallner lashed a run-scoring double.

"I was proud of the way our guys battled there at the end," Berry said. "We didn't go away quietly."

Shaddy finished with three hits and three RBIs and scored twice for the Razorbacks, while Cole also had three

hits, drove in two runs and scored once. Fletcher and Gates each had two hits and two runs scored.

Guidry reached base three times on a home run, a walk and an error.
