



The Communist Influence On Our College Campuses

With all that is happening today in our schools and universities, it is more important than ever before for parents to monitor what their children are being taught.
According to Bradford Richardson in the November

4 Washington Times, a new poll shows that most millennials would prefer to live in a socialist, communist or fascist nation rather than a capitalistic

Someone said: "If you want to find out where Communism is thriving, then go to America's college campuses. Communism and Socialism are alive and well in America among those who depend on the hard

Without economic freedom, Socialism wouldn't be possible. The former Prime Minister of Great Britain said, "Socialist governments traditionally do make a financial mess. They always run out of other people's

For most young people in our nation today, socialism is what they have been accustomed to. Their parents have paid for everything--their food shelter, clothing and other basic needs.

According to Marion Smith, executive director of the Victims of Communism Memorial Foundation, millennials are "increasingly turning away from capitalism and toward socialism and even communism as a viable alternative." Smith said: "This troubling turn highlights widespread historical illiteracy in American society regarding socialism and the systemic failure of our education system to teach students about the genocide, destruction, and misery caused by communism since the Bolshevik Revolution one hundred years ago.

According to an April 2018 survey by Rasmussen only 53 percent of American adults believe capitalism is better than socialism. Age made a large difference in how Americans viewed capitalism and socialism, according to the survey, with capitalism getting the worst grades among adults under 30. Only 37 percent of the under-30s favored capitalism, 33 percent preferred socialism, and 30 percent were undecided.

By party, Republicans by an 11-to-1 margin said that ism was superior to socialism, while were more pro-socialist and more evenly divided, with only 39 percent preferring capitalism, 30 percent favoring socialism, and 31 percent undecided.

According to a report by The Victims of Communism Memorial Foundation, about U.S. attitudes toward communism, the majority of America's largest generation (millennials) would prefer to live in a socialist or communist society than in a free enterprise system that respects the rule of law, private property, and limited government. The reality is, however, that, despite their enthusiasm for socialism and communism, the millennials don't know what those terms mean.

Obviously, the high school and university students are not being taught about the evils of Communism. Here are the estimated numbers of human beings slaughtered by some of the communist regimes. This does not include lives lost in wars.

65 million slaughtered under the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics;

49 million under the Peoples Republic of China; 21 million under the National Socialist German Workers Party (NSGWP);





The trail stretches about eight miles from Bishop Bridge, south of Allsboro, to the Buddy Durham Road bridge, just off Allsboro Road. The town has a fleet of single and tandem kayaks for rent. It will provide drop off and pickup service for kayakers renting from the town or using their own boat. The cost for rental is \$30 for a single-seat kayak and \$40 for a twoseater. The charge is \$10 for transportation for kayakers using their own boat.

According to Cherokee Mayor Terry Cosby, it typically takes about four to six hours to paddle the length of the trail. "It all depends on how hard you want to paddle and how often you stop."

There are numerous spots along the creek to stop for a picnic or to rest. A variety of wildlife can be seen along the creek including bald

eagles.
Susann Hamlin, CEO and President of Colbert County Tourism, said her

office receives numerous calls from people all over the country looking for kayak trails. In the past, the tourism office has referred the callers to kayak outfitters in other counties and nearby states. "Now we have a kayak trail in our own county here in Cherokee. We are very excited.'

Tricia Montgomery, chairman of the Bear Creek Development Authority, said many businesses in western Colbert County and the surrounding area will reap benefits from the kayak trail. "The people who come here to kayak are going to need groceries. They are going to need gas for their vehicle and places to eat and places to stay. The economic impact of this trail is going to be tremendous.'

Stewart Jordyn Tuscumbia was the town's first customer to rent a kayak. "I'm very excited about this trail. I will be coming back and bringing my friends."



Trump Ends Union Taxpayer Subsidies -Saves \$100 Million

overnment employee unions have enjoyed an absolute boondoggle in recent years, receiving hundreds of millions in taxpayer funds. However, the boon could soon be over thanks to a new executive order from

President Donald Trump.

The president signed an executive order in late May requiring federal government employees who work full-time for the public employee unions at taxpayer expense to spend at least 75% of their paid time on the government's business. The administration estimates this will save taxpayers \$100 million. This measure is one of three executive orders signed by the president. Those orders do not eliminate taxpayer subsidies for public employee unions altogether—that is Congress's job. However, they do end the taxpayer subsidy of travel for union business,

mandate that unions be charged fair market value for rents of government office space, streamline the public employee appeals process so that bad apples can be fired more rapidly, and force taxpayer-funded union workers to spend at least three-quarters of their time doing the people's business.



draws on themes originated by the National Building Museum to encourage visitors to explore how our ideal of the perfect house and our experience of what it means to "be at home" have changed over time. 

computer, it would display all sorts of horrible problems that needed to be fixed or Bad Things would happen. Of course there was a

convenient link to purchase the software that would "fix" the problems you didn't have. Eventually PC Matic, much like some mafia bosses, made enough money scamming people to "go legit." So how does PC Matic

actually perform compared to other antivirus programs? Well, if you listen to their commercials, they get 100%

perfect scores. No one in my line of business would believe that claim and you shouldn't either. No antivirus program is perfect but there are some objective ways to determine which ones offer the best protection.





employee union salaries. They become incensed when they learn that union employees were paid \$177 million by the federal government in 2016 not including office space and

travel expenses.
A 2013 Freedom of Information Act request by Americans for Limited Government discovered that the Department of Veterans Affairs alone had over 250 employees working full-time for unions in 2011. The Transportation Department had thirty-five employees on full-time official time, many of whom had salaries in excess of \$170,000 per year. When the IRS was busy playing politics in 2012 by delaying and denying Tea Party group applications for non-profit status, the Washington Times reported that more than 200 full-time IRS employees were engaged in nothing but union activity. The same report added that taxpayers picked up the bill for another \$687,400 in union travel at the IRS alone.

It's bad enough that the federal government spent between \$150 and 200 million a year on union salaries and travel. What's worse is that this indirectly subsidized unions' political activity. Because money is fungible, the money that public employee unions didn't have to spend on personnel could then be turned around and spent on politics.

Public employee unions are among the biggest donors in politics, with the American Federation of State, County, and Municipal Employees ranked the fifteenth largest contributor so far in 2018, according to Open Secrets. This group has overwhelmingly favored Democrats over Republicans.

Of the \$4,843,291 that this group has poured into politics this year, \$6,000 of it went to groups, causes, or politicians considered to be Republican or conservative. They spent almost \$16 million on 2016 on politics with under \$8,000 going to Republican or conservative groups. In that same election cycle, their political action committee could not find a single Republican to If the president takes support and gave 100% of this next bold step, the find a single Republican to their money to Democrats.

taxpayers have subsidized public unions that pursue pass full-blown civil service. political activities and overwhelmingly

Democrats. Their donations are designed to grow government, and consequently their own membership.

Public employee unions don't pretend to be anything but big government advocates. The president's executive order forcing taxpayer-funded union employees to spend 75% of their time doing their federal job is a good first step in reigning in this farleft government funding stream.

Trump deserves kudos for recognizing the absurdity of taxpayer funding of the left. He also deserves credit for hiring people like Russ Vought and James Sherk for the Office of Management and Budget and White House staff, respectively, and Nathan Mehrens into the Labor Department. By hiring people who have studied and understand how the current federal civil service system perpetuates the administrative state, Trump set himself up for success when it comes to dealing with the wash, rinse, repeat swamp cycle that the public employee

unions perpetuate.

Recently, much of the discussion about public employee unions in politics has been focused upon the upcoming Janus v. AFSCME Supreme Court decision, which could allow public employees at all levels of government to opt-out of paying dues as a First Amendment right. These new executive orders will have a much greater impact on the federal bureaucracy, since federal employees already have the right to not join the union.

This executive order will shift about \$100 million in union employee costs back onto the unions. This will force them to prioritize which cases should be fought and which one's should be settled, injecting some rationality and perhaps greater speed into the federal government firing process.

Now, the president needs to force the public employee unions to compete for their members through an opt-in process where the employee would have to actively decide to be a member of the union rather than being assumed to be a member unless they fill out the proper paperwork.







I was hurt on the job and my employer's worker's compensation insurance paid for all my medical bills and sent me money while I was off work. My doctor has said I can go back to work on limited duty and my employer has said that they will find me something to do. Overall, I've been treated pretty well but what happens when the doctor removes all the restrictions and I've finally recovered and go can back to my old job? I am a welder.

Workers compensation is there to pay your medical bills and pay 2/3 of your wages while you are off work. The 2/3 of your wages is known as temporary total disability or TTD. That is supposed to

approximate your true wages because that pay is tax free. In real life, people find TTD to be less than their wages and they end up short on money unless they savings or a spouse that has an income.

Your employer is saving money by accommodating your restrictions. Everything that you cost them from medical bills to the final settlement will be recovered by the insurance company in the form of increased workers compensation premiums. Nonetheless, many employers treat workers well and welcome them back to work while others are not so kind. Many employers don't want an injured employee on their premises and really resent an employee that gets hurt.

I talk to people that are injured on the job every day, several times a day. Often people who get hurt want to tell me why it is the employer's fault or a co-employee's fault that they were hurt. I explain to them that under the law of workers compensation, they don't have to prove who was at fault. There is an interesting case where an employee had a trip and fall injury and could not say why they had a trip and fall injury or what they tripped over and the court held that that was not a work related injury even though it happened on the job at Wal-Mart.

Under the Workers Compensation Act if you have a permanent injury, typically after surgery, you will be entitled to some payment for that permanent injury. If you make a full recovery, and I hope you do, and the doctor gives you no restrictions and a zero impairment rating and you haven't had surgery, after your medical bills are paid and your TTD is paid and your mileage is reimbursed that probably concludes your claim. If you do have a permanent injury, depending on what part of your body was injured, you will have a claim for payment. Under certain circumstances, workers have the right to insist on vocational re-training for a job more suitable for them after their injury.

The Lives She Saves

Nelson's Work at the Florence-Lauderdale Animal Shelter

ebby Nelson has been volunteering with animals in the Shoals area and beyond for nearly a decade. She works with puppies and dogs at the Florence-Lauderdale Animal Shelter and the Brown Dog Coalition in Hopkinton, Massachusetts. Nelson launched Chloe's

Fund, a program that raises money from local donors to provide much-needed veterinary care to incoming pets at the shelter. Chloe's Fund was founded in memory of her late West Highland Terrier, Chloe, who passed away at age 17 after a lifetime of health issues.

"After Chloe passed away, I was thinking if she had not been with me and had been a little dog turned into the shelter, she would have died long ago," Nelson said.

Chloe had diabetes and Cushing's disease, among other health concerns, according to Nelson. She required special care and two shots per day.

"After she passed away, something just kept nagging me," Nelson said. "I felt like she was telling me that I needed to do

something in her memory for the animals that weren't as fortunate as she was."

Nelson scoured the internet for ideas and eventually landed on a picture of a fundraising board that piqued her interest. She got to work creating what is now the Chloe's Fund board at the animal shelter. Donors receive a small wooden paw in memory of their chosen pet, and the paws are then attached to the board.

Because the shelter receives no funding for vet care, sick and injured pets weren't receiving the lifesaving treatments t h e needed in order to be adopted out into new forever homes. Before Chloe's

Challenging "Father" Moments

One of the classic statements on parenthood was made many years ago by James Dobson when he penned, "Parenting Isn't For Cowards." That is true for both moms and dads, but since we are bearing down on Father's Day, we will think about it from a father's perspective.

It is not that a crisis arrives every minute, but the older our kids get, the more often challenging decisions seem to come around. One dad kind of brushed off the importance of these tough calls by saying, "At least you have a 50-50 chance of getting it right." But I do not believe that most

through his nose into his stomach. The thought of that sent my son into panic mode! Immediately he begged me to not let them do it. It was a difficult moment for me, because I had to quickly decide if the procedure was worth the distress to my son. I decided to allow it.

When the nurses came in to do the procedure, his fear accelerated -- and I had to leave the room! All the way to the elevator I could hear my son crying, "Dad make them stop! Dad, please make them stop!"

It seemed that everything within me urged me to go back and make them stop! But I didn't. Why? Because I believed the eventual outcome would be worth the present pain. And thanks be to God it was the right decision, because he is a healthy man today!

Every time I think of that incident I think about the Heavenly Father looking down at His Son who cried, "Father, if it is possible, let this cup pass from Me" (Matthew 26:39). But He allowed Him to be crucified. Why? Because He knew the outcome would be worth the present pain! And thankfully we can stand spiritually whole today because of a loving Father who endured a challenging Father moment (cf. Matthew 27:46).

Maybe this will bring greater appreciation to the words we know so well, "For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life" (John 3:16).

paperwork, tests the dogs' temperaments, makes sure they're fully vetted and coordinates their foster care

and transport.
"When there's a sweet animal that needs a home, she'll call [the Brown Dog Coalition] and they'll let her know whether they want the dog," said Chapel King, a fellow shelter volunteer. "Debby will find a foster home for it, somebody will keep it for a week or two to keep it out of the shelter, then she'll send it to Massachusetts."

According to Nelson, Brown Dog accepts dogs with medical conditions like heartworm and parvo, and they pay the dogs medical bills.

"They have us choose the dogs we think would be a good match for our rescue--we always get approval," she says. "And we have a professional transport. A young woman out of Mississippi drives to meet us in Muscle Shoals."

The transport then travels to Massachusetts and on to Maine to deliver other dogs. Then she returns to Mississippi to begin the cycle again.

Due to the strict shelter pet laws in Massachusetts, the animals must be fully vetted before they're sent out of state. Once they reach Massachusetts, they must be quarantined for 48 hours to ensure they're in good health. Massachusetts law states that pets must be fixed and up-to-date on vaccinations to be adopted.

The most rewarding part of the process is receiving updates from Brown Dog on the pets she's helped to transport, according to Nelson.

"You see this little dog that didn't have a chance, and suddenly it's the greatest dog in the world to its new family," she says.
