"Our eyes are up here," says Miss America Organization

Last Tuesday morning on ABC's "Good Morning America," former Miss America winner Gretchen Carlson – now head of the board of trustees – announced that the Miss America Organization will no longer include swimsuit or night gown portions of competition within their pageant.

"We're not going to judge you on appearance because we are interested in what makes you you," Carlson proudly stated.

This marks a historic change for the Miss America pageant, which actually began as an Atlantic City swimsuit competition in 1921. Though some are concerned that television ratings may suffer from exiling such an iconic portion of the event, the organization is confident that this change is a step in the right direction.

Based on a survey of individuals in the Pine Belt area, 61 percent voters believe this to be a good move for the Miss America Organization in their quest to judge contestants based on character rather than appearance, whereas the other 39 percent believe the pageant is better off sticking to its traditional format. The decision even drew reactions from local pageant competitors such as Waynesboro native Mackenzie Hutto, Miss Deep South 2018, who will be competing in the Miss Mississippi Pageant in Vicksburg later this month. "The Miss America Organization [aims] to empower women," said Hutto. "A lot of women have decided not to compete in this competition because of the swimsuit portion and the lack of love for their bodies. Women should feel beautiful in their own skin and be judged based on their opinions and what they believe. That is why they are doing this. They want women to be heard and not just be looked at in a bikini."

Taylor Hathorn, a senior English education major at Mississippi College and editor-in-chief of the campus creative arts journal, believes that though it was admirable to remove the swimsuit portion from the event, there are certainly many more steps to be taken in order to achieve the equality and empowerment they claim to desire for their competition.

"Just as a disclaimer, I've never been in a beauty pageant," noted Hathorn. "While I applaud this step, I still think that Miss America is a beauty pageant. They [only] count 25 percent of their score from their interviews. These judges meet the girls for what, 15 to 20 minutes, and ask them surface questions for which most of them are wellcoached. This is a pageant of surfaces. Taking away the swimsuits only makes it blatantly obvious that is all about appearances and projections."

Miss America 2018 Cara Mund, along with former win-

ners such as Leanza Cornett (1993) and Mallory Hytes Hagan (2013), have spoken out recently in favor of this change after seeing it being implemented in other notable pageants. Most recently, Miss Teen USA made headlines in 2016 with their decision to ditch the swimsuit competition and gear their efforts towards judging contestants based on character and intellectual merit. The verdict on whether or not this change will affect its ratings will be determined later this year on Sept. 9, when contestants take the stage to compete for the honor of being named Miss America 2019.



Vinegar is a fermented liquid made from a wide array of ingredients that is used primarily to preserve and flavor food. But the uses for vinegar are almost as extensive as the variety of flavors it's available in.

The word "vinegar" comes from the French "vin aigre," or "sour wine." Vinegar is a diluted solution of acetic acid that forms with the fermentation of grapes, apples, rice, corn, and many other ingredients.

Apple cider vinegar, or ACV, is a type of vinegar that has recently skyrocketed in popularity due to its purported health benefits. ACV


is formed from cider or apple must and has a long history as a home remedy, making it the most popular type of vinegar in the natural health community. The following are just a handful of the purported benefits credited to ACV.

1. ACV improves healthy gut flora. Like other fermented foods and beverages (think yogurt and kombucha), ACV is rich in enzymes and probiotics. Probiotics can aid in digestion and make sure that the digestive system is working efficiently. According to the health and wellness team at MyFitnessPal, unpasteurized ACV can deliver probiotics and energize digestion. Others say that ACV can assist with easing an upset stomach by addressing unhealthy bacteria. Some remedies suggest that the pectin in ACV can help soothe intestinal spasms as well.

2. ACV can be used as a disinfectant. ACV and other vinegars can kill harmful bacteria or prevent them from multiplying, according to Healthfullness that can help people avoid overeating.

4. ACV naturally lowers cholesterol. A 2016 study published in the British Journal of Nutrition found consumption of the acetic acid found in ACV reduced serum cholesterol and triglyceride levels in rats. More research is needed to determine if humans can reap similar rewards.

5. ACV can treat dandruff and other skin ailments. The acidity of ACV changes the pH of the skin and scalp, making it harder for yeast to grow. Applying ACV to the scalp can inhibit dandruff. It also can be used as a toner that exfoliates the skin and makes it less oily.

line. ACV has historically been used as a disinfectant and natural preservative and may help reduce instances of E. coli. Those same antibacterial properties also may help head off infections of the throat. Reader's Digest indicates that gargling with ACV can soothe a sore throat and create an acidic environment in the esophagus that most germs can't survive.

3. ACV contributes to feelings of fullness. Many people insist that ACV helps with weight loss. According to dietician and certified diabetes instructor Katie Rankell at UC Irvine Medical Center, ACV has been shown to lower blood sugar by reducing the absorption of carbohydrates, while also contributing to feelings of Gout



Prayer changes everything



and they will do even greater things than these....." (John 14:12)


