By ANN SCHWARTZ Those who lived in or visited Brainerd in the 1960s and 1970s can remember a thriving downtown. Sure, it contained a lot of bars, but mixed in were numerous

drug stores, a dime store, department store, hardware stores, clothing boutiques, a shoe store, gift shops and much, much more. It was a pleasant place to shop, have a cup of coffee or a meal.

As the years went on, more and more of the retail activity moved to Baxter -- the Westgate mall area and the 371 strip. Bars continued to thrive in downtown and a few great businesses held on.

But now, with the trend of returning to one's roots and families wanted walkable cities where they can walk or bike to amenities, downtown Brainerd is again on the rise.

Nick and Joe Phelps, who grew up in north Brainerd, have renovated old storefronts on the northern 700 block of Laurel Street. The character of the old buildings came through as, with renovation, hardwood floors, pressed tin ceilings and exposed brick were revealed. Past shoppers may be inter-
