

HAM-AND-TOMATO PIE

Ingredients

- 1 (8-oz.) package diced cooked ham (NOT DELI)
- 1/2 cup sliced green onions (about 4 onions)
- 1 (9-inch) frozen unbaked pie shell (NOT DEEP DISH)
- 1 tablespoon Dijon mustard
- 1 cup (4 oz.) shredded mozzarella cheese, divided
- 2 medium plum tomatoes, thinly sliced
- 1 large egg
- 1/3 cup half-and-half
- 1 tablespoon chopped fresh basil
- 1/8 teaspoon pepper
- Garnishes: fresh basil sprigs, tomato slices

Directions

- Sauté ham and green onions in a large nonstick skillet over medium heat 5 minutes or until ham is brown and any liquid evaporates.
- Brush bottom of pie shell evenly with mustard; sprinkle with 1/2 cup mozzarella cheese. Spoon ham mixture evenly over cheese, and top with single layer of sliced tomatoes.
- Beat egg and half-and-half with a fork until blended; pour over tomatoes. Sprinkle evenly with basil, pepper, and remaining 1/2 cup cheese.
- Bake on lowest oven rack at 425° for 20 to 23 minutes or until lightly browned and set. Cool on

a wire rack 20 minutes. Cut into wedges to serve; garnish, if desired.

OPEN-FACED TOMATO SANDWICHESWITH CREAMY CUCUMBER SPREAD

Ingredients

1 (8-oz.) pkg. cream cheese, softened

2 cucumbers, seeds removed, diced (about 2 cups)

1/4 cup finely chopped red onion

2 1/2 teaspoons chopped fresh dill

2 1/2 teaspoons chopped fresh mint

2 teaspoons fresh lemon juice

1 teaspoon white wine vinegar

1 teaspoon kosher salt, plus more for serving

1/2 teaspoon black pepper, plus more for serving

6 Texas Toast slices or other thick white bread slices, toasted

1 1/2 to 1 3/4 lb. assorted fresh tomatoes (about 3 large), cut into 1/2-inch-thick slices

2 tablespoons extra-virgin olive oil

Thinly sliced chives

Directions

Stir together cream cheese, cucumbers, red onion, dill, mint, lemon juice, vinegar, salt, and pepper in a medium bowl until well combined.

Spread about 1/4 cup of the cucumber mixture onto each slice of the toasted bread. Top each with 2 to 3 tomato slices, and drizzle each with 1 teaspoon olive oil. Sprinkle tomatoes with chives, salt, and pepper. Serve immediately.

CHEESY STUFFED TOMATOES Ingredients

4 large tomatoes

1 tbsp. extra-virgin olive oil

1 shallot, minced (1/4 cup)

1 Garlic clove, minced

1/2 lb. sweet Italian sausage, casings removed

1/4 c. freshly chopped basil, plus more for garnish

3/4 c. panko bread crumbs

3 oz. fontina cheese, cut into 1/4" cubes

1/4 c. freshly grated Parmesan

kosher salt

Freshly ground black pepper

Directions

Preheat oven to 425°.

Core tomatoes with a paring knife and cut a larger 2"-wide circle on top of each. Using a small spoon, scoop out insides, then place tomatoes upsidedown on a paper towel-lined baking sheet and let drain while you prep the filling.

In a large skillet, heat olive oil over medium-high heat. Add shallot and garlic and sauté until fragrant, 1 to 2 minutes. Add sausage, breaking it up with a wooden spoon, and cook until browned and cooked through, 8 minutes.

Using a slotted spoon, remove sausage mixture to a large paper towel-lined bowl to soak up grease, then discard paper towel and stir in basil, panko, fontina, and Parmesan.

Place tomatoes in a small baking dish and season insides with salt and pepper. Stuff tomatoes with sausage mixture (filling will shrink as you cook, so be sure to mound tops until they look like they're overflowing), and bake until cheese is melting and tops are golden,15 to 20 minutes. Let cool 5 to 10 minutes and serve with a simple green salad.

1/2 cup dry bread crumbs

2/3 cup shredded Cheddar cheese

1/4 pound smoked sausage, cut into 1 inch pieces **Directions**

Preheat oven to 400 degrees F (200 degrees C). Cut the tops off of the tomatoes and use a knife to cut around the inside, separating the flesh from the skin. Scoop out the flesh. Place the tomatoes in a small baking dish. In a small bowl combine the canned tomatoes with the bread crumbs, 1/3 cup of cheese and the sausage; mix well. Spoon the mixture into the tomato skins and top with the remaining 1/3 cup of cheese. Bake in preheated oven for 15 minutes

Ingredients

2 cups halved multicolored cherry tomatoes

1/8 teaspoon kosher salt

1 cup sliced fresh peaches

1 1/2 tablespoons olive oil

1 tablespoon fresh mint leaves

2 teaspoons apple cider vinegar

1/8 teaspoon kosher salt

1/4 teaspoon black pepper

1 ounce crumbled goat cheese

Directions

Combine tomatoes and 1/8 tsp. salt in a bowl. Let stand 5 minutes. Add peaches, olive oil, mint leaves, vinegar, and 1/8 tsp. kosher salt; toss. Top with pepper and crumbled goat cheese.
