RA vintage weekend rolls into EL

A mid-summer favorite, The WeatherTech[®] International Challenge with Brian Redman presented by HAWK is one of the largest vintage racing events in the United States and features over 400 cars competing in several groups.

The four-day weekend, July 19-22 will also showcase a historic CAN-AM race, which is the highlight of this year's event as an impressive field of cars is expected to gather in celebration of CAN-AM's 52nd Anniversary.

In addition, a historic Trans Am feature and Formula 5000 anniversary event are planned. The Concours d'Elegance in downtown Elkhart Lake on Friday for race cars and Saturday night for street cars is a can't miss event for any enthusiast.

Concours parade

A can't miss spectacle for enthusiasts of all ages is the Concours d'Elegance racecar parade on Friday night, which runs from the track through downtown Elkhart Lake to where the cars park along Lake Street from 6-8 p.m.

Throngs of people fill the town and line the street. Led by a pace car and directed by the police from the track the quiet town is taken over by millions of dollars worth of vintage racing cars. The sound, while not as visceral as being at the track itself is unique in that you are seeing the pinnacle of vintage motoring rumble through public roads.

Crowds lean in and listen, fans whistle and throw their arms in the air.

Standing ten feet from a 1,000 hp big block Can Am car, or the beyond mad 80's Formula 1 turbo cars as they idle, shoot fire, and rev by you is a sensation that goes beyond hearing.

Feeling some of the cars that once pushed the limits hard enough to ban driving down what could be Main Street in anywhere USA is inexplicably cool. As the cars park the crowd filters through the street to stand inches away from legends like the Porsche 917, 908, 906, Ferrari 312 and 312pb, Lola T165, 911 RSR's, Shelby GT 350's, and on and on and on.

Sports car Concours

Saturday night is the Sports Car Concours d'Elegance from 6-8 p.m. Brimming with rarity, the street fills again. Most cars are rare metal, fast metal, and only once in a lifetime you'll see it metal. The access again is unprecedented. Seeing owners giving little kids seat time in the race and sports cars is part of the fun. In short, events like this, having the young ones exposed to the cars, and the sensa-

Koehler returns to lead EL chamber

Elkhart Lake native takes on executive director duties

Few people can boast of stronger ties to Elkhart Lake than new Elkhart Lake Chamber of Commerce Executive Director Melissa "Missy" Koehler.

For Koehler, the position may be new, but the drill of promoting a love for Elkhart Lake represents a lifelong passion. Consider the evidence.

A native of Elkhart Lake, and a graduate of Elkhart Lake-Glenbeulah High School she recalls hanging out in the back room of her grandparent's tavern during Friday night fish frys. The old Moioffer's Bar was just down the street from today's chamber office.

Or, you might consider that her dad was a 46-year employee of Sargento in Elkhart Lake.

Her mom, Jeanette Moioffer was the village clerk for 30 years before her retirement.

Her business associates call her Melissa, but all her Elkhart Lake friends and associates know her as "Missy."

After years of living and working in Milwaukee, Indiana and Illinois, Koehler has come home, reconnecting with the community she loves, and is excited about the prospects of promoting the Elkhart Lake Chamber and its members.

Working from afar

Koehler actually began her duties from afar, taking on the early days of her job from southern Illinois.

"The chamber was gracious enough to permit me to start this job working remotely from my home in Carterville, Illinois.

That's where her family was living, to accommodate her husband's career. Mike is a law professor at Southern Illinois University School of Law and also runs his own consulting business. He also holds some significant connections to Elkhart Lake, where he starred as a high school basketball player and still remains the third-leading scorer in the history of the state. The Koehler's family roots brought them back to their home town every summer for the last nine years.

"We bought a home in the village so we could be here in the summer, and then when we would have to leave in August, we would look at each other and ask why," Koehler said.

up with a keen sense of community. She came by it naturally from her parents. "They both instilled in me the value of community and working in the community," Koehler said.

Now, the journey has come full circle for Koehler, her husband and her twin 10-year-old sons.

Koehler interrupted her career to devote her full time energy to parenting, after serving as the director of Lakeland University's Milwaukee Campus. Administration seemed to suit her well, despite her collegiate training as a journalist.

Even from a distance, Elkhart Lake was always at the top of the list for a "dream job" for Koehler. "My husband used to ask me what I would want to do, what my dream job would be. To me that would always be something that would incorporate Elkhart Lake."

It seemed like destiny was calling in late winter, when Koehler took a phone call from her friend, Kathleen Eickhoff at Elkhart Lake Tourism. The call pointed her to the opening for a new executive director for the Elkhart Lake Chamber of Commerce-a pretty good match for that dream job.

"To be able to come to work each day and promote Elkhart Lake as a great place to have a business, to live and to work.....what a great thing that would be! How could I pass that up?" Koehler commented.

Add to the excitement of the new role. she confessed that the short commute and working for a town she loved in a building she had biked past and pushed a stroller past thousands of times had to be the right fit.

Vision for her role

Koehler intend to focus connecting with members and making their membership in the chamber more meaningful and valuable.

She plans to get her own "boots on the ground" to see what business members are doing, and the challenges they are facing in their businesses-all with the intent to build better relationships.

"The relationship building is the main goal of our chamber board," she said.

In the past couple of years, the staff at the Elkhart Lake chamber has completely turned over, causing the need for that communication.

"When you have the right people and the right staff in an office, that is half the battle. We may have brand new office staff, but we have a great team in place," she said. "We all have a great synergy together, and that's hard to find."

Koehler's teammates in the chamber office include Abbey Hau, administrative assistant and Megan Martin-Rohr, bookkeeper.

Carol received her Ph.D. from London University's School of Economics & Political Science in 1957. She taught International Relations at the University of Wisconsin both in Madison and Milwaukee. She was appointed by President Ronald Reagan to a position in the US State Department as a Deputy Assistant Secretary of State. She also served briefly under the Carter Administration.

Carol has written extensively on NATO and US-European relations and hosted a television series (International Focus) for many years on Milwaukee TV. She is now a retired Professor Emerita.

EL-G seniors graduate with scholastic honors

Recently, the Elkhart Lake-Glenbeulah High School has abandoned the traditional Valedictorian/Salutatorian designations for graduating seniors in favor of the Laude System.

Typically, the Laude System recognizes three levels of honor graduation: Cum Laude (with praise), Magna Cum Laude (with great honor) and Summa Cum Laude (with highest honor).

The laude score is based on a formula in which students are rewarded for taking classes with higher rigor. The program is based on a two tier system: tier 1 worth 1 point per semester awarded to transcripted and AP courses, and tier 2 worth .5 points per semester awarded to advanced standing and teacher selected courses.

Cum Laude - 7 to 10.5 points; Magna Cum Laude - 11 to 14.5; and Summa Cum Laude - Greater than 15 points.

A minimum GPA of 3.25/4.00 is needed

in order for a student to be recognized in the laude system.

ELGHS recognized for advance placements

Elkhart Lake-Glenbeulah High School has been recognized by the Wisconsin Advanced Placement Advisory Council as a Level III Advanced Placement Pacesetter school for the 2017 school year.

This recognition was received because 10 percent of the student population took an Advanced Placement test with between 60-65 percent of the students earning a score of 3 or above (out of 5). A score of 3 allows the student the opportunity to earn college credit while still in high school.

The purpose of this recognition is to recognize access and excellence regarding Advanced Placement. Pacesetter schools have provided impressive student access to AP courses and posted excellent AP exam results. The Pacesetter Award is unique to

Wisconsin and emerged from WAPAC members who felt that many outstanding school districts in our state lacked recognition for AP excellence.

WAPAC's goal is to focus on increasing participation by recognizing Pacesetters or leaders in AP to encourage other districts to promote both access and excellence. The Wisconsin Advanced Placement Advisory Council is comprised of Wisconsin secondary and collegiate educators who are dedicated to expanding access to AP coursework and rigorous learning for all college-bound students. Elkhart Lake-Glenbeulah High School was one of 149 schools to be recognized by WAPAC.

Pabst remembers the road course

The following article is Augie Pabst's fantasy of what it would have been like to race in the 1952 Kimberly Cup race. It was written in 2009 at the height of the struggle to preserve the Historic Race Circuits was included in the Resource Management Plan adopted in 2010 under which the Historic Circuits are protected. Photos have been added.

Start/Finish Line: Gottfried Street near the feed mill about 100 yards north of the convergence with Lake and Rhine Streets where the railroad crossing, bank and Schuler's bar (now Lake Street Café) are situated. Its 1952 again and I'm strapped into a period HRG roadster amidst fifty or so drivers in the best of what Europe has to offer, each set on doing well in the fifteen lap race around Elkhart Lake for the Kimberly Cup. Few if any cars have roll bars, seat belts are ribbed three inch army surplus, leather straps span most bonnets and the array of headgear ranges from leather football helmets to British Cromwells

Up ahead on the Gottfried Street grid, a bit north of the feed mill, sits "Gentleman" Jim Kimberly in his bright red Ferrari. Briggs Cunningham in an MG and off to my right, Bill Spear is in an OSCA and all the way from California, the great Johnnie von Neumann awaits the start in one of those new little Porsches. My adrenaline level would have been high, as it was some years later when I first sat on a grid in my TR-3. Crowds line the street, pretty girls strain to see daring young drivers and men wearing suits and ties crane their necks to get a look at the colorful cars spaced out on the street before them.

Race Officials scurried from one car to another checking lap straps and soon the starter appeared before the first two cars, circling his green flag overhead as a signal for all drivers to fire 'em up. When satisfied, he strolled to one side and then, with a flourish, waived it high in the air as each driver pops the clutch and speeds off down Gottfried Street.

The first turn is immediately upon us in the form of a dogleg right onto Lake Street quickly passing the Elkhart Lake Bank on the left and Schuler's Bar across the street where most likely a fair number of drivers and crew members knocked down a few Blue Ribbon beers the night before. Next up an eighty degree hard left with Siebkens Resort at the apex and the Schwartz Resort on the right where later an MG crashed through a snow fence injuring eight. Soon, if I cared to look, was a quick glimpse of the pristine lake on my right before passing Camp Harrand on the left, Fireman's Park on the right and soon after, the County Garage where tech inspection was held.

Coming up is Wacker's Wend, a mild 120 degree right, and shortly after still another right into Hamill's Hollow where, in the shadow of Grasshopper Hill, on a high bank ten feet above the road, sit picnicking fans witnessing the high speed maneuvering through undulating esses before the blind turn leading to the high speed two mile School House Straight where I can air it out with my foot to the floor.

I straddle the center line of the narrow twenty foot wide crowned road to avoid tire scrub and with little room for error and, as best I can, maintain a safe distance from the ever present ditches and gullies. Those who raced here in bigger bore Allards, Cunninghams, Jaguars and Ferraris had to reach 120, maybe 130 miles per hour or even more, earning my admiraElkhart Lake Historic Race Circuits is an Elkhart Lake Chamber of Commerce member and is celebrating its 10th anniversary in 2018.

tion for their skill and daring.

Downshifting and scuffing off speed, I approach the 90 degree flat right hand Kimberly's Korner and wonder how many went off here?

Made it through all right, onto another long straight through beautiful Wisconsin farmland and then a pair of doglegs - first a blind right at Dickens Ditch, followed by a left and then a mile run before carefully navigating a deceptive right at the Marsh Turn where it, if not approached correctly, could result in an off road excursion into hay bales on the outside shoulder.

With that in my rear view mirror, it's flat out for over a mile, then a stretch of undulating esses, before approaching the Gottfried Street start/finish line and the feed mill signaling the start of lap two.

I was present in 1952, spectating with a good friend, enjoying the in-town action and then from a spot along a country lane. Needless to say, that experience created the spark leading to a career that took me to every part of America, to Canada and Europe, the Bahamas and even to Africa as a result of my relationships with generous car owners.

Today, as in the past, stories of wild onand off-track Elkhart Lake adventures ring out in the barrooms of Siebkens and the Schwartz. While converted into a shop, the feed mill remains and the train depot still overlooks the main business district, although passenger trains have long since stopped serving Chicago summer people. Camp Harrand, a summer haven for the arts, is long past and in its place is the magnificent Osthoff Hotel and yet in all, the Village of Elkhart Lake and nearby roads are pretty much the same as they were almost sixty years ago.

In the Village, across the street from the railroad depot and bank, sits a State Historical Marker proclaiming the importance of the original road course. Other smaller plaques around the course identify turns, straights and geographical spots, most named after those first responsible for creating these spectacular events that led to the construction of Road America and have for these many years meant so much to the Village of Elkhart Lake, Sheboygan County, its citizens and racing fans from far and wide.

End note

This article first appeared in 2010 as a perspective piece in the Elkhart Lake Historic Race Circuits Resource Management Plan, an agreement between the Sheboygan County highway department and the Wisconsin Historical Society. The 1950s HRC's roads are protected, maintained, and preserved today by the Management Plan, Wisconsin, and Federal Law.

The article describes, from a racer's perspective, what a race lap might have felt like racing on a public road course at the 1952 Elkhart Lake event and that event's impact on the local culture and economy today.

Augie Pabst began a successful racing carrier in 1956 racing throughout the United States and Europe primarily in





sports cars. He was also a regular racer of vintage cars at Road America until his retirement in 2008. A Wisconsin native he resides in the Village of Oconomowoc Lake, Wisconsin. He is a life member of the Elkhart Lake Historic Race Circuits Preservation Society.

Plan commission tackles projects

The Planning Commission continues to work on several projects. They approved the landscaping plan for Throttle Stop II, which opened in the middle of June. Work continues on a development agreement for three, twelve-unit apartment buildings on the former Braun's ranch site.

Three high-end 2 bedroom, 2 bathroom apartments will be offered for \$1800 per month. One space with approximately 1,000 square feet will be offered for retail or commercial use. Boating Regulations

1. A Coast Guard approved Personal Flotation Device (PFD) in serviceable condition is required to be in the boat and accessible for each person in the boat.

2. A speed of "SLOW NO WAKE" is in effect all year long from 7:30 pm-10 am each day. "SLOW NO WAKE" is defined as the slowest possible speed at which a boat can operate while still maintaining steerage.

3. Maintain a speed of "SLOW NO WAKE" at all times when operating a motor boat between the shoreline and the NO WAKE buoys and within 100 feet of any craft at anchor, adrift or not operating under engine power.

4. No boat towing persons skiing, tubing or the like can come within 100 feet of swimmers, divers, rafts, other boats or restricted areas.

5. NO SUNDAY operation of motor driven boats, beginning the 2nd Sunday of June and ending the 3rd Sunday of September. Note: Only electric trolling motors allowed.

6. There is a radar-enforced speed limit of 35 M.P.H. on the water.

Mock crash site

EL-GHS students learn about distracted driving danger

Nine people in the U.S. are killed each day as a result of crashes involving a distracted driver, according to the Department of Motor Vehicles. Distracted driving has become an American epidemic, especially among teenagers, but is completely preventable. On Thursday, April 26, the EL-GHS FCCLA officers, Megan Waage, Sarah Niemi, Madeline Buechel, Morgan Vollbrecht, Parker Vollbrecht, Sarah Schneider, Kyle Lutzke and Anders Waage, along with EL-GHS students Lauren Schmitt, Nick Niemi, Saylor Schoenborn and Bryce Sitko, created a mock crash situation to educate their peers on the short and long-term consequences of distracted driving and texting while driving. The mock crash involved community resources of the Elkhart Lake and Glenbeulah Fire Departments, the Elkhart Lake First Responders, the Kiel Fire Department Ambulance, Orange Cross Ambulance, Sheboygan County Sheriff's Department, Flight For Life, Sheboygan County Dispatch, Suchon Funeral Home, parents of the students, Mrs. Holly Green, and the Elkhart Lake Police Department. Rhine Auto provided and transported the vehicles used in the crash.

After the mock crash, the students spoke about their experiences of being involved in the mock crash and the emotions they felt throughout the simulation. Sarah Schneider, one of the participants, stated, "When Mrs. Roehl and Officer

Niemi first told the FCCLA officers they wanted to organize a mock crash, I think we were all pretty excited. They had firefighters, Cody Schmitt and Andy Martin, and the Orange Cross come in and we started to talk about what this would involve. But the closer it came to the actual day, the more nervous I became. Putting on all the makeup and fake blood, and then actually being the one carried away on a stretcher to the helicopter made me realize just how much I never want to experience any of it for real. Please put your phone down so none of us have to experience this in real life."

Dr. Suzanne Martens, EMS Direc-

tor for the State of Wisconsin, spoke to the students about how difficult it is for emergency personnel to fix the results of an accident, particularly head injuries. She reminded students to slow down and pay attention to the road. The experience ended with a presentation by Mrs. Lei Lund, a teacher at EL-GHS, who shared her personal story about the loss of her son, Cameron Agnew, from a distracted driving accident. Here is her winning submission.

June's mystery photo is Camp Brosius, it shows the round house and dining hall. The hotel is behind the trees. It was built about 100 years ago as a resort and became a camp in 1921 when it was purchased by the Normal College of the American Gymnastic Union. It was named for George Brosius, longtime Normal College director. In 1941 Normal College merged with Indiana University. It operated as a college camp and children's camp from 1937-1974 when it expanded to IU Alumni Association families for eight weeks each summer. College courses continue each May and August. In 2004 management was transferred to IU School of Physical Education and Tourism Management at IUPUI. Family Camp is open to everyone now- not just IU Alumni.

Our family first attended IU family camp 41 years ago. As our daughters grew up they worked as counselors at camp. Now we all attend with our grandchildren and one granddaughter is a lifeguard on the waterfront.

Camp Brosius has programs for children of all ages, teens and adults. The adults enjoy tournaments, hikes, off camp excursions and faculty lectures. Waterfront activities for all ages include sailing, paddle boats, paddle boards, kayaks, pontoon boat rides and swimming. Everyone enjoys the Water Carnival. Evenings we have campfires, a talent show, camper vs. staff ball games, and special dinners. The meals are delicious.

Through the years cabins and buildings were updated and a new office was built, but it retains the original character we love.

The following entry was submitted by Marcia Werling Alles.

This photo of Camp Brosius looks like it may have been taken around 1912, when it was known as Fleck's Resort. It had also been called Hotel Venice, Schmidt's, and served as the Turnverein's (later known as the Turners) training camp for gymnastics and physical fitness.

When the North American Gymnastic Union and the Normal College purchased the property from Mrs. Dora Knief in 1921, the camp was christened "Camp Brosius" in honor of George Brosius who served as Director of the Normal College, President of the Turnverein in Milwaukee, and was an instructor of physical education at the college. The college then merged into Indiana University and became its School of Physical Education in 1941.

The buildings in the photo are still in use with the "Round House" being the most recognizable landmark on Elkhart Lake. The original hotel, dining room with a wrap-around porch, and ice house are all located on the west shoreline, near the outlet.

In the early 1900s, a favorite activity was "Venetian Night" when boats were decorated with lanterns and floral arrangements and rowed around the outlet. Our grandparents and parents looked forward to this event every summer.

On the upper hill our great-grandfather, Adam Bromm, a Turner, built the first cottage; it was known as the "Kin Koop" and for five generations our families spent summers there. The cottage still stands today and has recently been renovated by Indiana University.

Some of our family members attended the six-week children's camp, held in the 1950s and 1960s, while others of us continued to work at Brosius as waitstaff, counselors, waterfront and maintenance crew members during our college breaks as IU students.

The camp is currently managed by the IU School of Physical Education and Tourism. Students continue to earn college credit as did their predecessors, when they were training in diving, swimming, running, and jumping to develop strength and stamina: the goal of the Turners. "Mens sana in corpore sano"-"A sound mind in a sound body" is what Camp Brosius provides to its guests. The tradition continues today!

The May mystery photo is of the Elkhart Lake Veteran's Memorial located at the corner of Chicago St. and State HWY 67. It was dedicated to the Village by the Elkhart Lake Lions Club on May 26, 2007.

The design and construction documents

were donated by GK Architectural, LLC and the excavation for the memorial was contributed by Dad's Excavating. Time and talents for laying the pavers were contributed by various Lions Club members, Lakeview Landscape & Design and Pechmann Memorials.

The engravings on the three main stones and the names on the two granite slants were donated by Pechmann Memorials of

Memory

Madison. The late Kurt Pechmann, who was the owner of Pechmann Memorials at the time, donated to many veterans memorials throughout the country. He was a WWII Veteran, but fought for the Germans. He ended up as a Prisoner of War in Wisconsin in 1943. These donations was his way of giving back to his new country for how well he was treated. The memorial celebrates the service of area veterans dating back to the Civil War through the use of dedicated pavers set in the memorial floor. Stars are engraved over the names of veterans who were killed in action.

The seals of the six branches of services are located on two stones and a subtle depiction of the US Flag is engraved into the background of the main stone.

The memorial is guarded by a proud granite Bald Eagle perched atop the US Flag. This Eagle is not only our national symbol, but is a representation of 'Old Abe' who was the mascot and flew over the battlefields of the Eighth Wisconsin Regiment during the Civil War. This unit included Company B, the Sheboygan County Independents, of which many of our area residents were members at

the time.

The memorial purposely does not face Highway 67. It's not a billboard, it's a destination. Instead visitors are invited to enter the site by means of the tree-lined paver walk leading from Chicago St. to view the names on the memorial floor. The service of these men and women is the reason the memorial was constructed.

The Elkhart Lake Lions Club and Vil-

lage holds a program and brat fry annually on the Saturday before Memorial Day, not only to avoid conflict with the Town of Rhine's celebration, but to celebrate not only those killed in services, but all veterans.

The proceeds from the brat fry and sale of pavers from this event are used for the maintenance and upkeep of the memorial and grounds.
